Executive Summary

2025 Truckee-Donner Recreation & Park District Strategic Plan Resident Survey Executive Summary

Overview

ETC Institute administered a strategic plan resident survey for the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District during the months of April and May of 2025. The survey goal was to understand recreation and park priorities for the Truckee community.

Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random selection of residents in the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District service area. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online at [TDRPD.org](https://www.tdrpd.org).

After the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute followed up with residents to encourage participation. To prevent people who were not residents of the service area from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting the survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses that were entered online with the addresses that were originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not included in the final database for this report.

The survey aimed to collect a minimum of 400 completed responses from residents, and this target was surpassed with an impressive 481 completed surveys collected. The overall results for the sample of 481 residents have a precision of at least ± 4.4 at the 95% level of confidence.

Priority Investment Ratings are intended to guide, not dictate, decisions and should be considered alongside other data sources and local context to support resident-driven planning.

The major findings of the survey are summarized in the following pages.

Truckee-Donner Program Usage

Seventy-six percent (76%) of residents indicated that they or someone in their household have participated in a recreation program offered by the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District in the past year.

- Of the residents that have participated in recreation program, ninety-five percent (95%) rated the overall quality of recreation programs as “excellent” or “good”.

Truckee-Donner Facility and Park Usage

Residents were asked to select the parks or facilities that they or someone in their household have visited in the past year and the top five most visited facilities or parks were:

- Regional Park (81%)
- Community Recreation Center (68%)
- West End Beach (64%)
- Donner Lake Public Piers (61%)
- Riverview Sports Park (55%)

Of the residents that have visited recreation facilities or parks, ninety-four percent (94%) rated the overall quality of recreation facilities or parks as “excellent” or “good”.

Communication Preferences

Residents currently get their news and information about the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District from 1.) Word of mouth, 2.) While visiting recreation facilities, and 3.) TDRPD.org website. When asked which three sources of information would be their preferred way to get news and information about the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District the top three were, 1.) Emails, 2.) TDRPD.org website, and 3.) Social media. This presents an opportunity for the District to better align communication sources with what residents prefer and improve communication with residents.

Agreement with Statements

Residents were asked to select the statements they agreed with most. The top three responses were:

1. Improves physical health and fitness
2. Parks make life better!
3. Improves mental health and reduces stress

The statements with the least agreement from residents were:

1. Creates economic benefits by attracting visitors and businesses
2. Boosts property values
3. Fosters relationships

Facility Improvements and New Development

Improvements

When given a list of actions that could improve the current facilities and parks in the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District, the items that received the highest level of support were, 1.) Increase general maintenance of facilities and parks, 2.) Improve / update West End Beach, and 3.) Improve / update existing playgrounds in parks.

The clear top two improvements that were most important to residents were 1.) Increase general maintenance of facilities & parks, and 2.) Improve/update West End Beach.

New Development

When given a list of actions for new development in the Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District, the items that received the highest level of support were, 1.) Develop new parks (in general), 2.) Develop a new whitewater park, and 3.) Develop a new all-abilities playground.

The three new developments that were most important to residents were 1.) Develop a new whitewater park, 2.) Develop a new skate park, and 3.) Develop new parks (in general).

Allocating Funds

If given \$100 to allocate between four different items, the mean amount of money residents distributed were

- Enhance or upgrade existing amenities at District's parks & recreation facilities - \$27.05
- Develop new recreation & park amenities throughout the District – \$23.95
- Increase maintenance of existing recreation facilities & parks - \$18.51
- Purchase additional land for recreation facilities - \$17.81
- Introduce new activities and/or events using facilities throughout the District - \$12.69

Property Tax Assessment

Residents were asked to rate their level of agreement with the statement: *“I would support an increase to my annual property tax assessment to support debt financing for improvements to the Truckee-Donner Recreation & Park District.”* Forty-three percent (43%) of respondents agreed with the statement, while thirty-eight percent (38%) disagreed.

When the residents that agreed or were neutral to the statement were asked what level of additional property tax assessment they would be willing to support, over fifty percent (50%) of residents said they would be willing to support additional property tax assessments of \$75 and up.

Not surprisingly, the top two reasons that residents would not support additional property tax assessments were 1.) I do not support any additional increase to taxes, and 2.) I just need more information before I can respond.

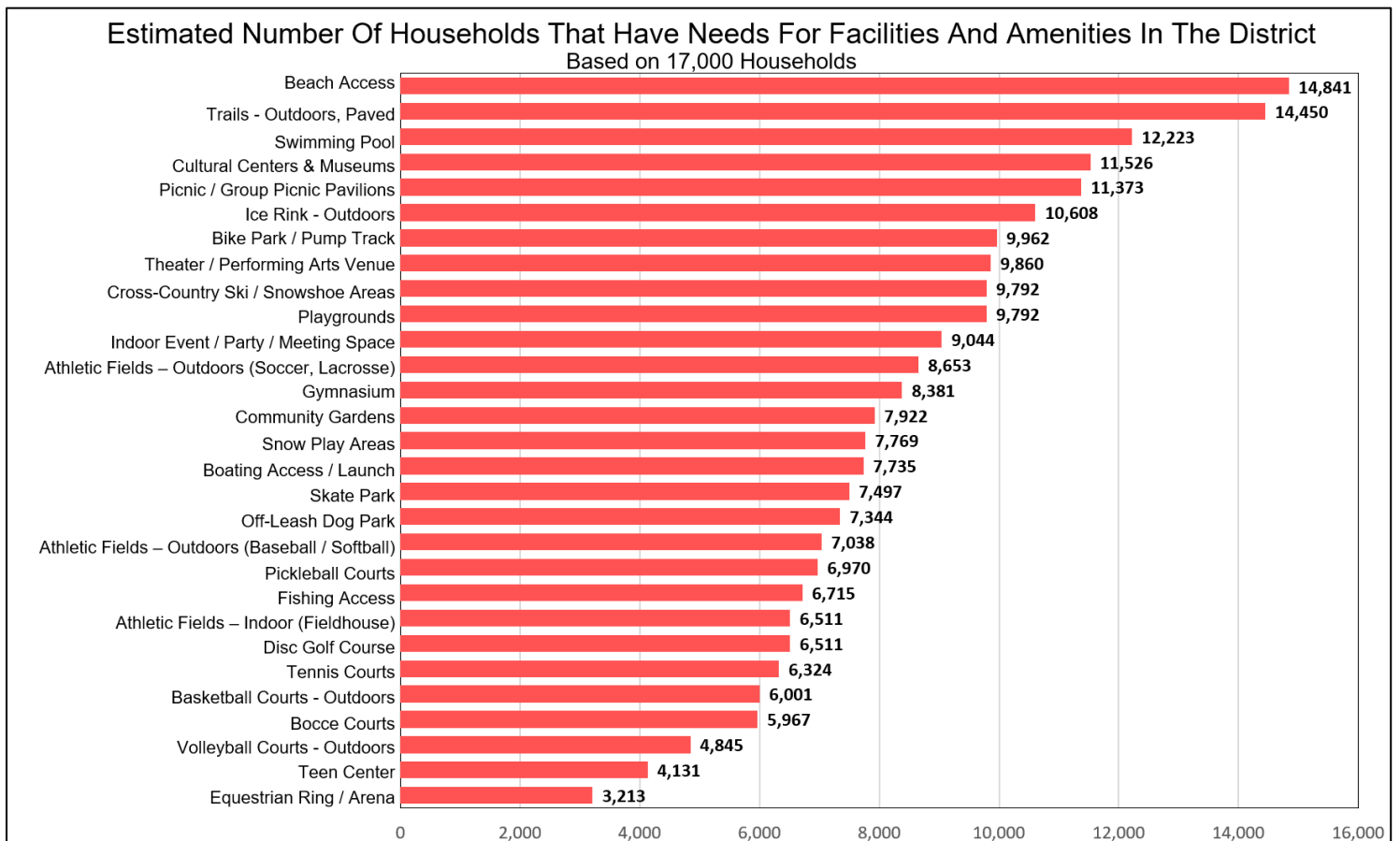
Facilities and Amenities Needs and Priorities

Facility and Amenity Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 29 facilities and amenities and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest “unmet” need for various facilities.

The three facilities with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

1. Beach Access – 14,841 households
2. Trails – Outdoors, Paved – 14,450 households
3. Swimming Pool – 12,223 households

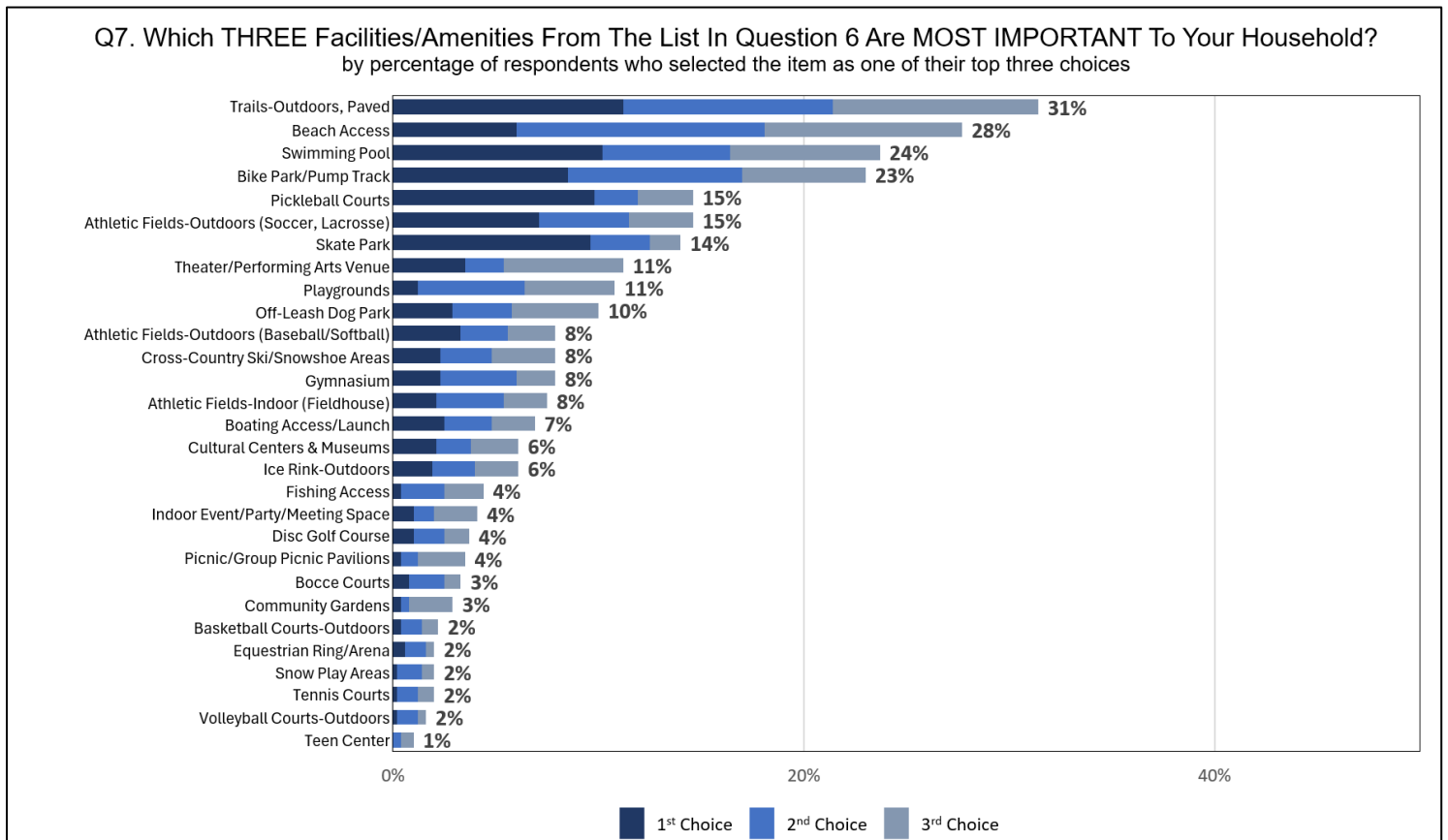
The estimated number of households that have unmet needs for each of the 29 facilities and amenities assessed is shown in the chart below.



Facility and Amenity Importance: In addition to assessing the needs for each facility and amenity, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents’ top three choices, these were the three facilities and amenities that ranked most important to residents:

1. Trails – Outdoors, Paved (31%)
2. Beach Access (28%)
3. Swimming Pool (24%)

The percentage of residents who selected each facility and amenity as one of their top three choices is shown in the chart below.

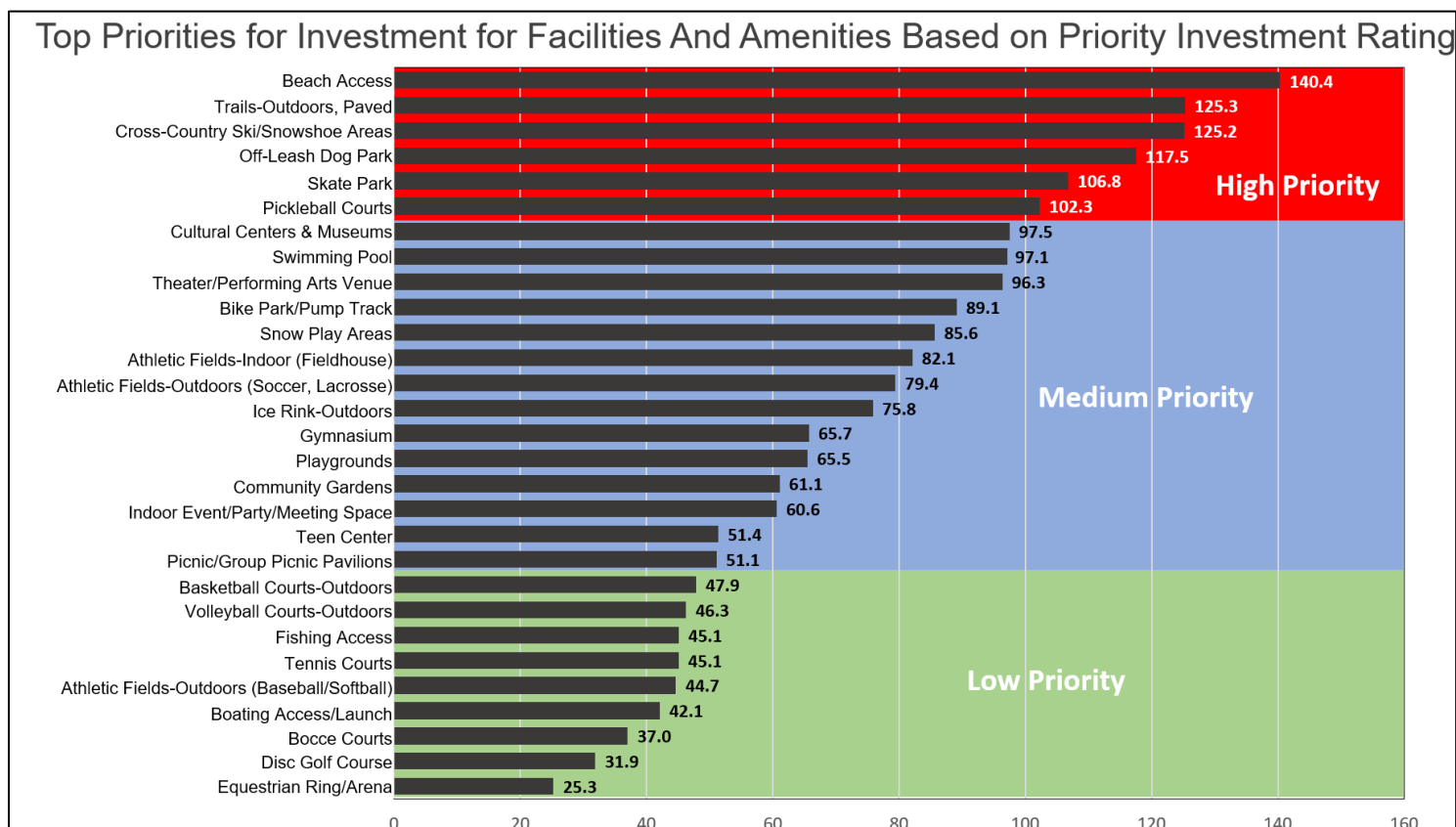


Priorities for Facility and Amenities Investments: The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on recreation and parks investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the facility. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 2 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following facilities and amenities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Beach Access (PIR= 140.4)
- Trails – Outdoors, Paved (PIR= 125.3)
- Cross-Country Ski/Snowshoe Areas (PIR= 125.2)
- Off-leash Dog Park (PIR= 117.5)
- Skate Park (PIR= 106.8)
- Pickleball Courts (PIR= 102.3)

The chart below shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 29 facilities and amenities assessed in the survey.



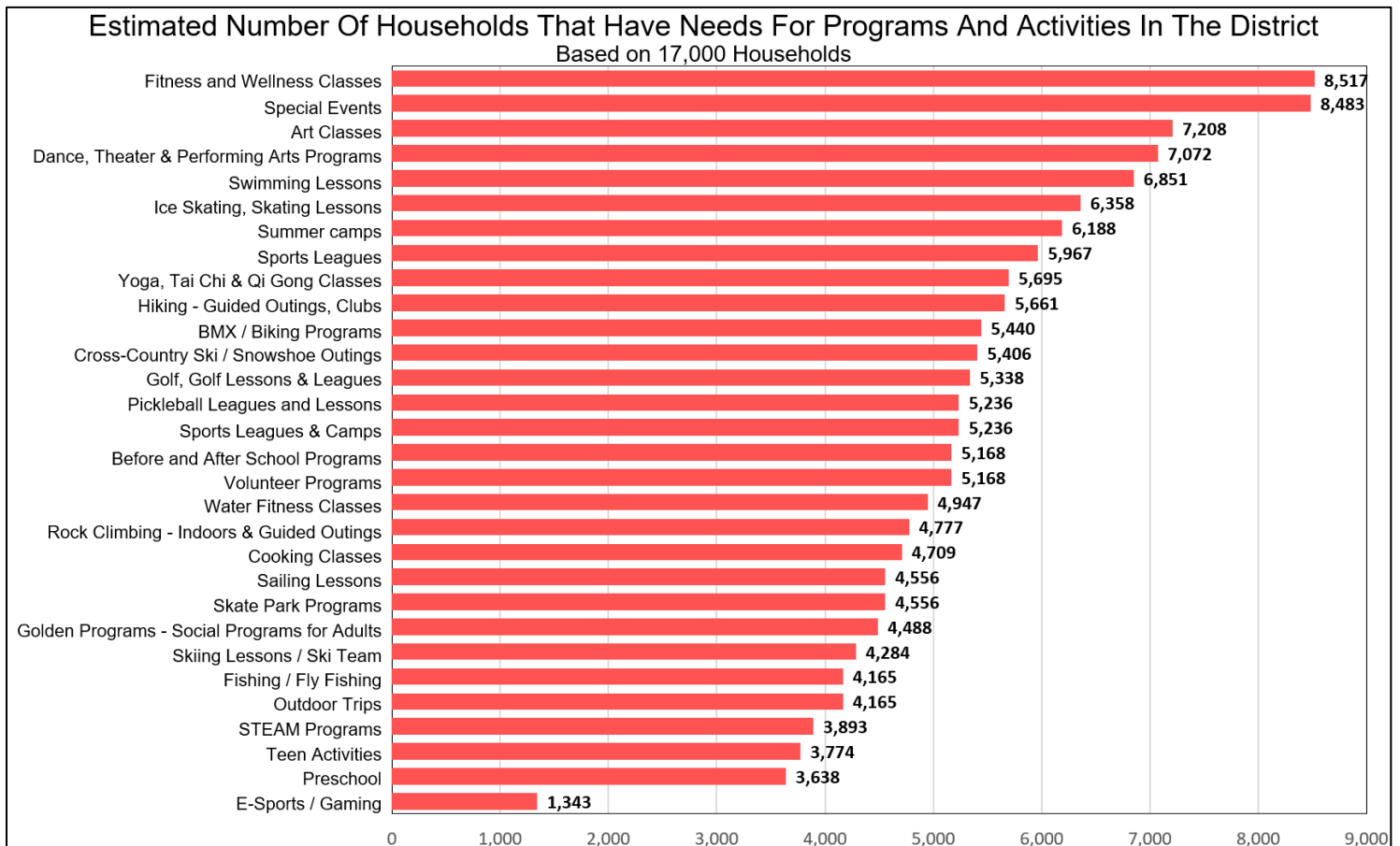
Programs and Activities Needs and Priorities

Programs and Activities Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 30 programs and activities and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest “unmet” need for various programs.

The three programs with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

1. Fitness and Wellness Classes – 8,517 households
2. Special Events – 8,483 households
3. Art Classes – 7,208 households

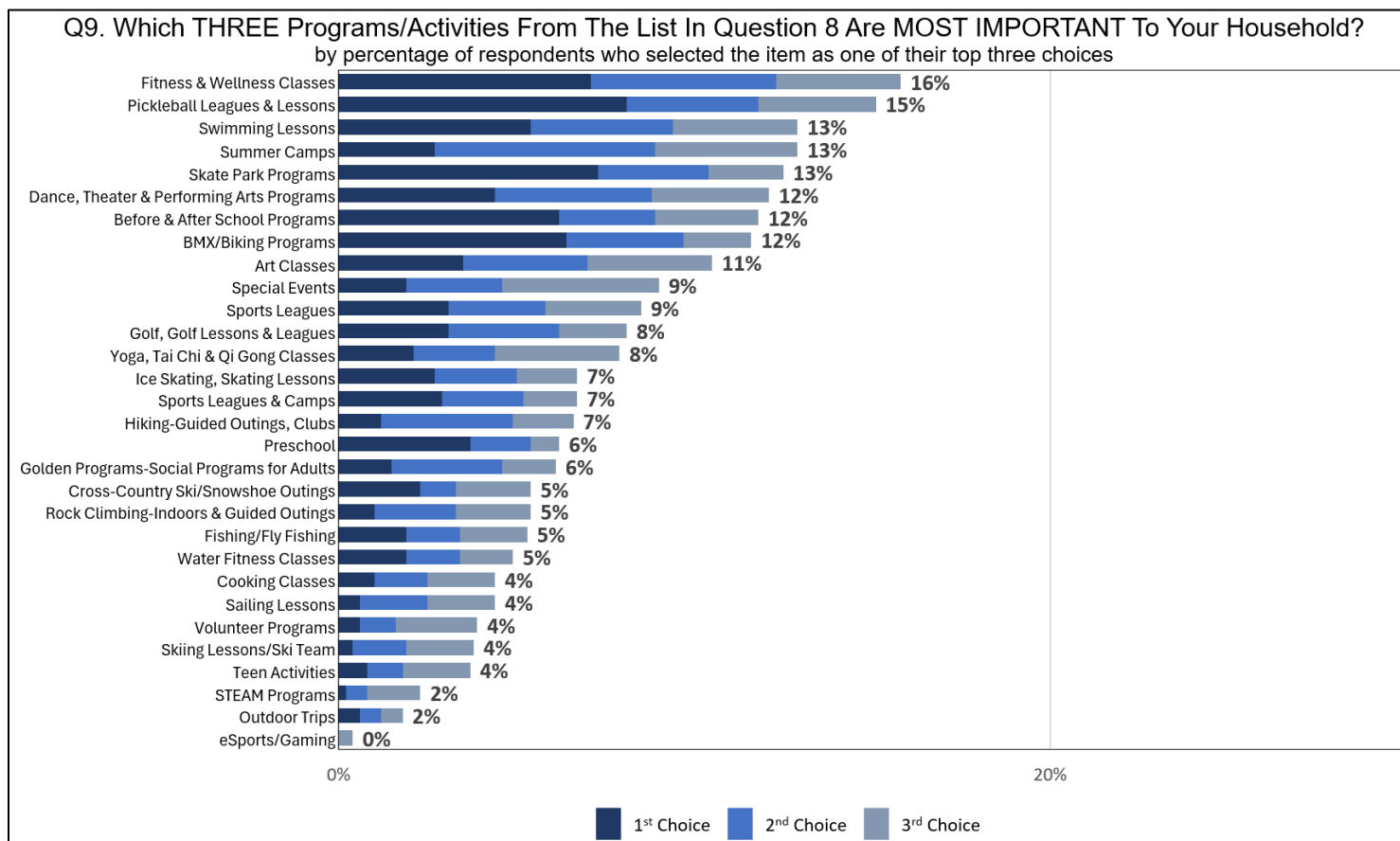
The estimated number of households that have unmet needs for each of the 30 programs and activities assessed is shown in the chart below.



Programs and Activities Importance: In addition to assessing the needs for each program and activity, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents’ top four choices, these were the three programs and activities that ranked most important to residents:

1. Fitness and Wellness Classes (16%)
2. Pickleball Leagues and Lessons (15%)
3. Swimming Lessons (13%)

The percentage of residents who selected each program and activity as one of their top three choices is shown in the chart below.

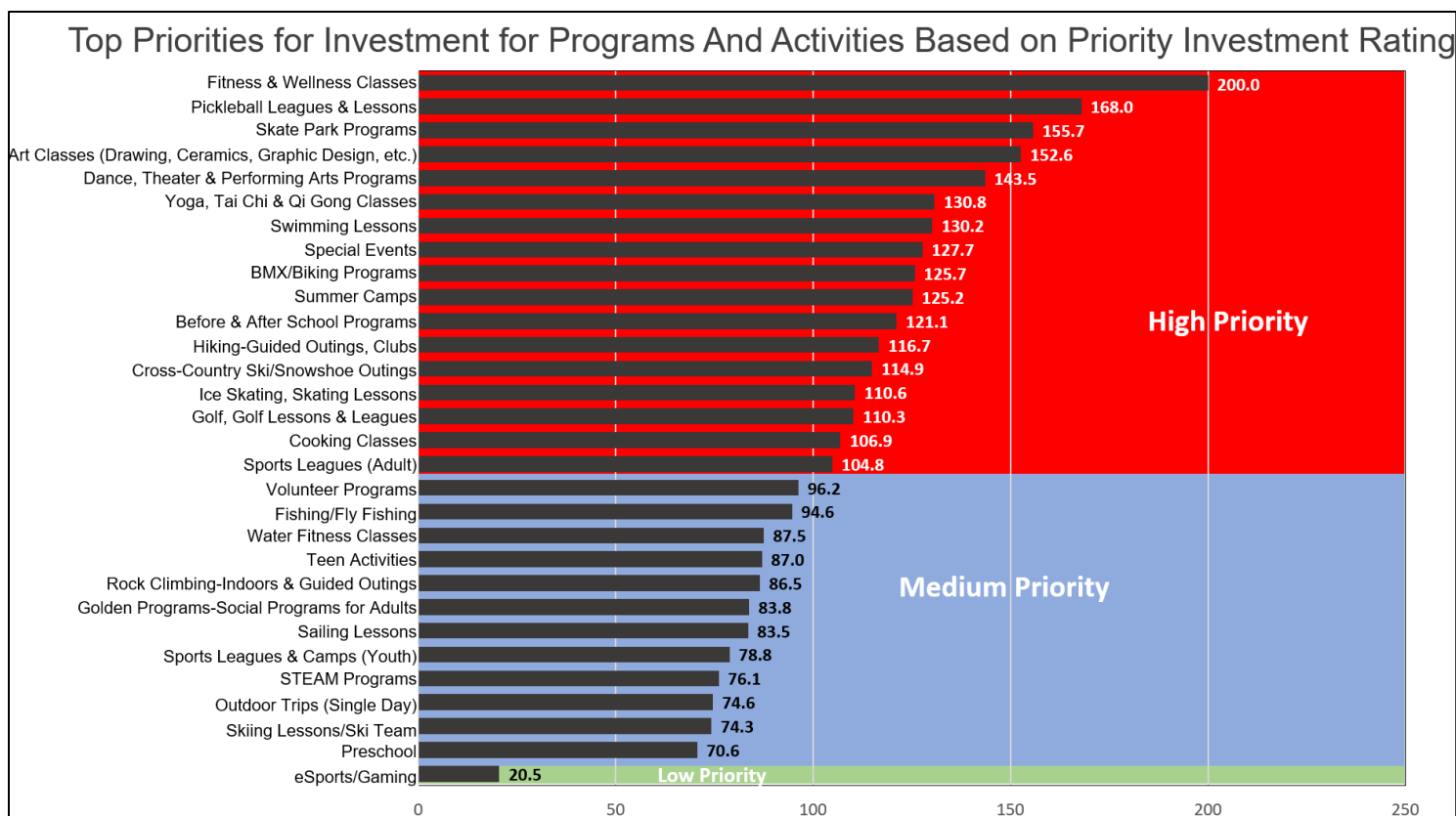


Priorities for Programs and Activities Investments: The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on recreation and parks investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the program. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 2 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following programs and activities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Fitness and Wellness Classes (PIR= 200)
- Pickleball League and Lessons (PIR= 168)
- Skate Park Programs(PIR= 155.7)
- Art Classes (PIR= 152.6)
- Dance, Theatre and Performing Arts Classes (PIR= 143.5)
- Yoga, Tai Chi and Qi Gong Classes (PIR= 130.8)
- Swimming Lessons (PIR= 130.2)
- Special Events (PIR=127.7)
- BMX/Biking Programs (PIR=125.7)
- Summer Camps (PIR= 125.2)
- Before and After School Programs (PIR= 121.1)
- Hiking-Guided Outings, Clubs (PIR=116.7)
- Cross-Country Ski/Snowshoe Outings (PIR= 114.9)
- Ice Skating, Skating Lessons (PIR= 110.6)
- Golf, Golf Lessons and Leagues (PIR=110.3)
- Cooking Classes (PIR= 106.9)
- Sports League (Adult) (PIR= 104.8)

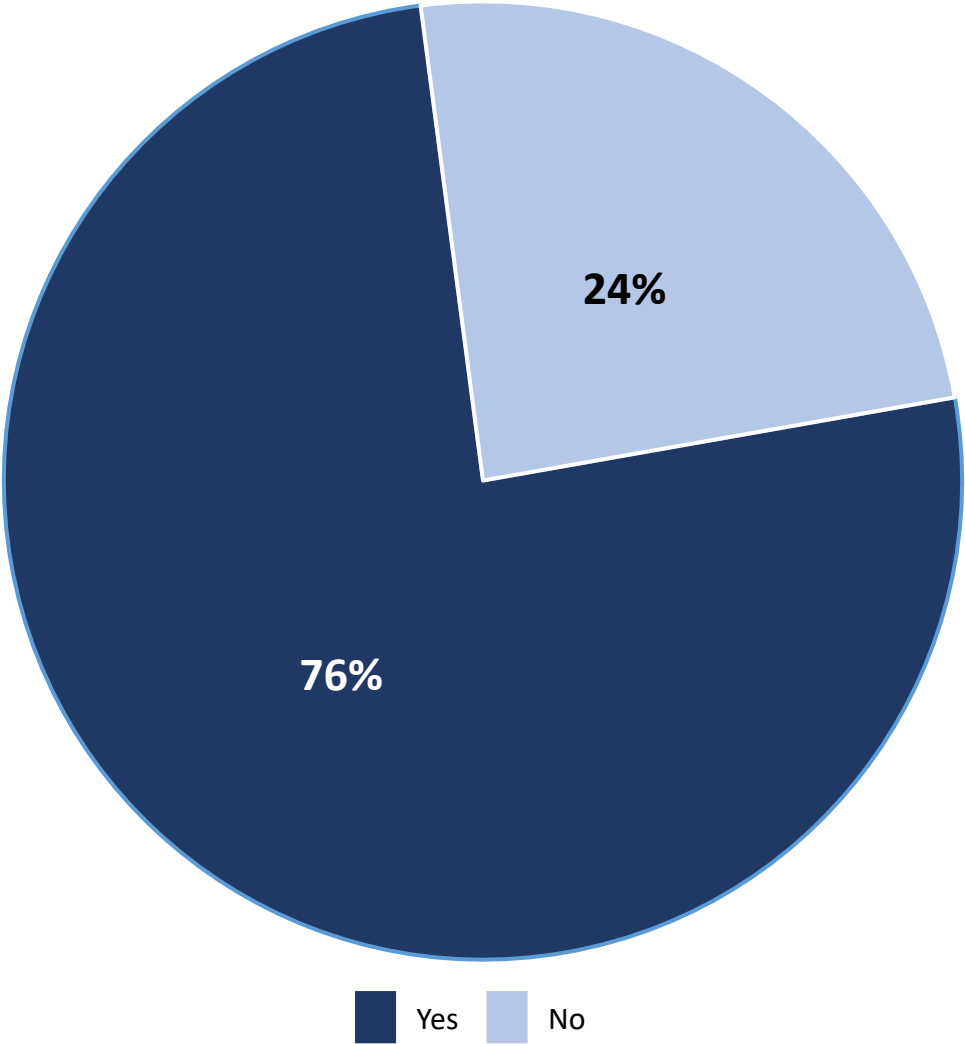


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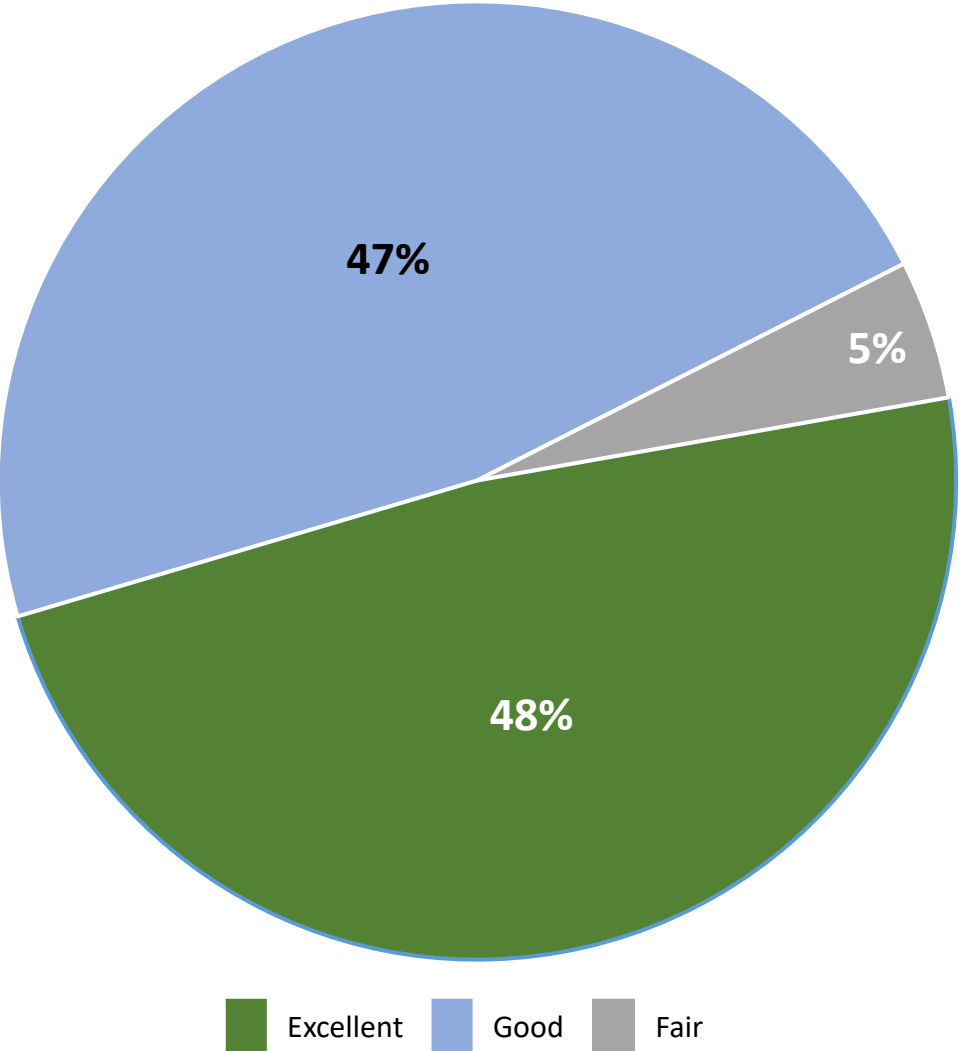

by percentage of respondents

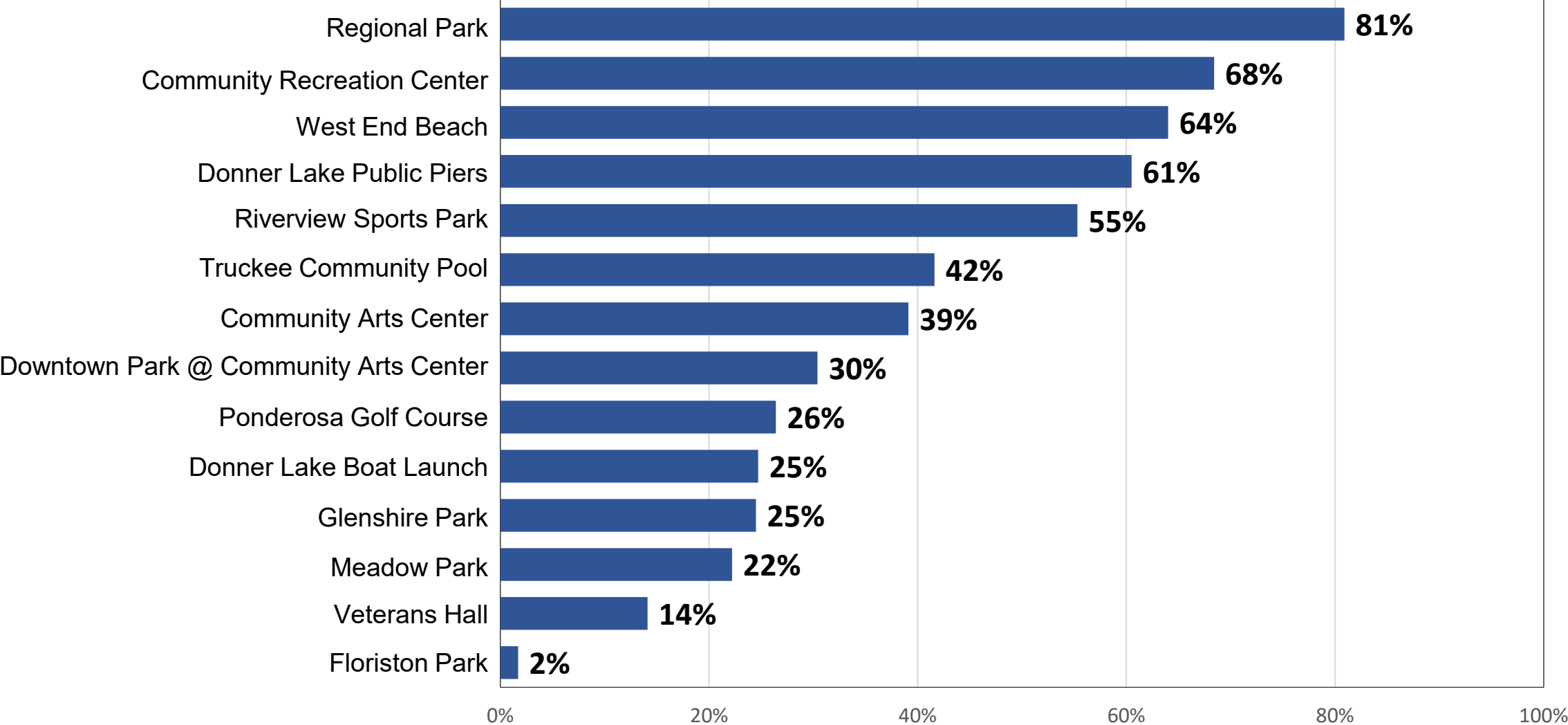

by percentage of respondents who have participated in programs



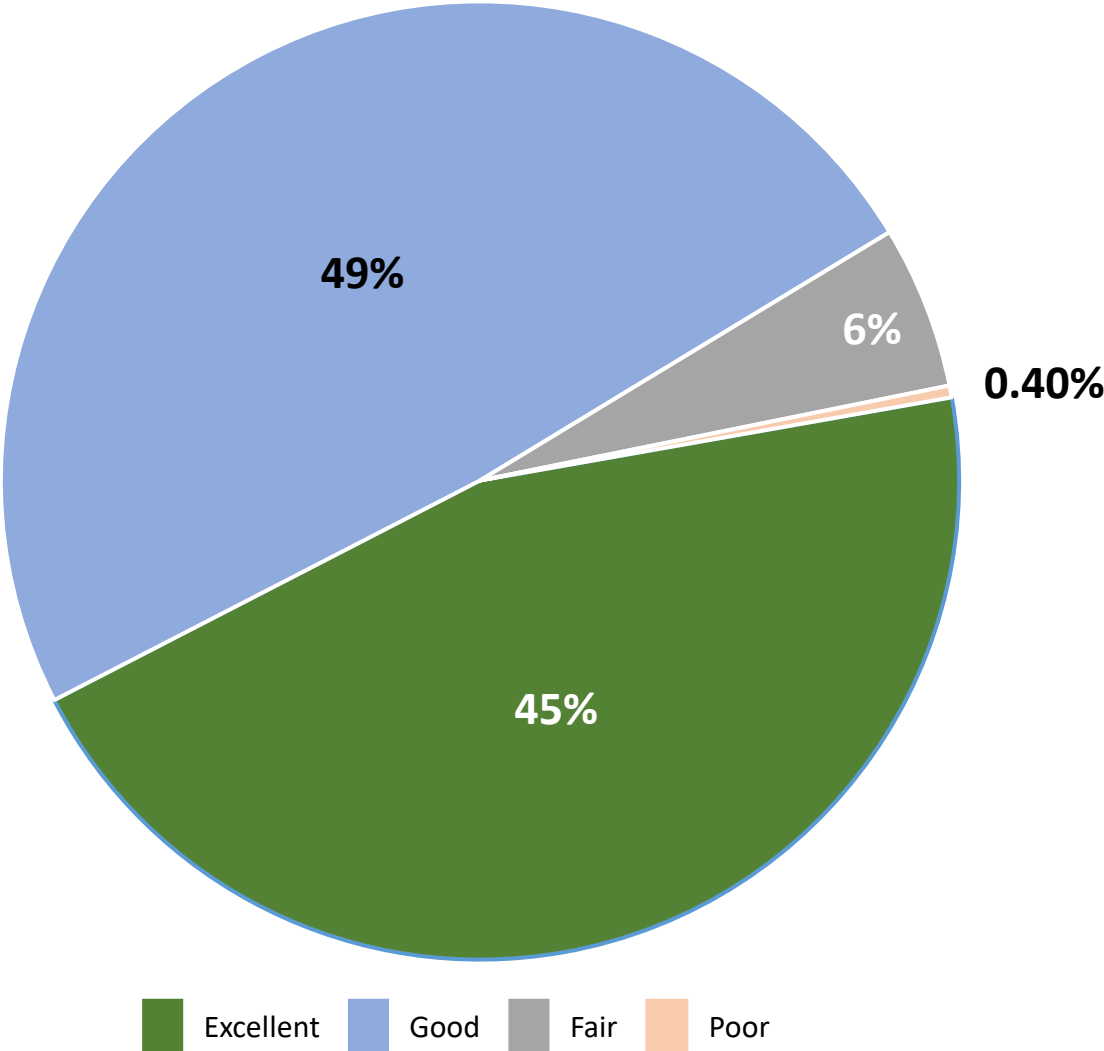

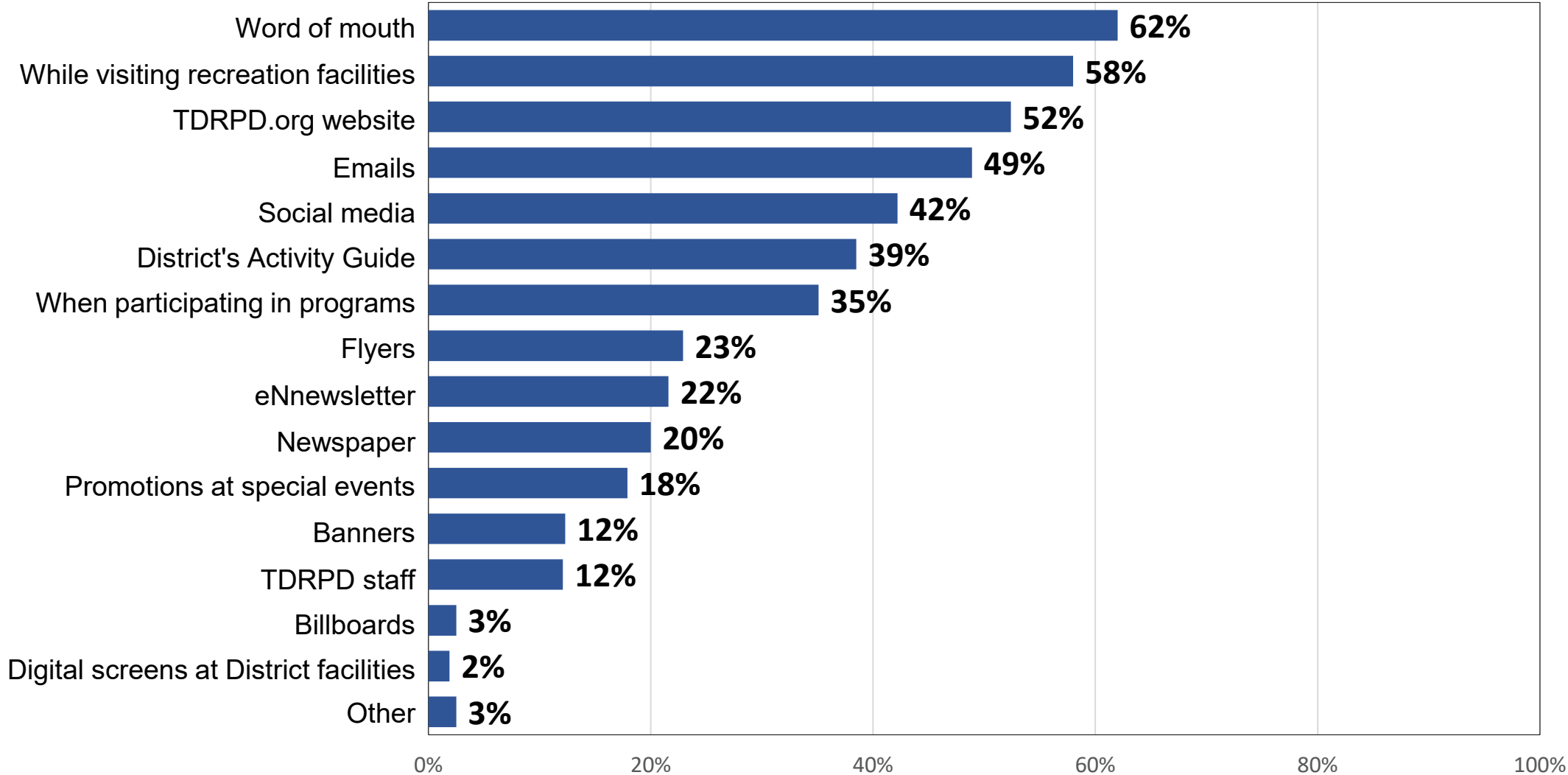

by percentage of respondents who have visited facilities or parks



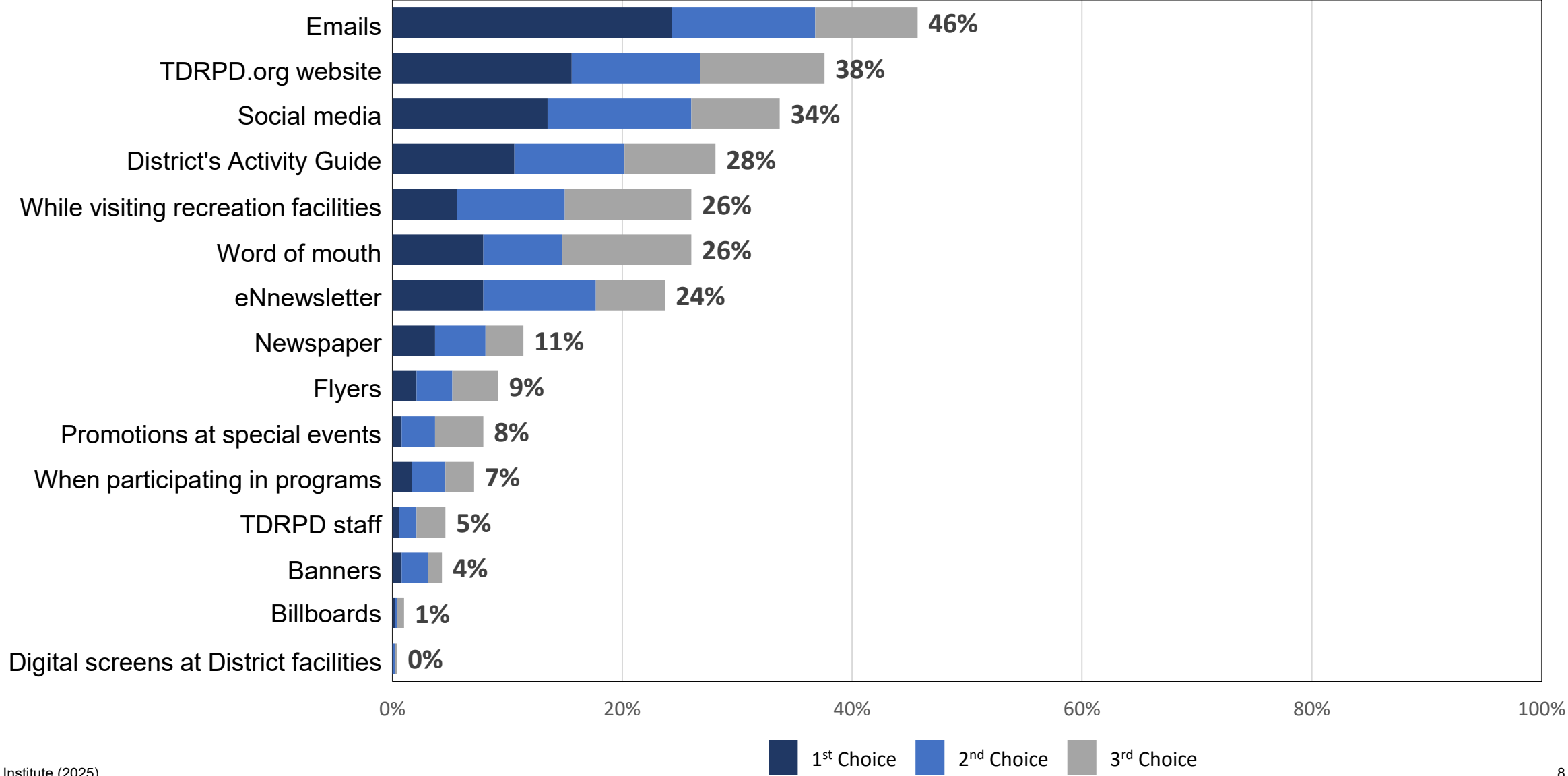
Q3. From The Following List, Please CHECK ALL The Ways You Currently Learn About District Recreation Programs And Services.

by percentage of respondents (multiple selections could be made)



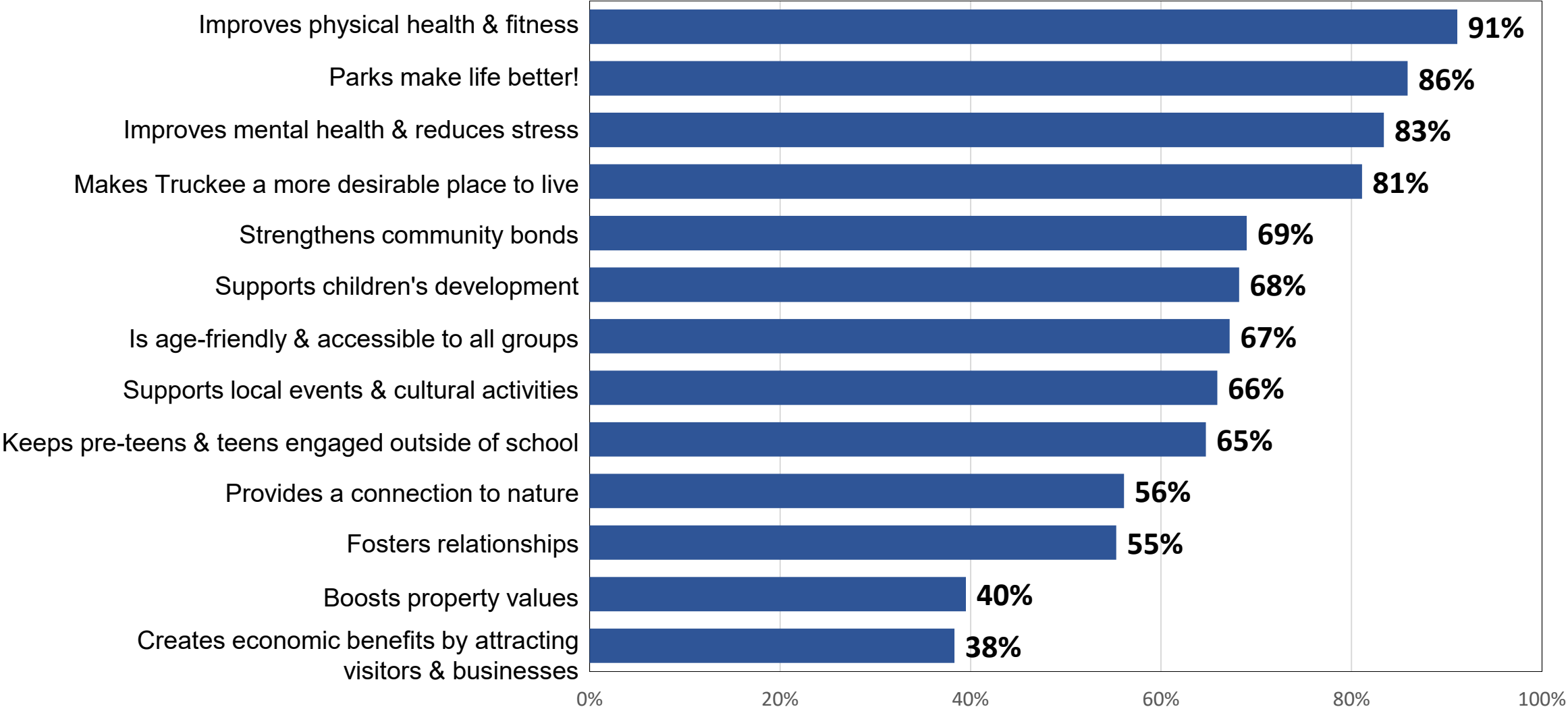
Q4. Which THREE Sources From The List In Question 3 Are YOUR MOST PREFERRED SOURCES For Learning About Recreation Programs And Activities?

by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices

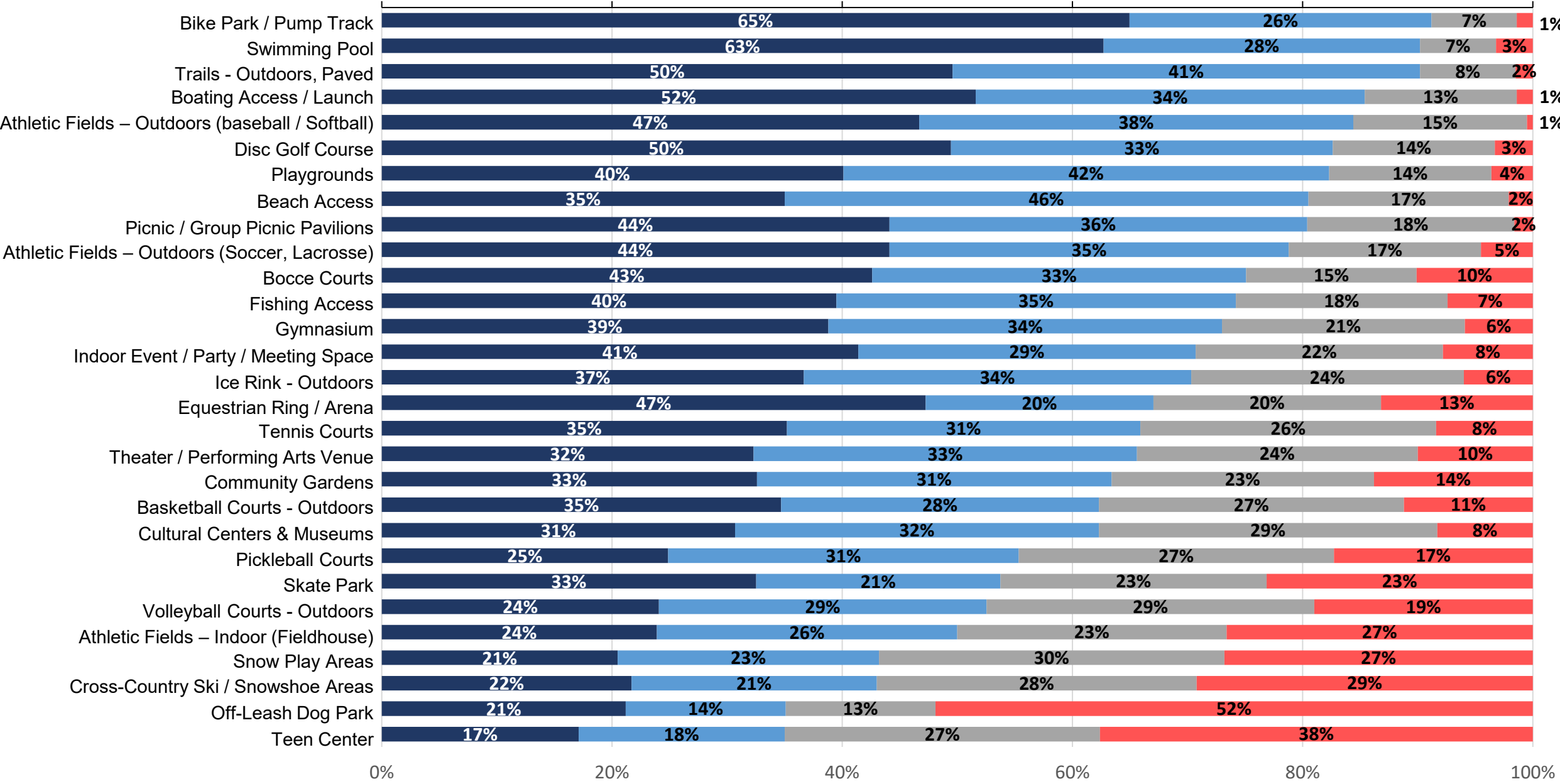


Q5. Which Of The Following Statements Concerning Some Potential Benefits Of Recreation And Park Facilities, Programs, Or Services Do You Agree With?

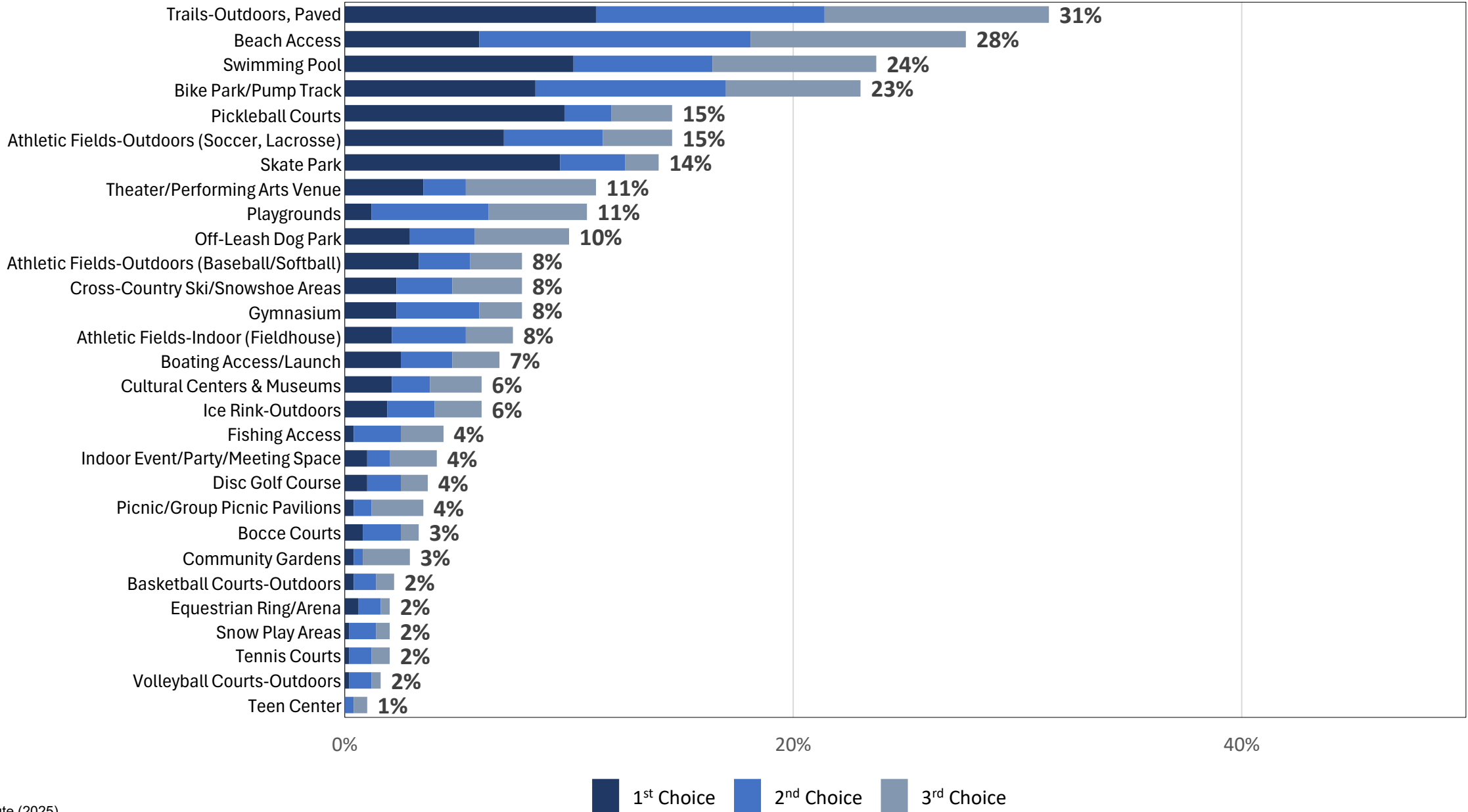

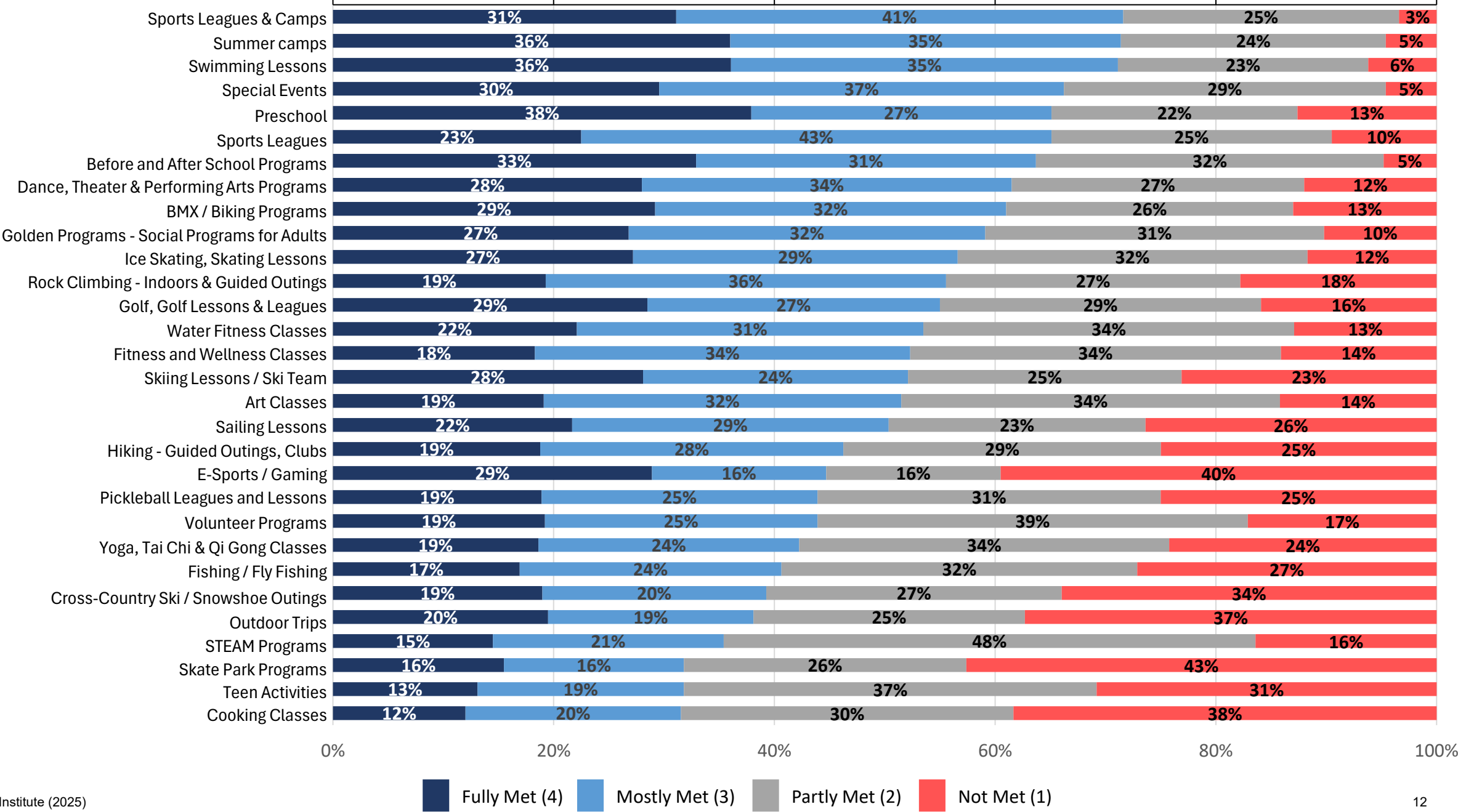
Q6. How Well Your Needs Are Being Met For Each Facility And Amenity



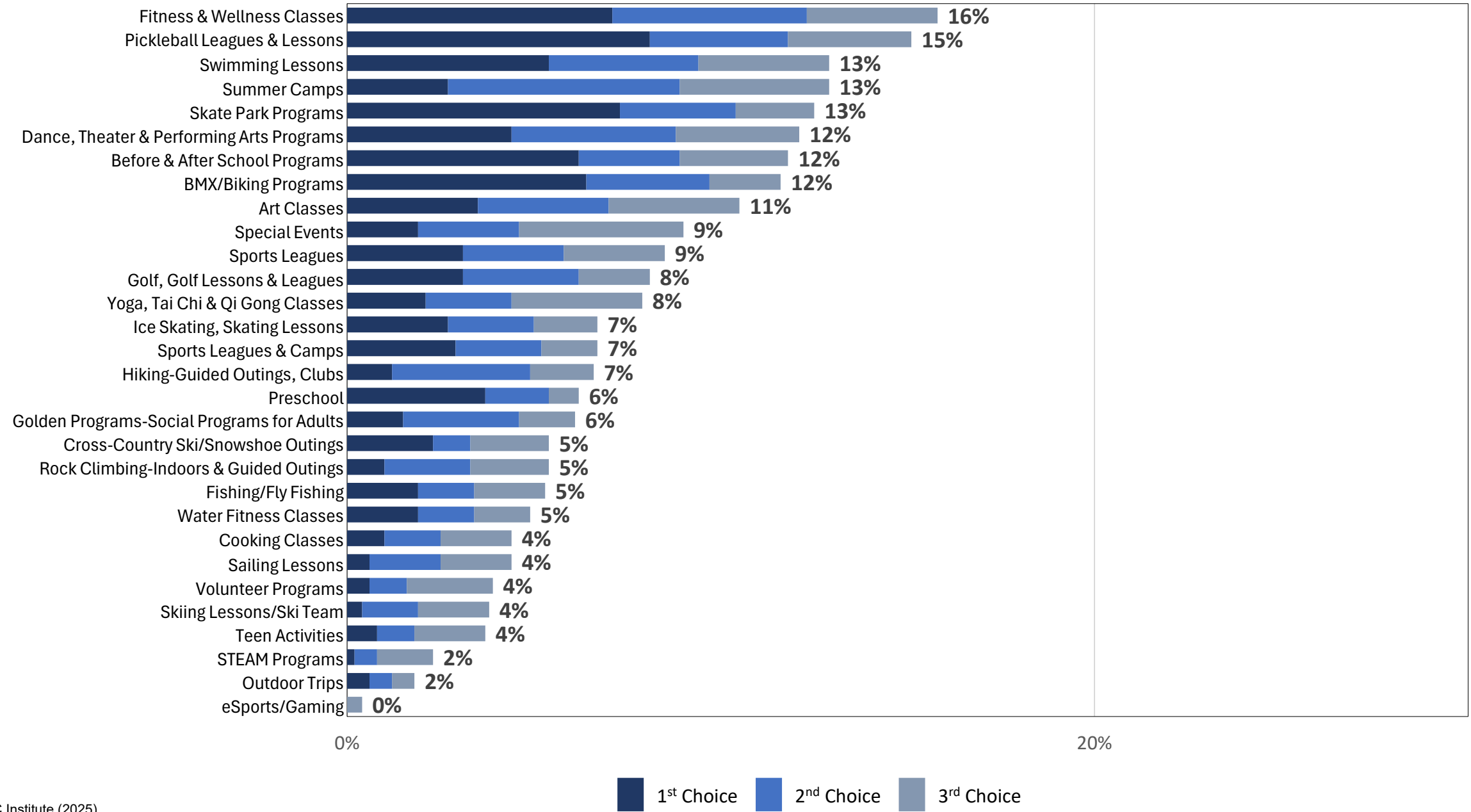
Q7. Which THREE Facilities/Amenities From The List In Question 6 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?

Q8. How Well Your Needs Are Being Met For Each Programs And Activities

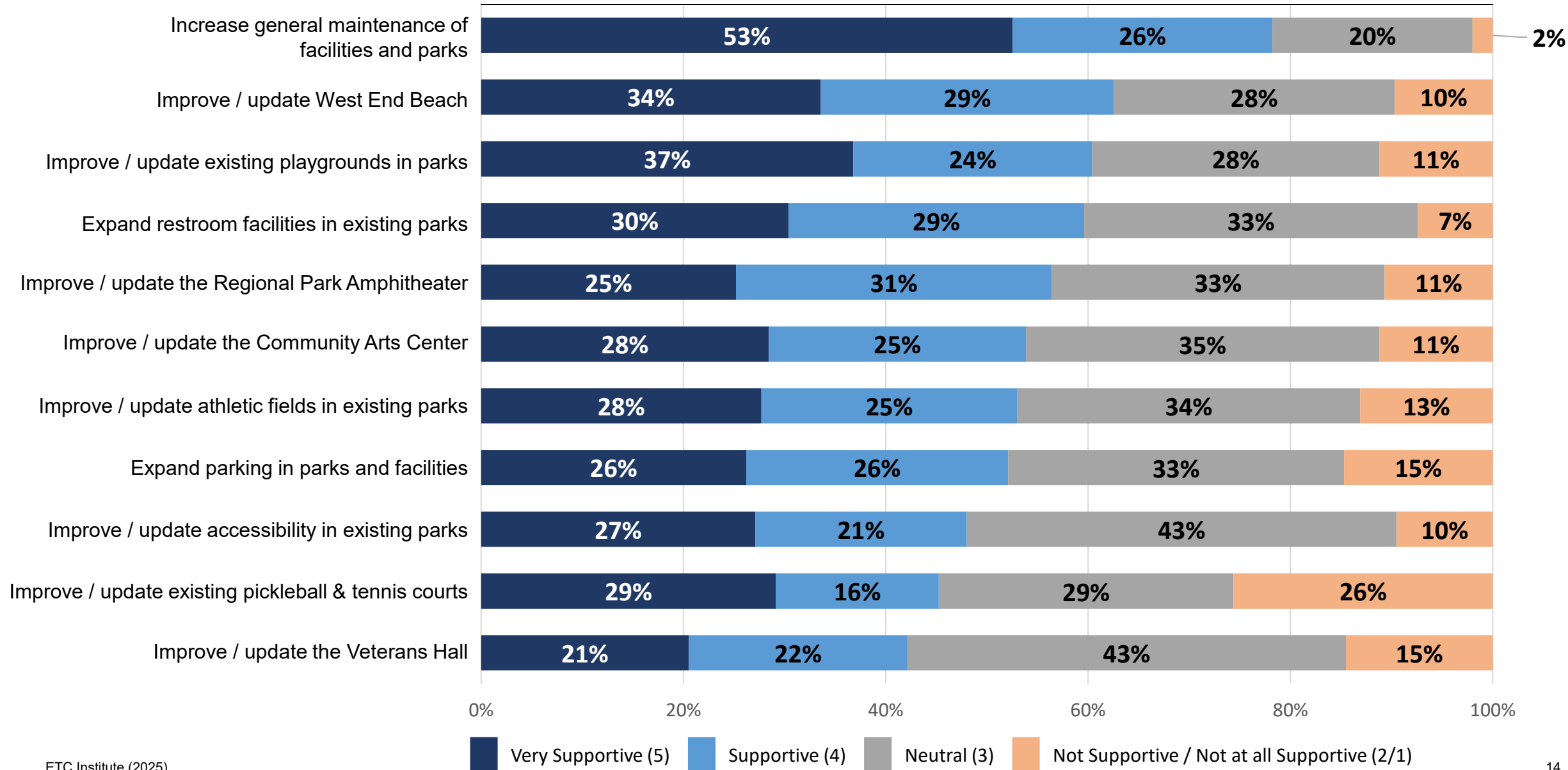


Q9. Which THREE Programs/Activities From The List In Question 8 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?
by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



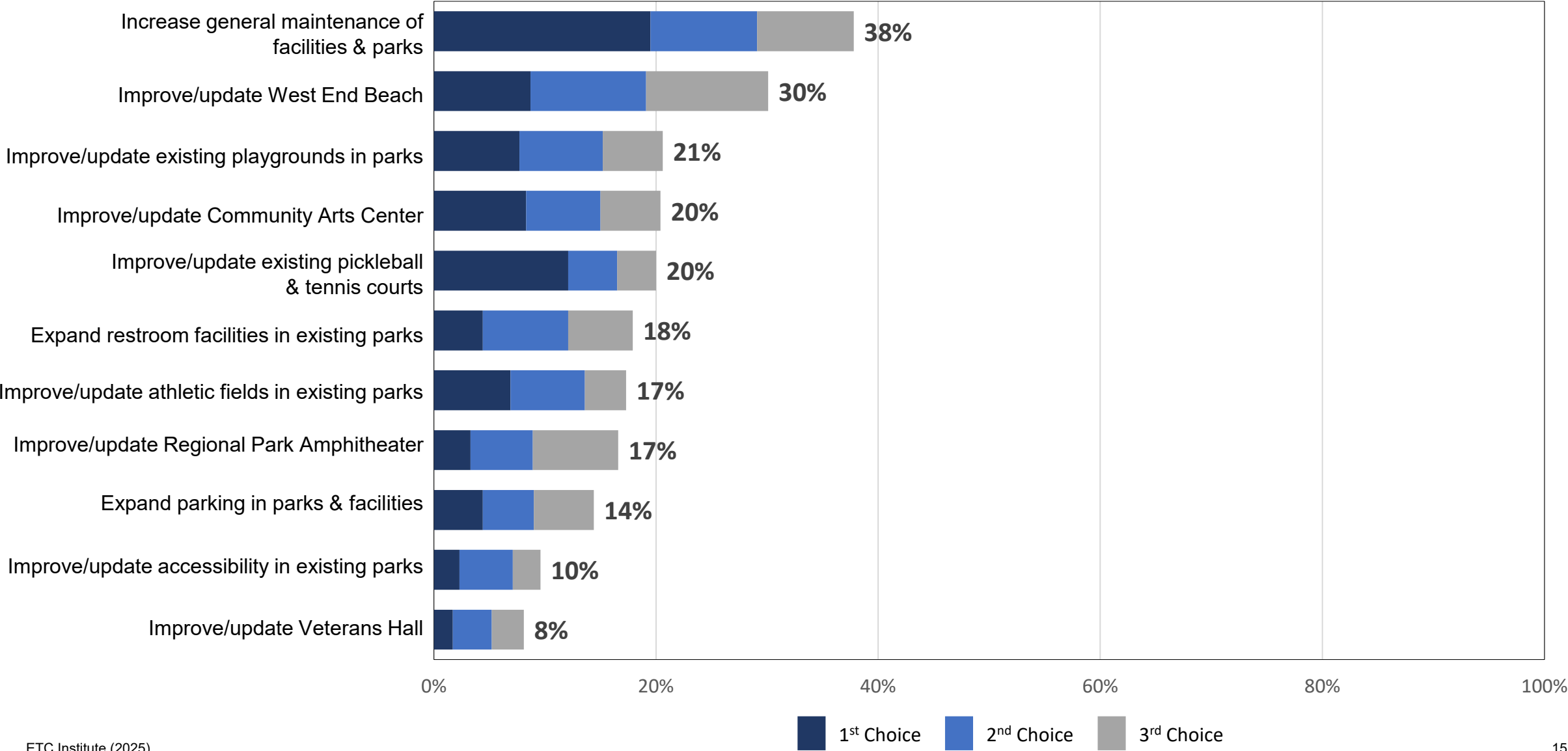
Q10. Support For Each Potential Action To Improve Facilities or Parks

by percentage of respondents (excluding don't know)



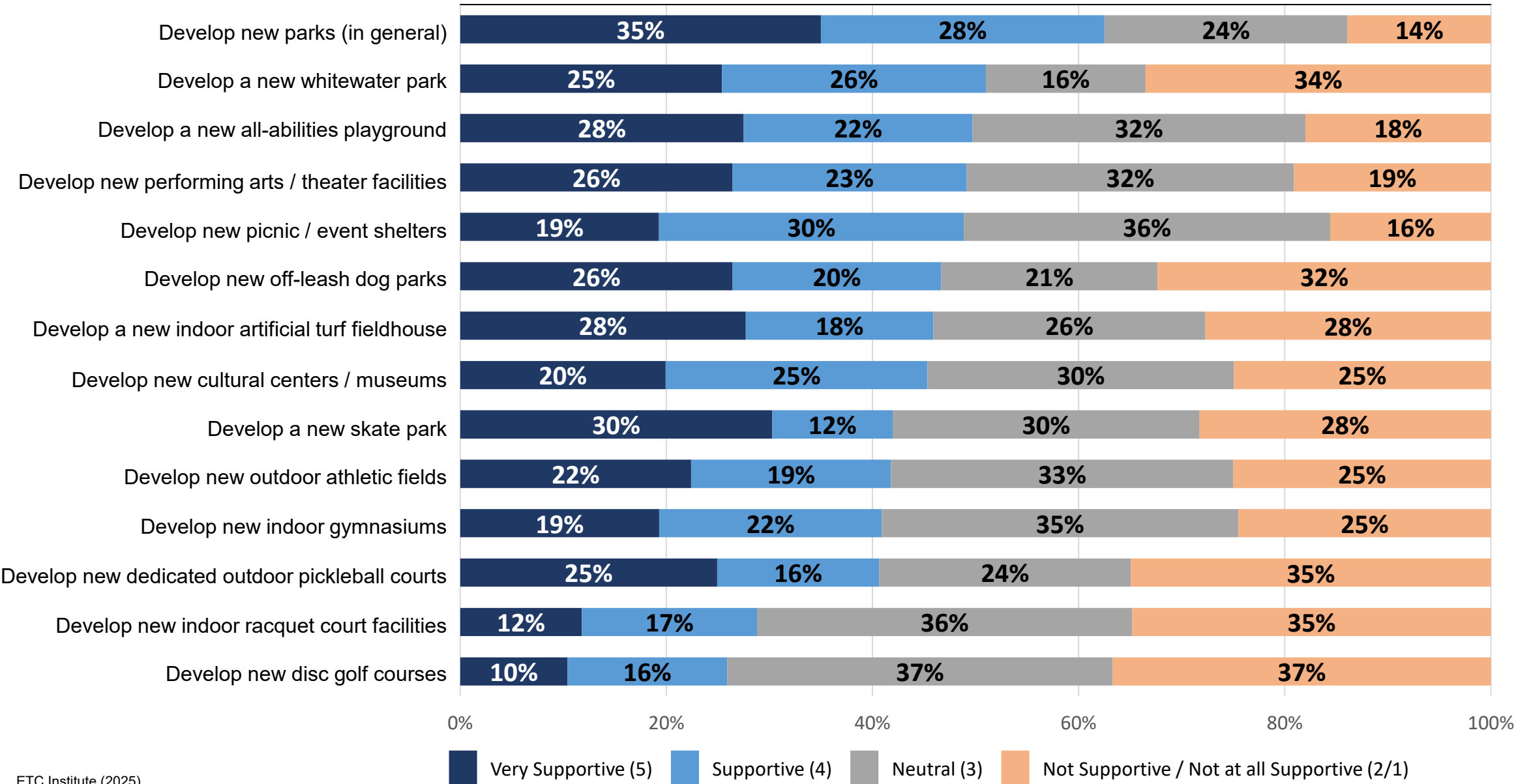
Q11. Which THREE Improvements From The List In Question 10 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?

by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



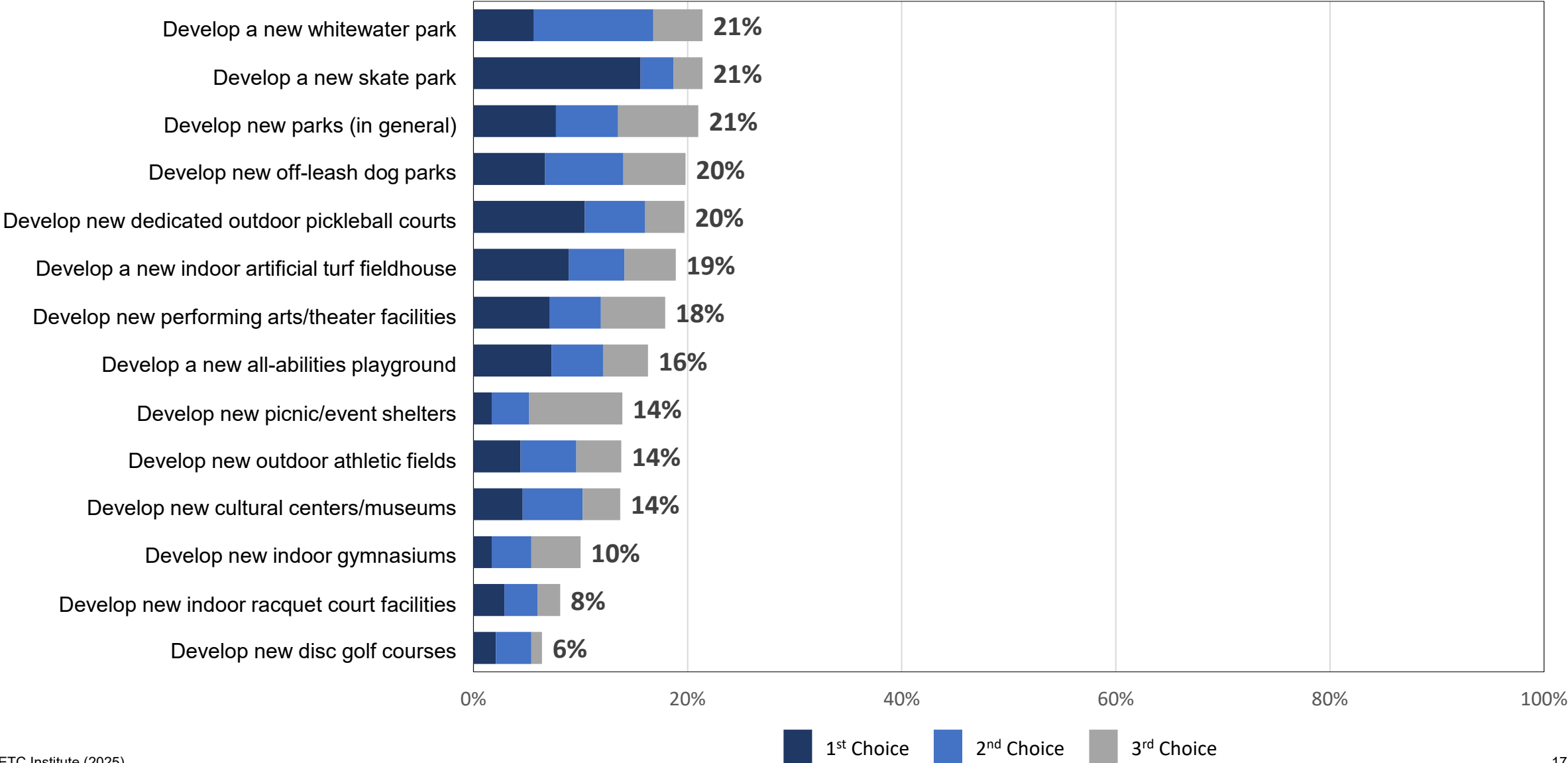
Q12. Support For Each Potential Action To Develop New Facilities or Parks

by percentage of respondents (excluding don't know)



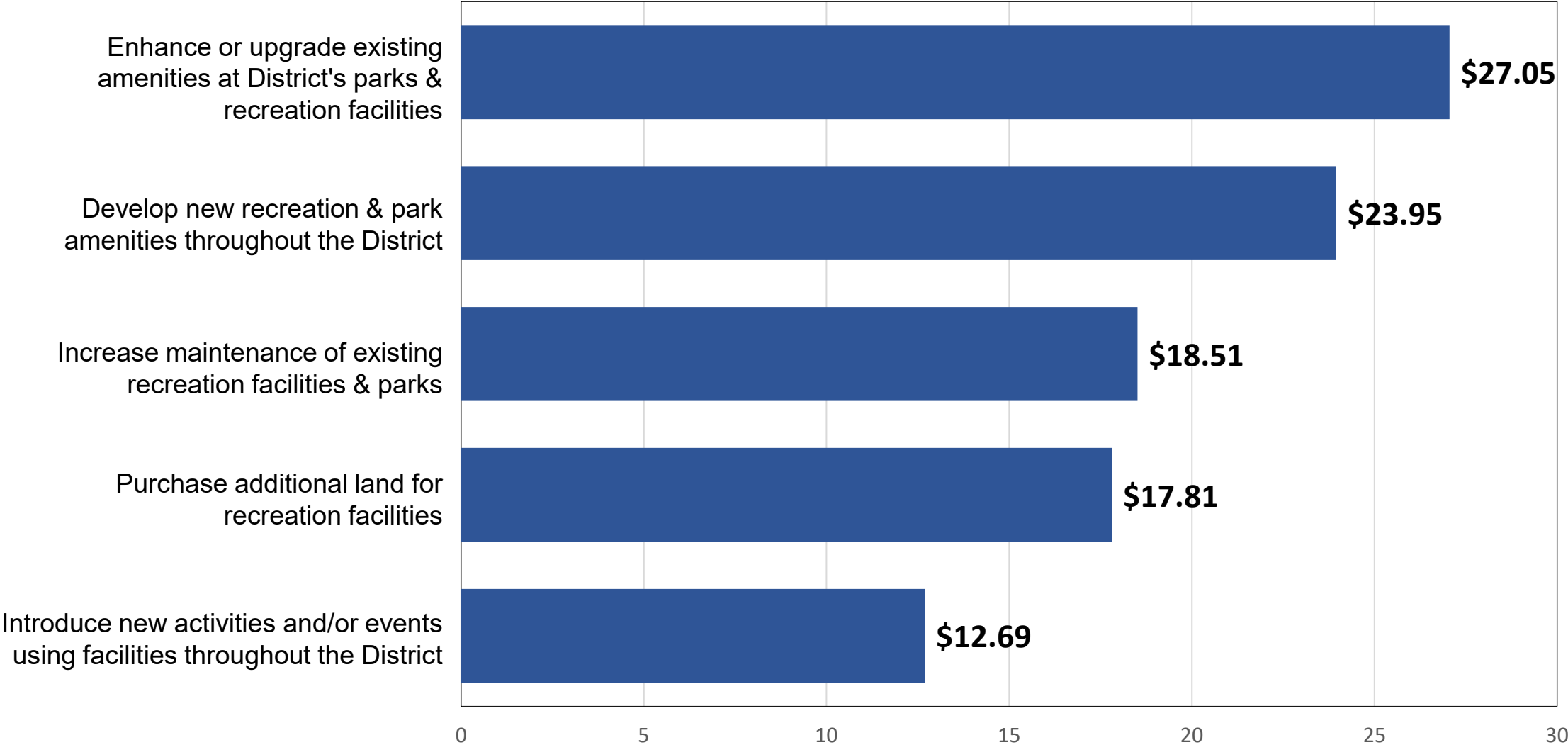
Q13. Which THREE Improvements From The List In Question 12 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?

by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



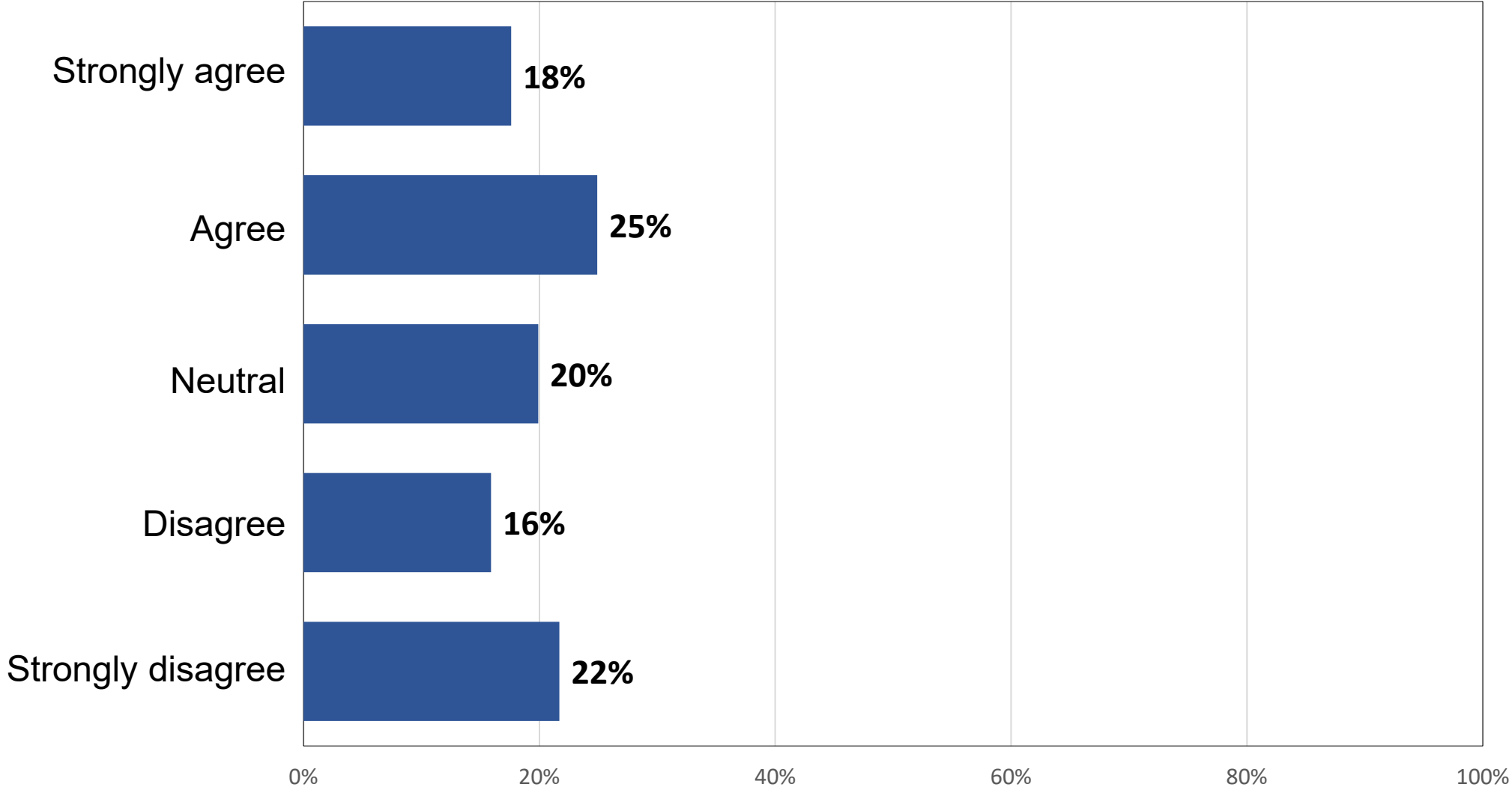
Q14. If You Had An Additional \$100, How Would You Allocate The Funds Among The Categories Listed Below?

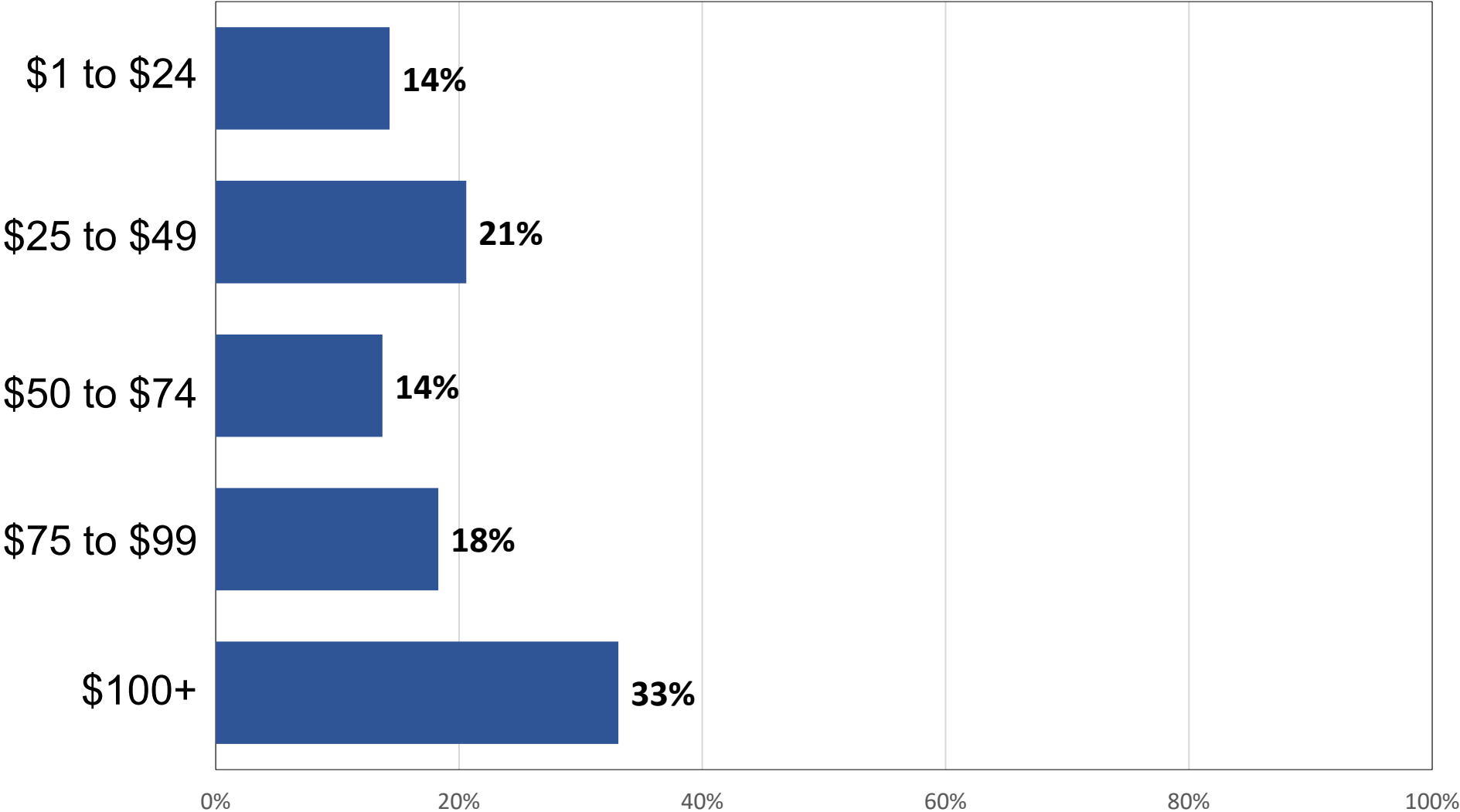

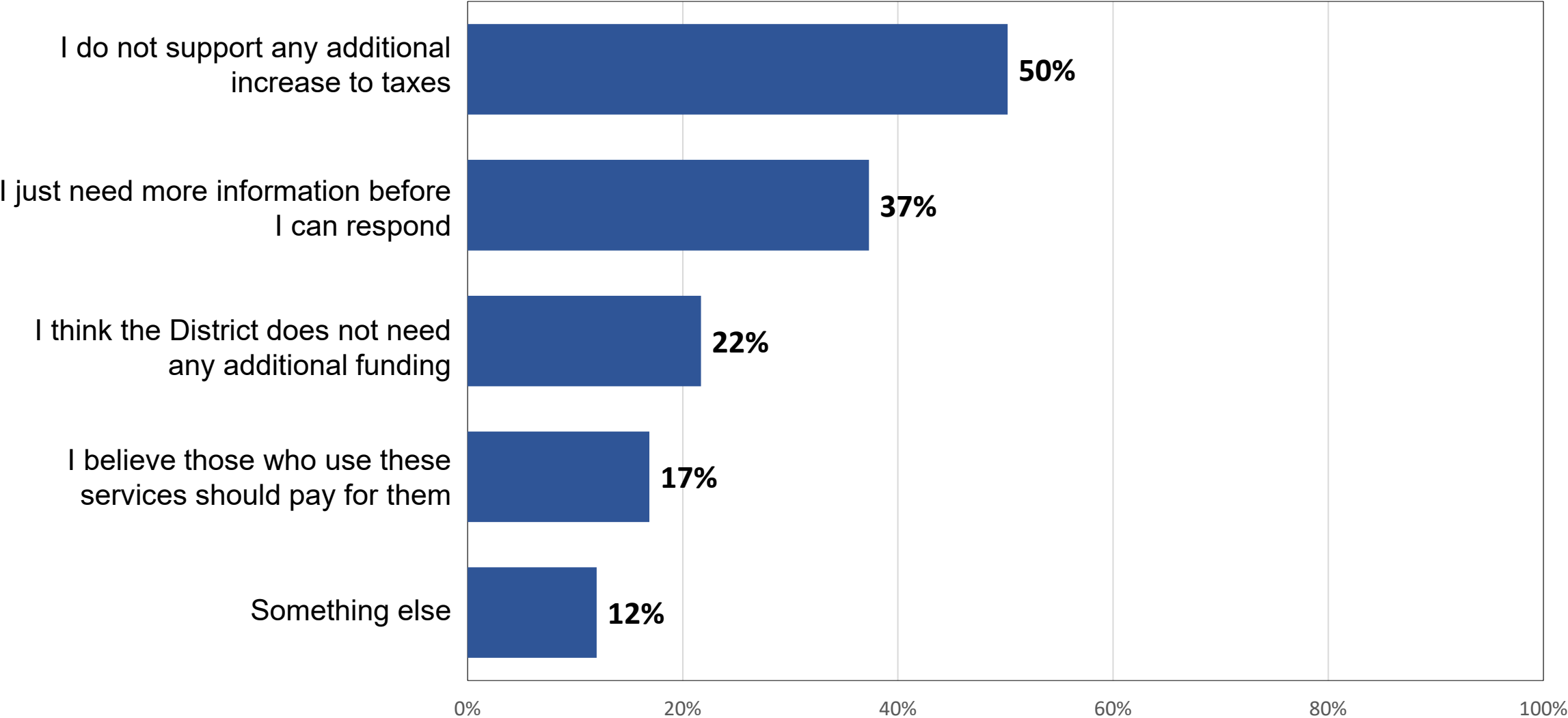

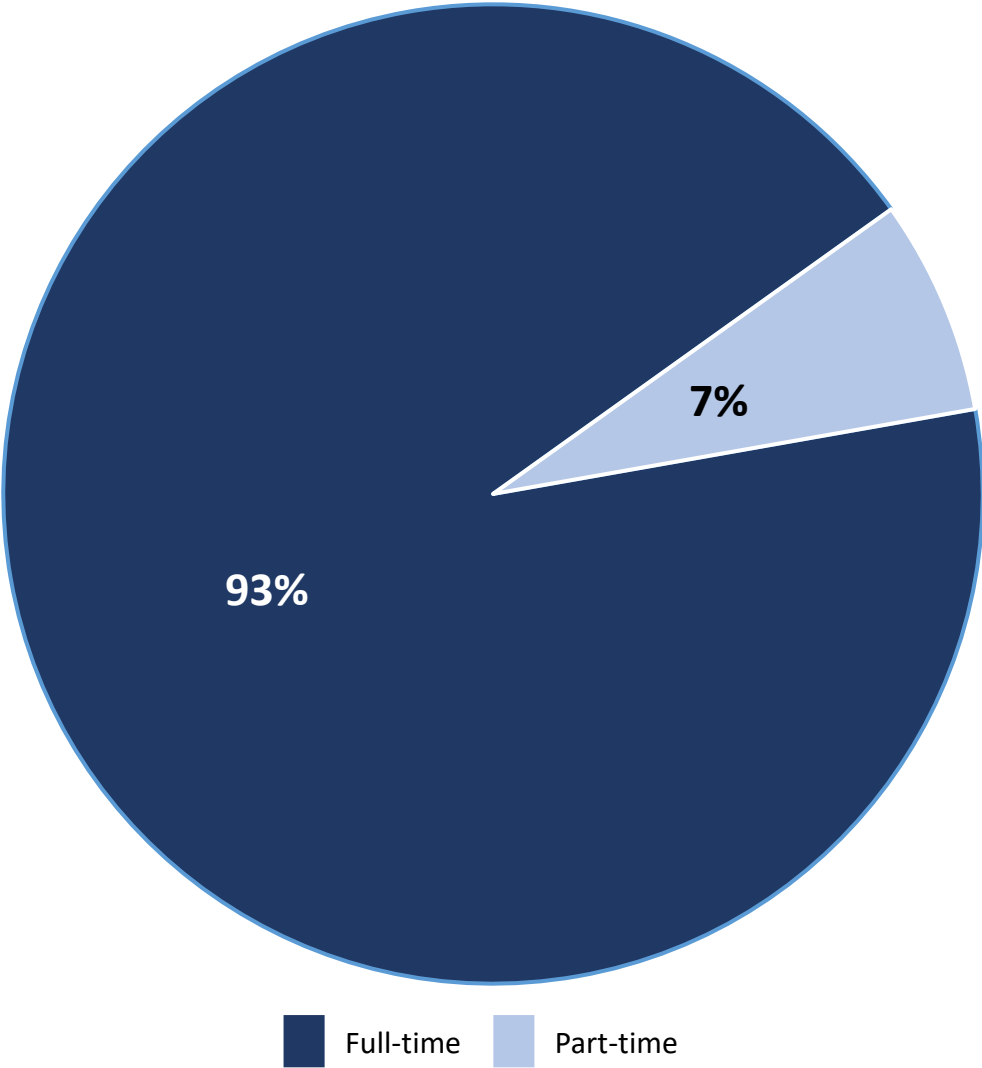

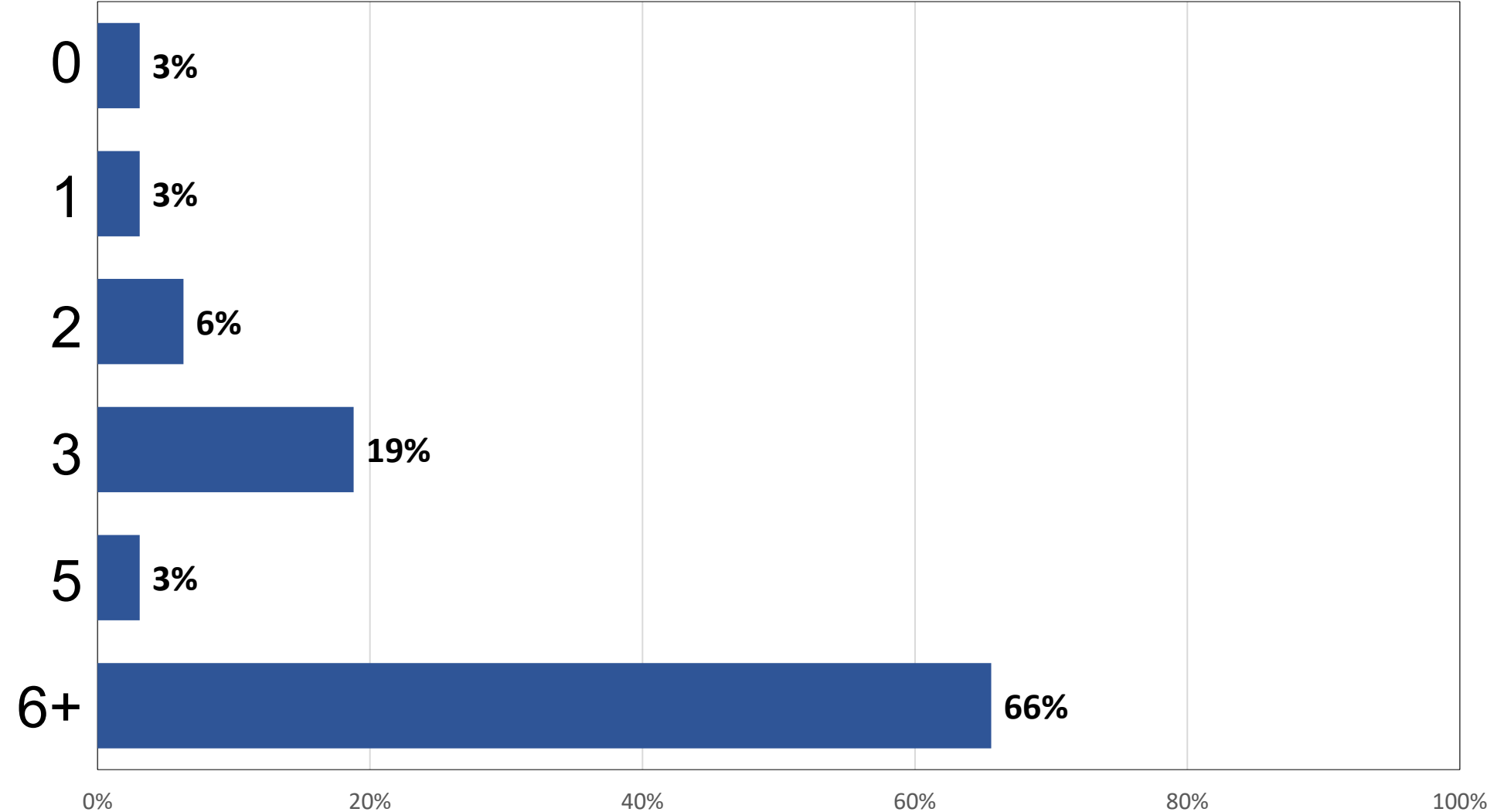
Q19. Are You A Full-time Or Part-time Resident Of Truckee?

by percentage of respondents (excluding not provided)



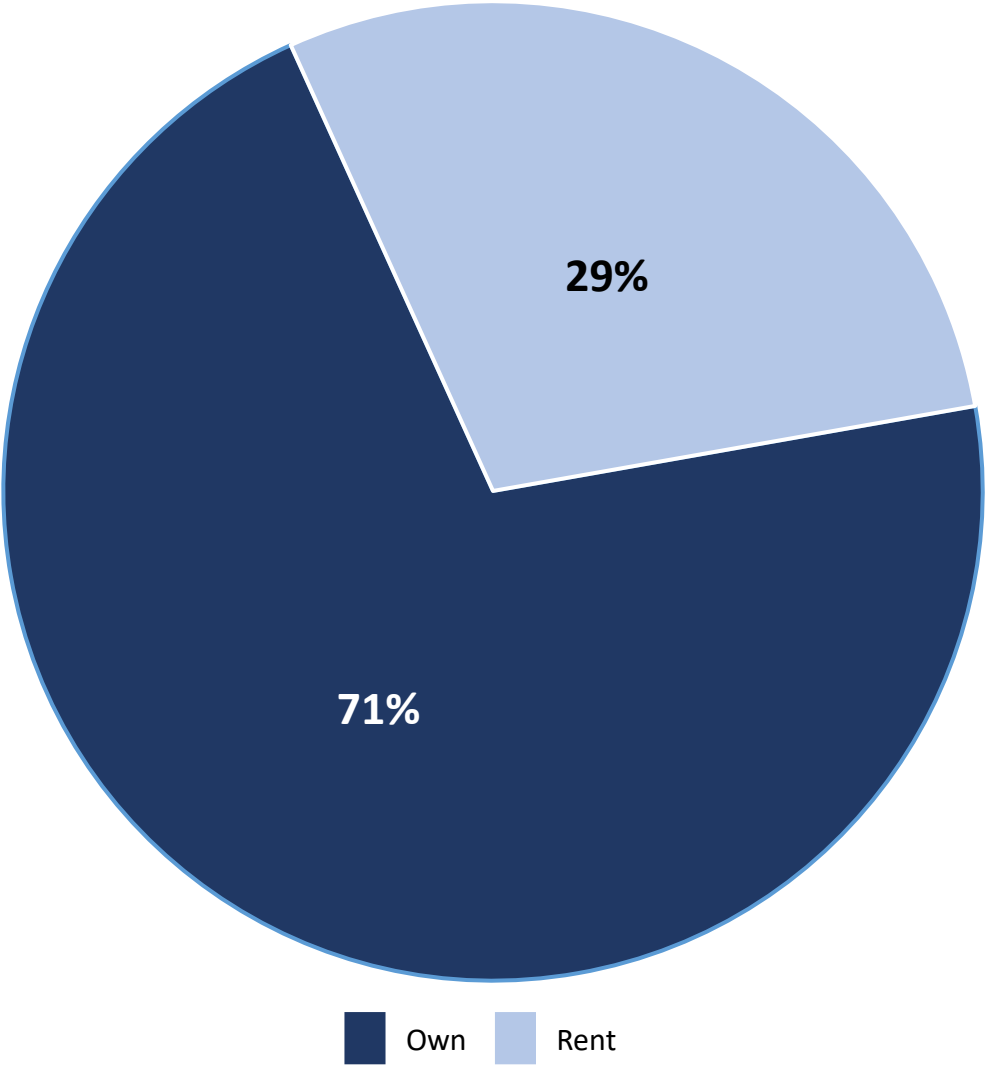
Q19a. How Many Months Out Of The Year Do You Live In Truckee?

by percentage of respondents who live in Truckee part-time (excluding not provided)



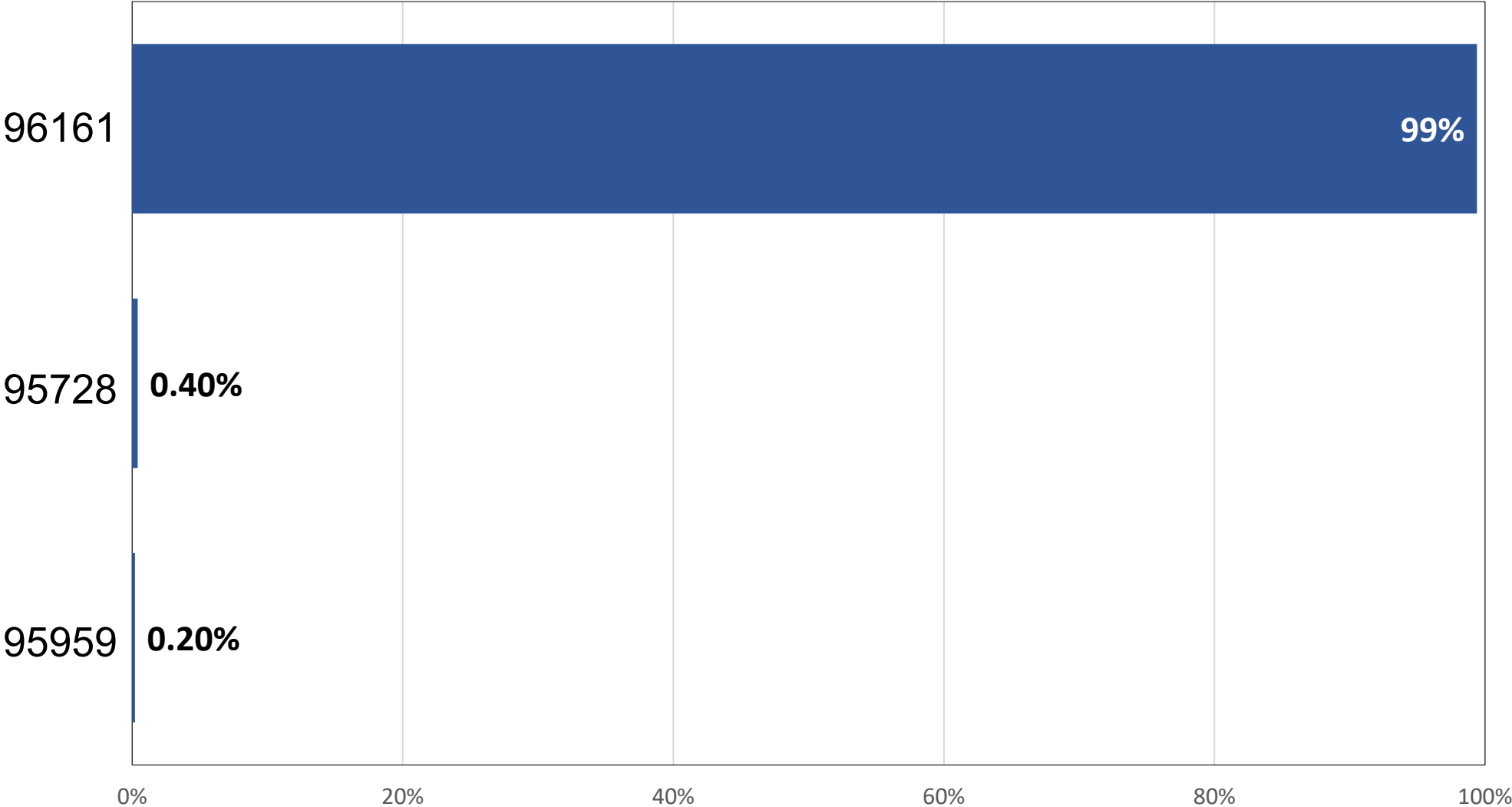
Q20. Do You Own Or Rent Your Home?

by percentage of respondents (excluding not provided)



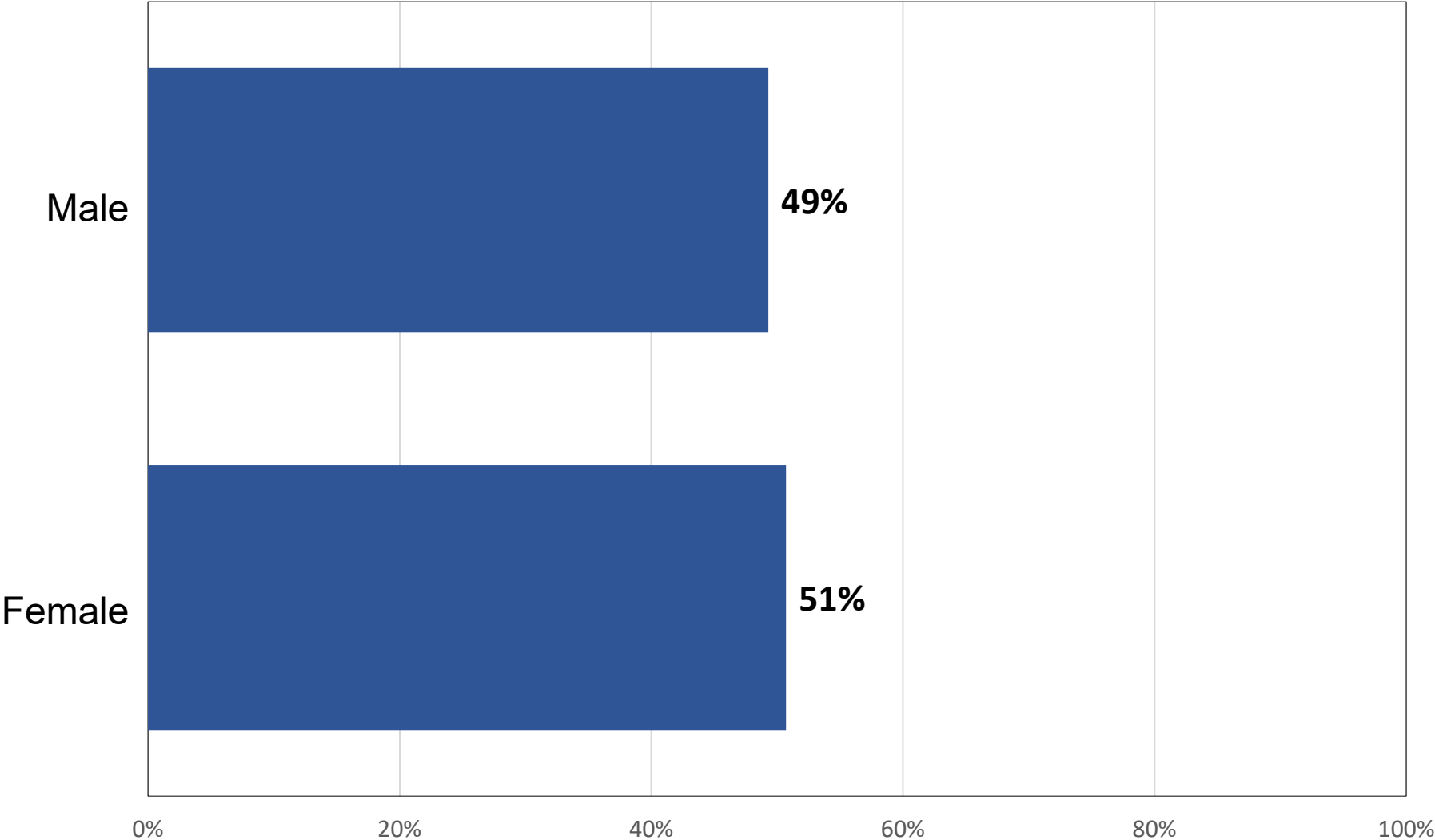
Q21. What Is Your Zip Code?

by percentage of respondents



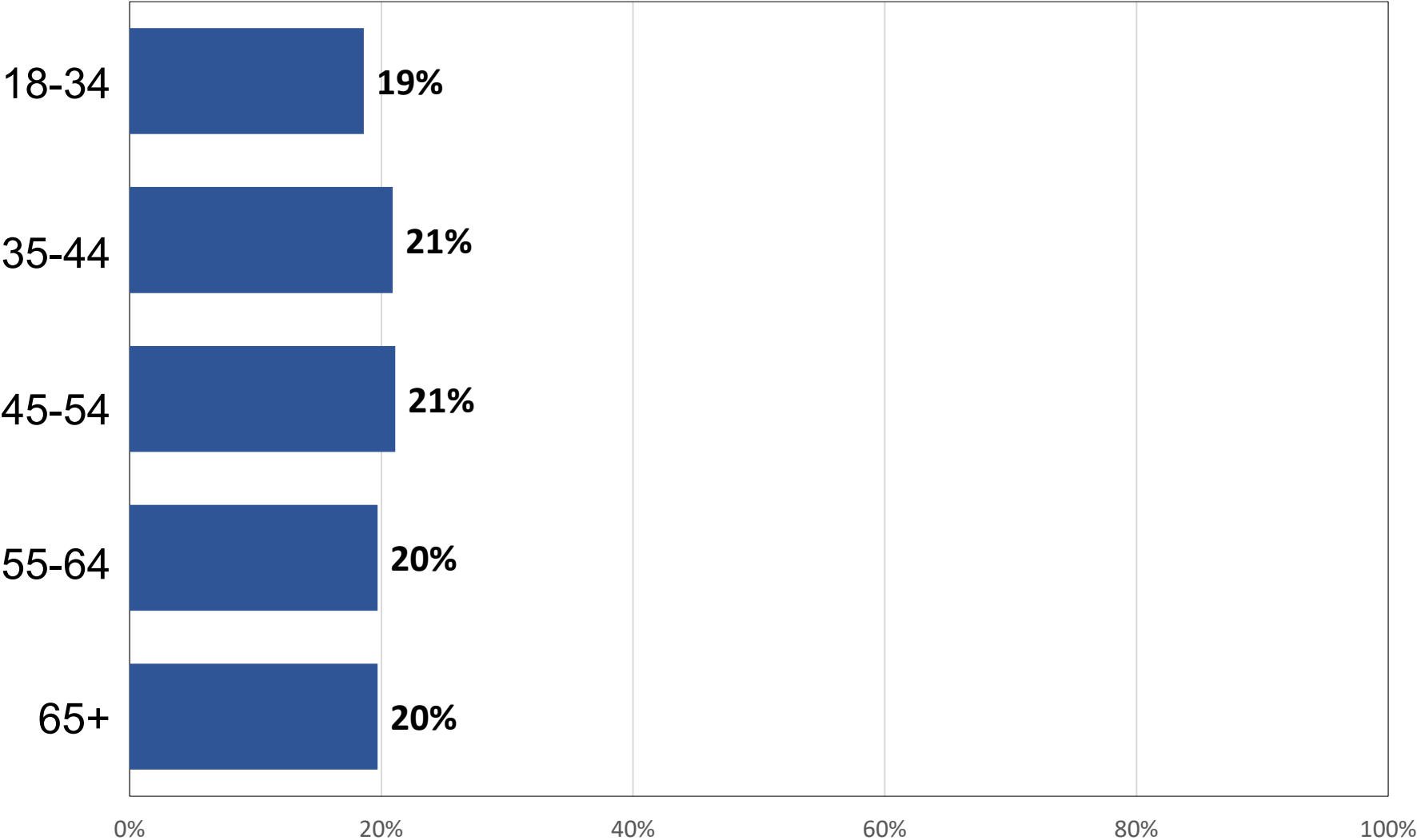
Q22. Your Gender:

by percentage of respondents (excluding not provided)



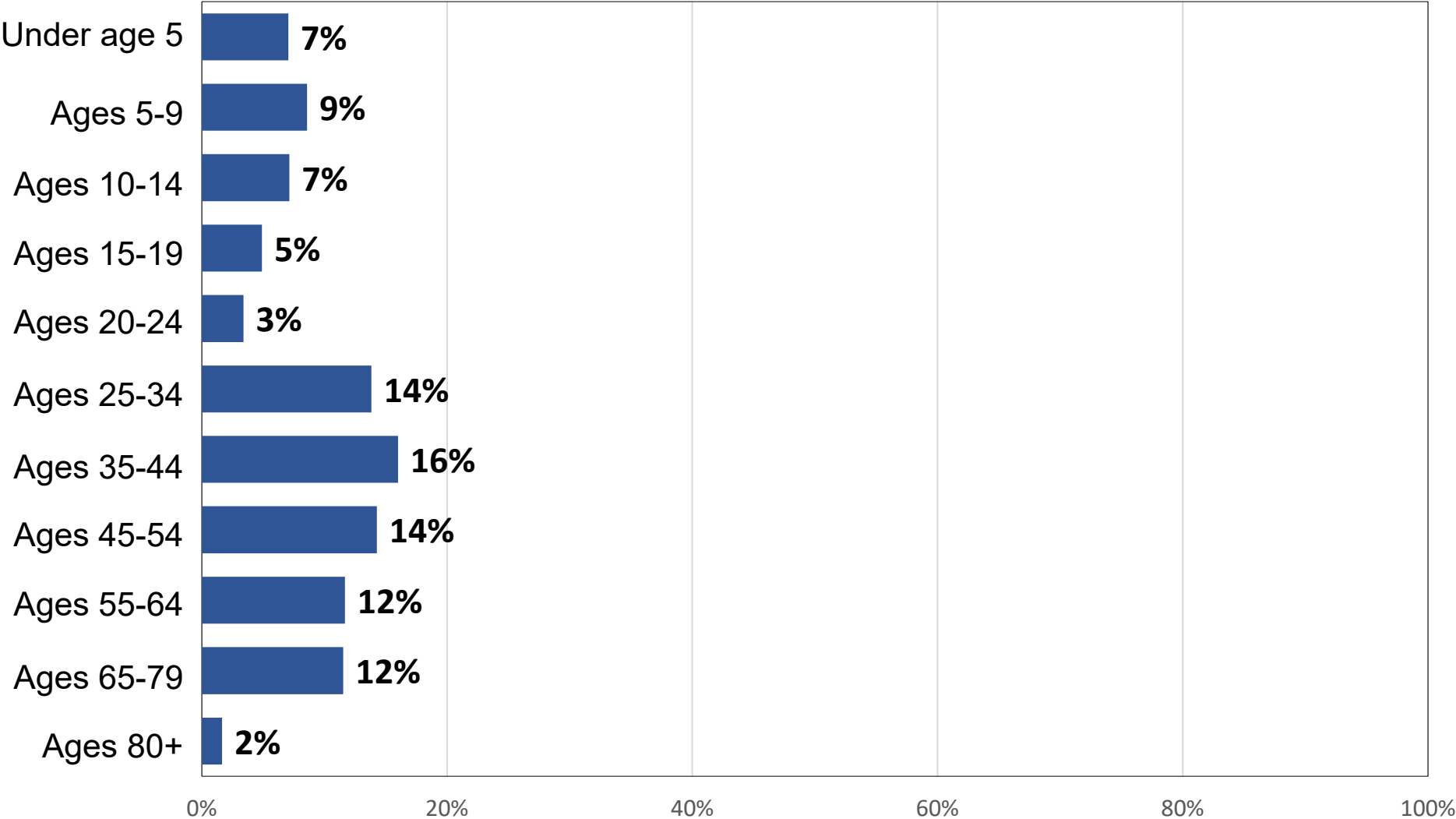
Q23. What Is Your Age?

by percentage of respondents



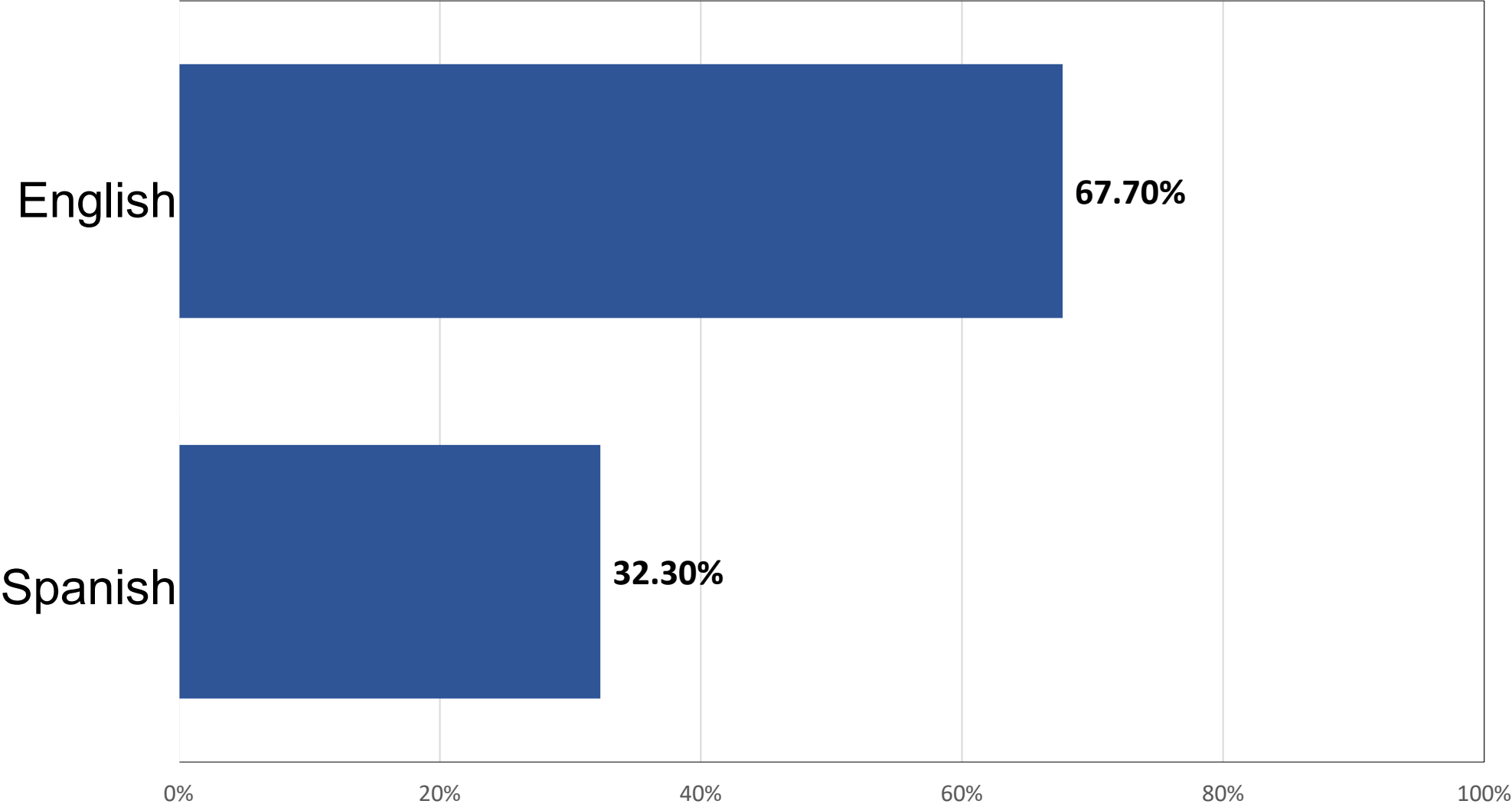
Q24. Counting Yourself, How Many People In Your Household Are...

Priority Investment Rating

Priority Investment Rating

Truckee-Donner Recreation and Park District

The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide governments with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on parks and recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating was developed by ETC Institute to identify the facilities and programs residents think should receive the highest priority for investment. The priority investment rating reflects the importance residents place on items (sum of top 3 choices) and the unmet needs (needs that are only being partly or not met) for each facility/program relative to the facility/program that rated the highest overall. Since decisions related to future investments should consider both the level of unmet need and the importance of facilities and programs, the PIR weights each of these components equally.

The PIR reflects the sum of the Unmet Needs Rating and the Importance Rating as shown in the equation below:

$$\text{PIR} = \text{UNR} + \text{IR}$$

For example, suppose the Unmet Needs Rating for playgrounds is 26.5 (out of 100) and the Importance Rating for playgrounds is 52 (out of 100), the Priority Investment Rating for playgrounds would be 78.5 (out of 200).

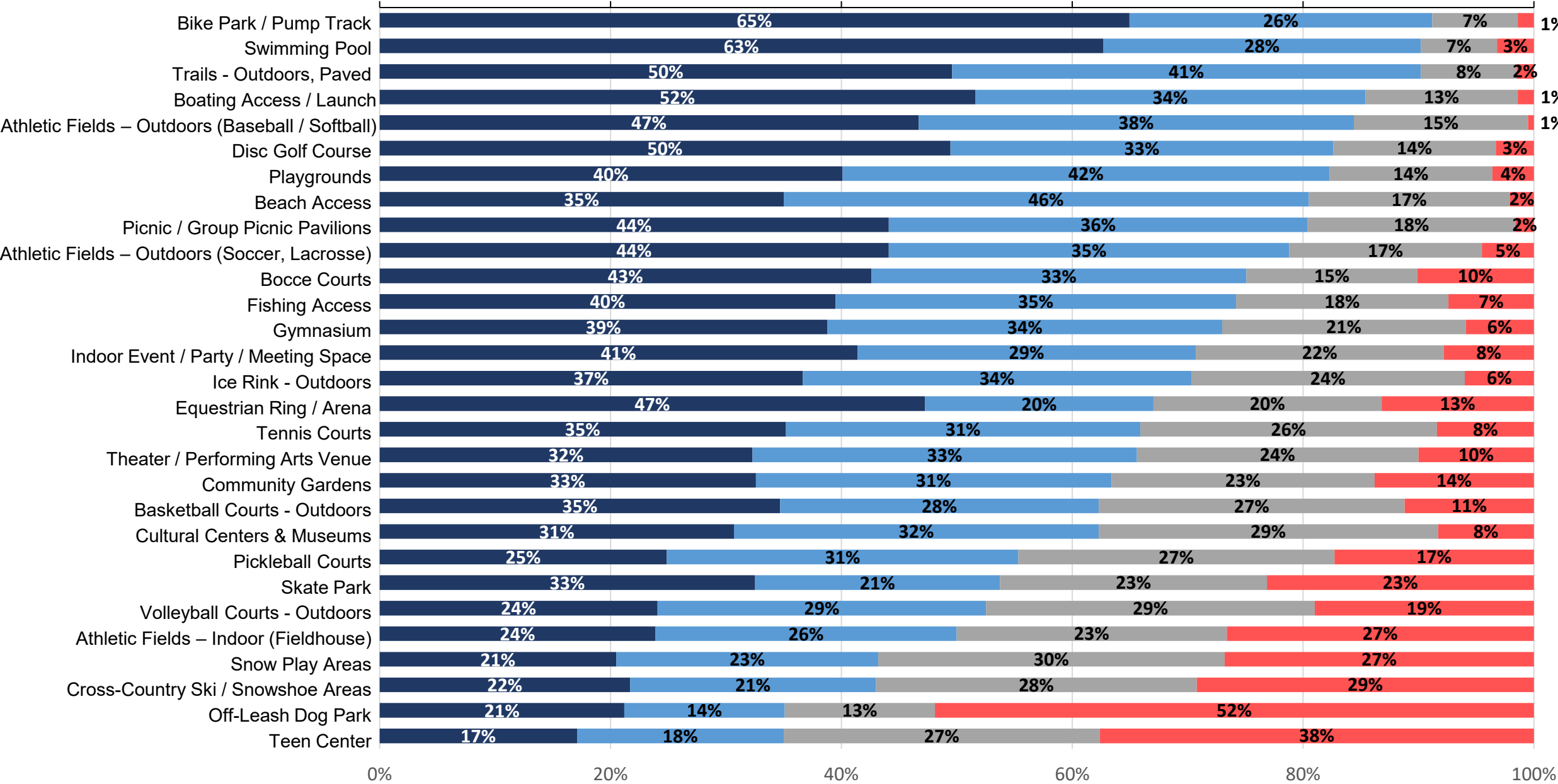
How to Analyze the Charts:

- **High Priority Areas** are those with a PIR of at least 100. A rating of 100 or above generally indicates there is a relatively high level of unmet need and residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements in this area are likely to have a positive impact on the greatest number of households.
- **Medium Priority Areas** are those with a PIR of 50-99. A rating in this range generally indicates there is a medium to high level of unmet need or a significant percentage of residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas.
- **Low Priority Areas** are those with a PIR below 50. A rating in this range generally indicates there is a relatively low level of unmet need and residents do not think it is important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements may be warranted if the needs of very specialized populations are being targeted.

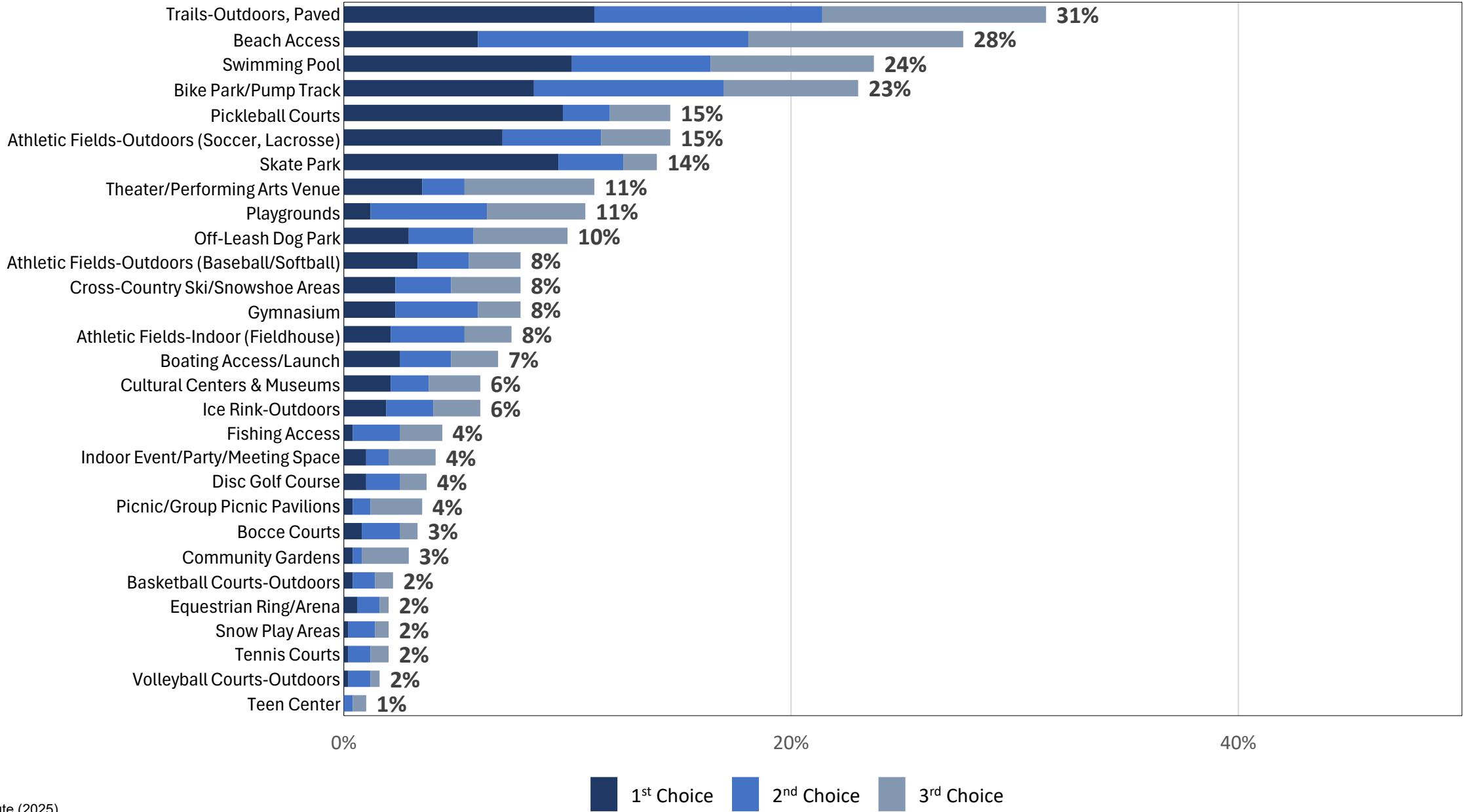

Q6. How Well Your Needs Are Being Met For Each Facility And Amenity

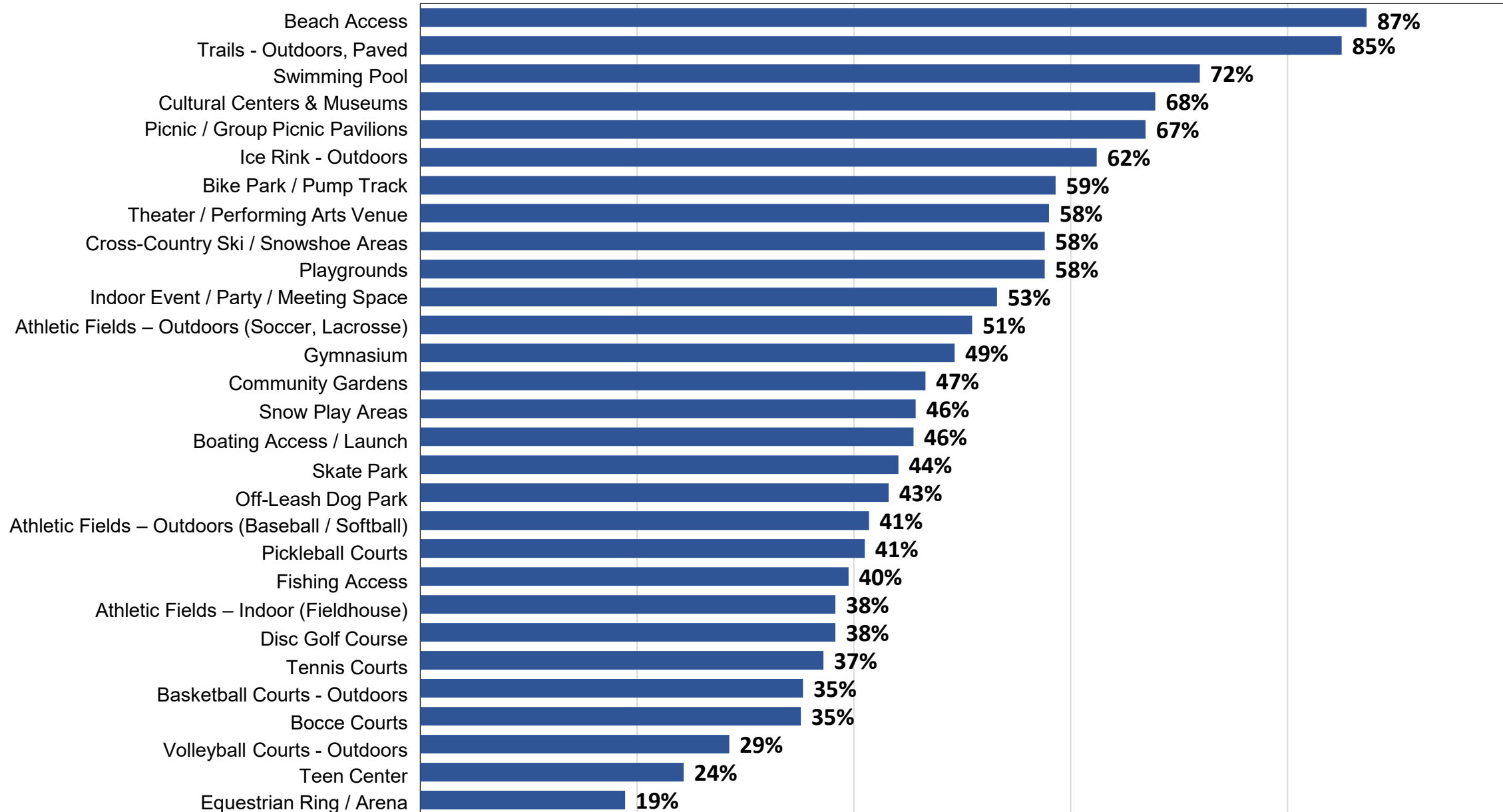


Q7. Which THREE Facilities/Amenities From The List In Question 6 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?
by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



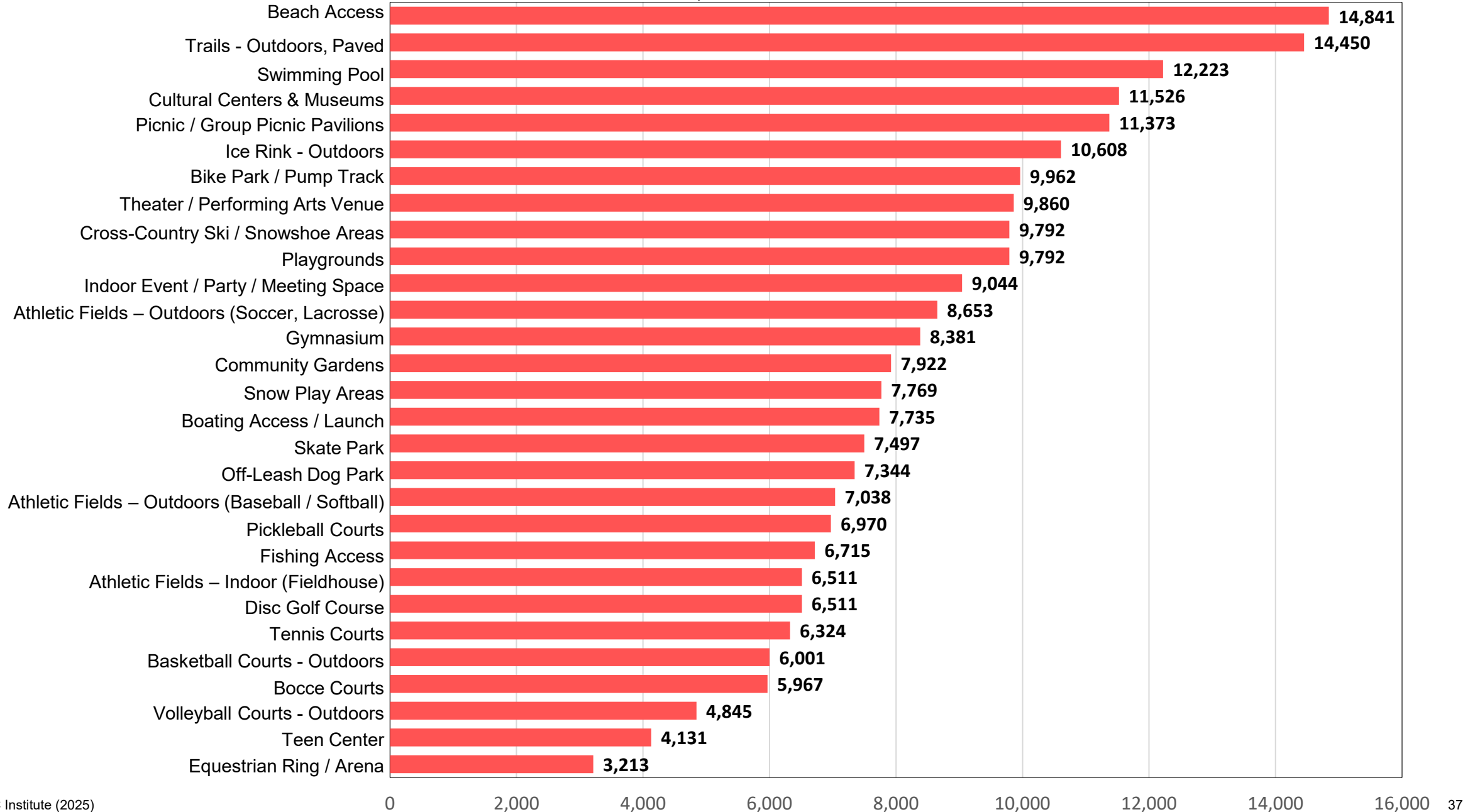
Need For Facilities And Amenities In The District

by percentage of respondents who indicated a need



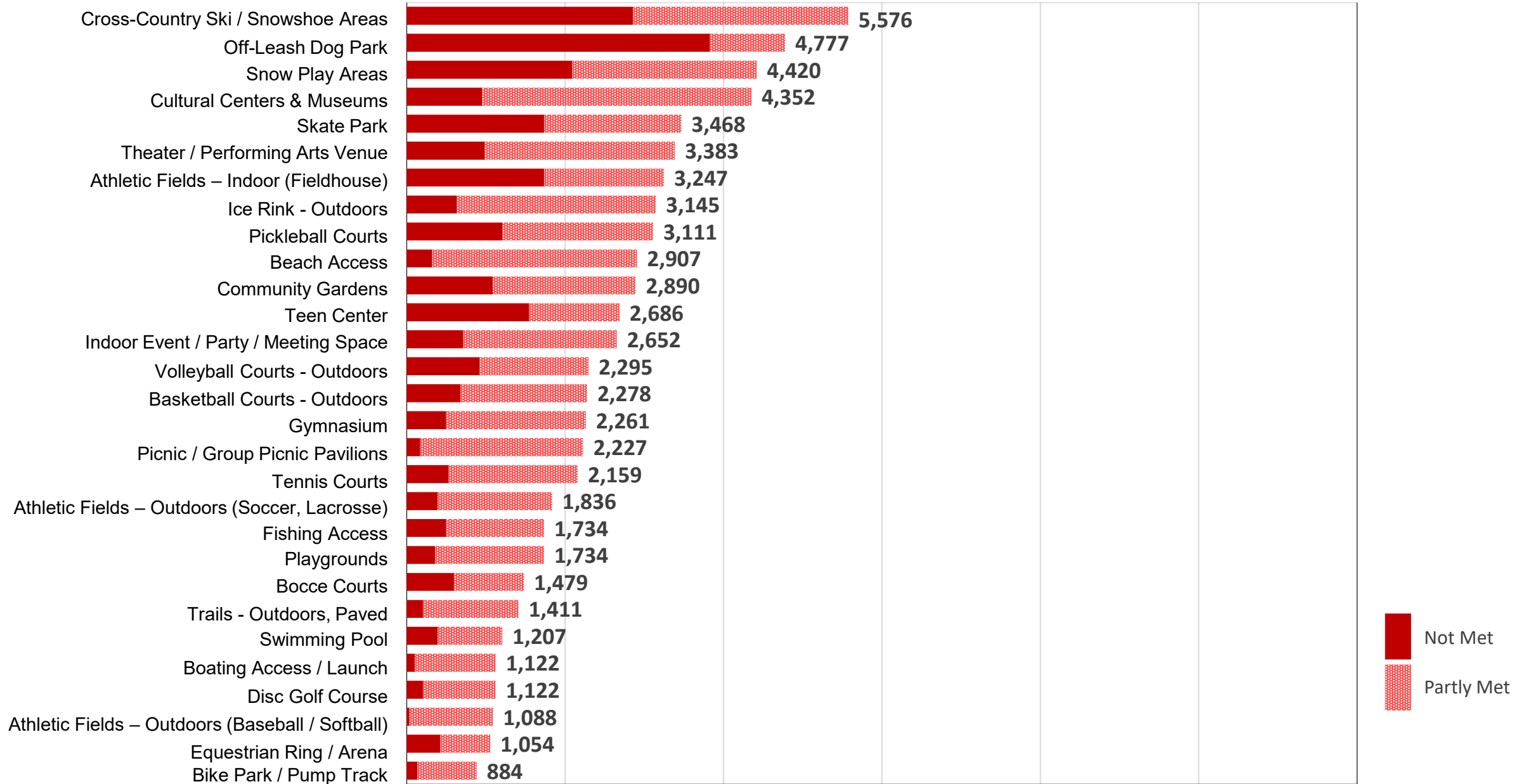
Estimated Number Of Households That Have Needs For Facilities And Amenities In The District

Estimated Number Of Households That's Needs For Facilities And Amenities Is Partly Met Or Not Met

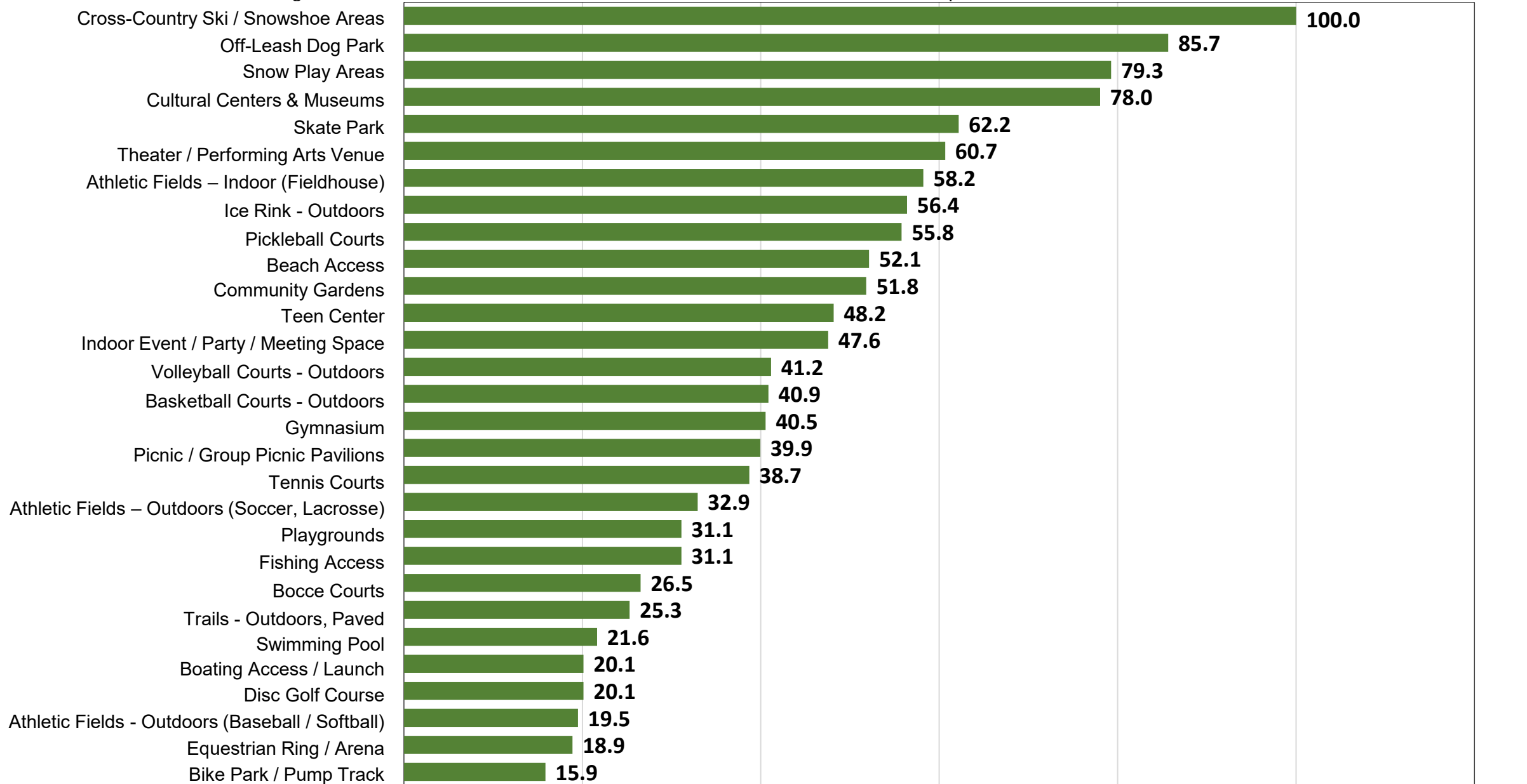

The rating for the item with the most unmet need=100

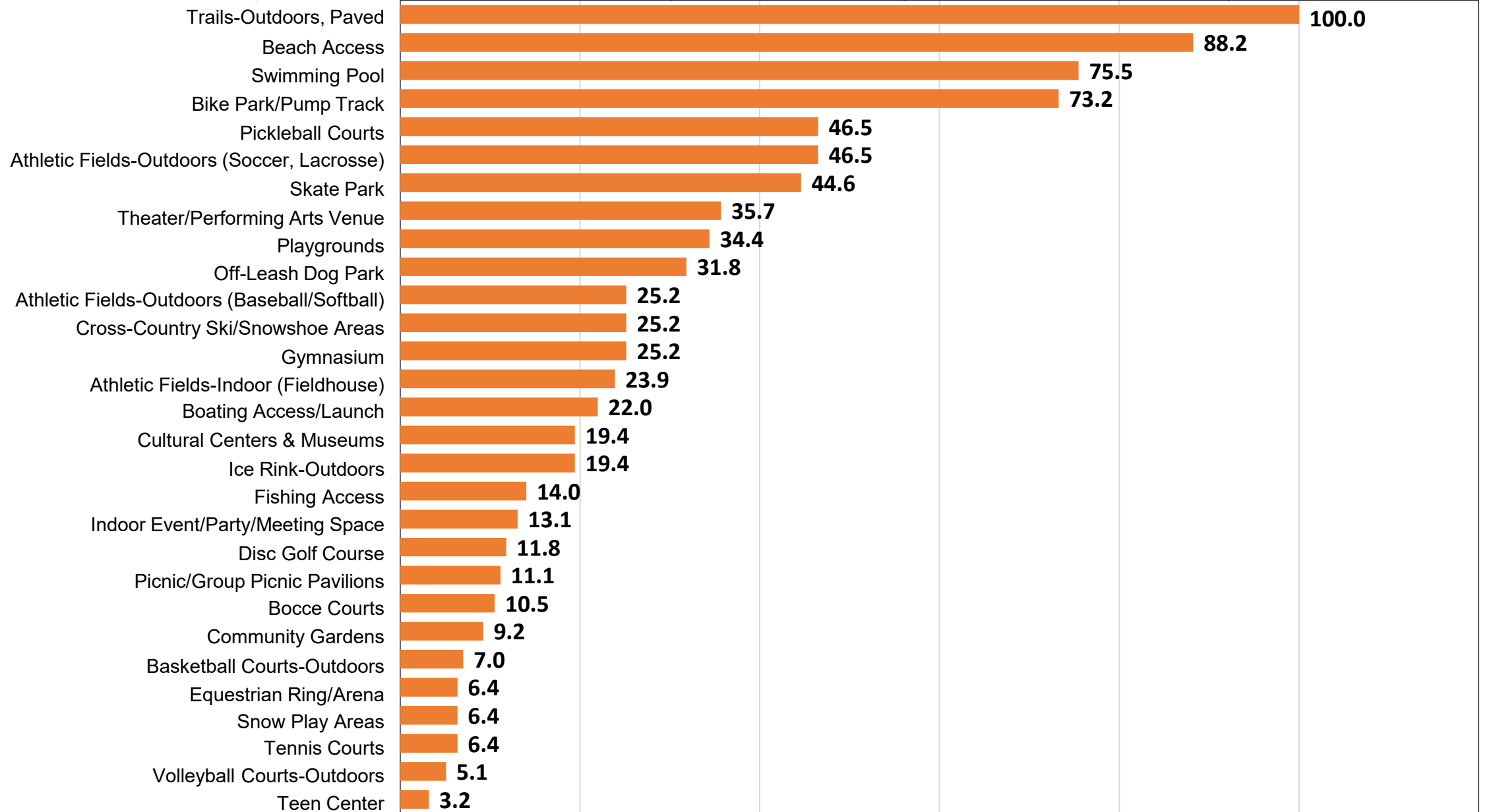

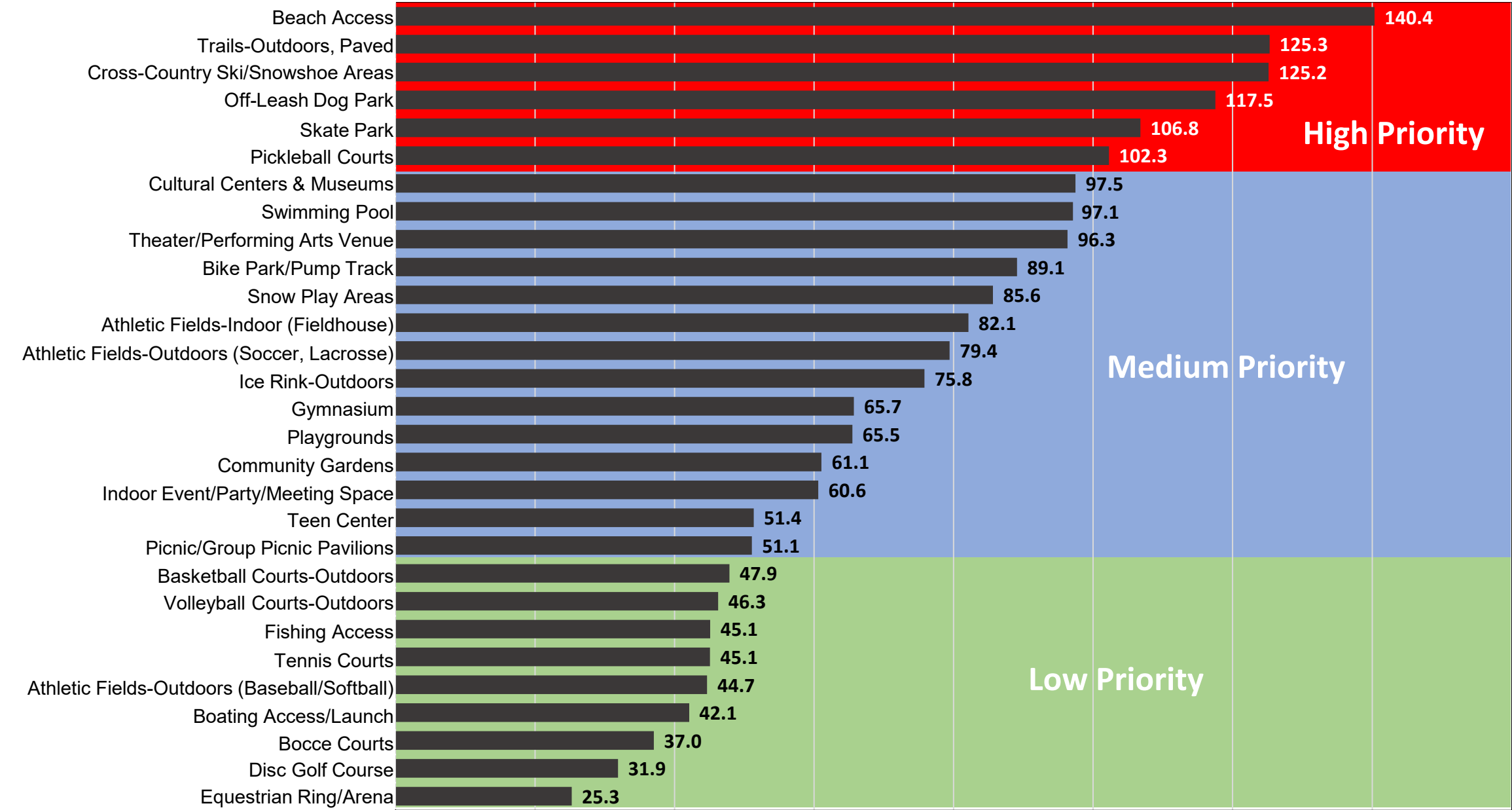
Importance Rating for Facilities and Amenities In The District

The rating of all other items reflects the relative level of importance for each item compared to the item rated as the most important

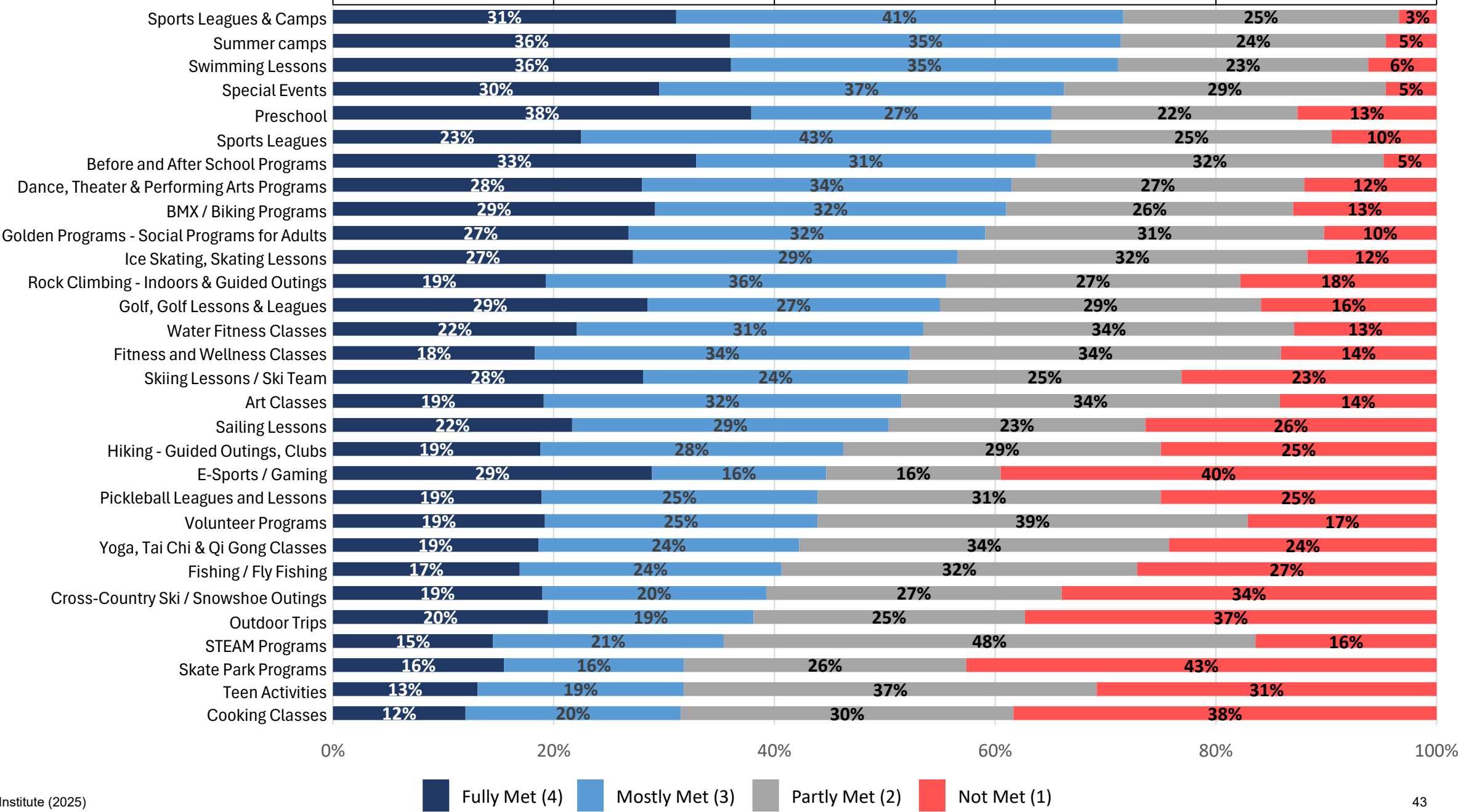


Top Priorities for Investment for Facilities And Amenities Based on Priority Investment Rating

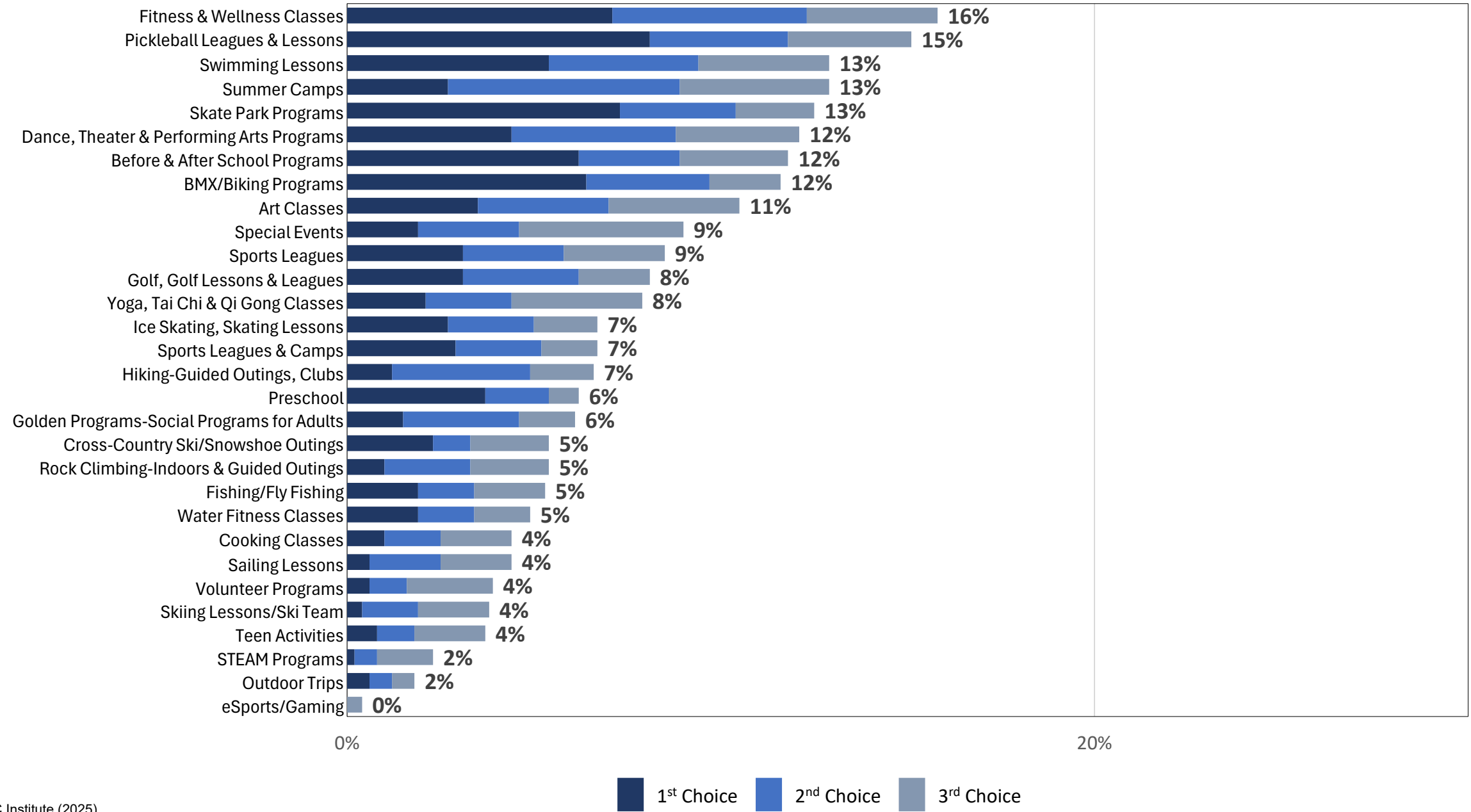

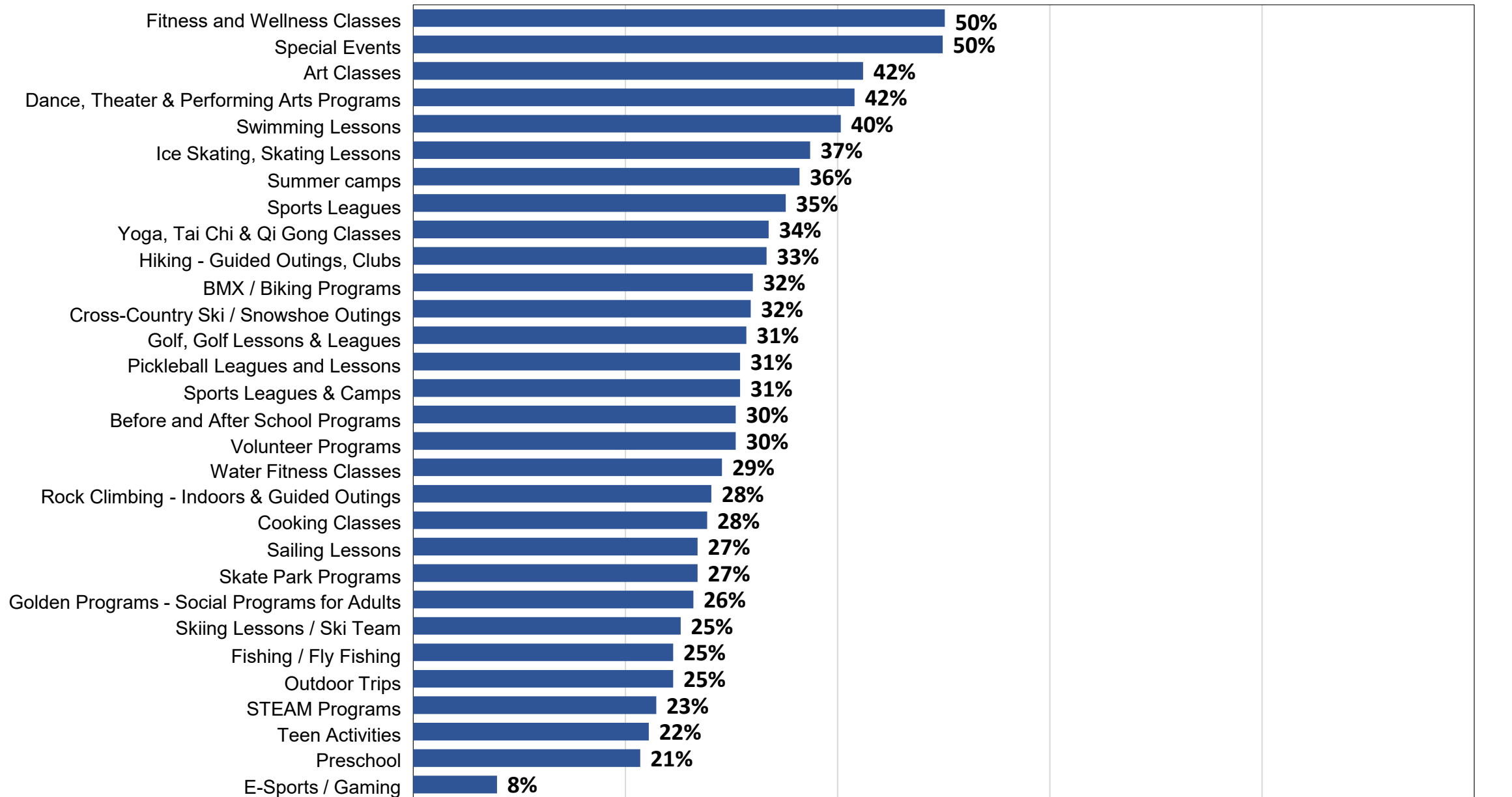


Q9. Which THREE Programs/Activities From The List In Question 8 Are MOST IMPORTANT To Your Household?
by percentage of respondents who selected the item as one of their top three choices



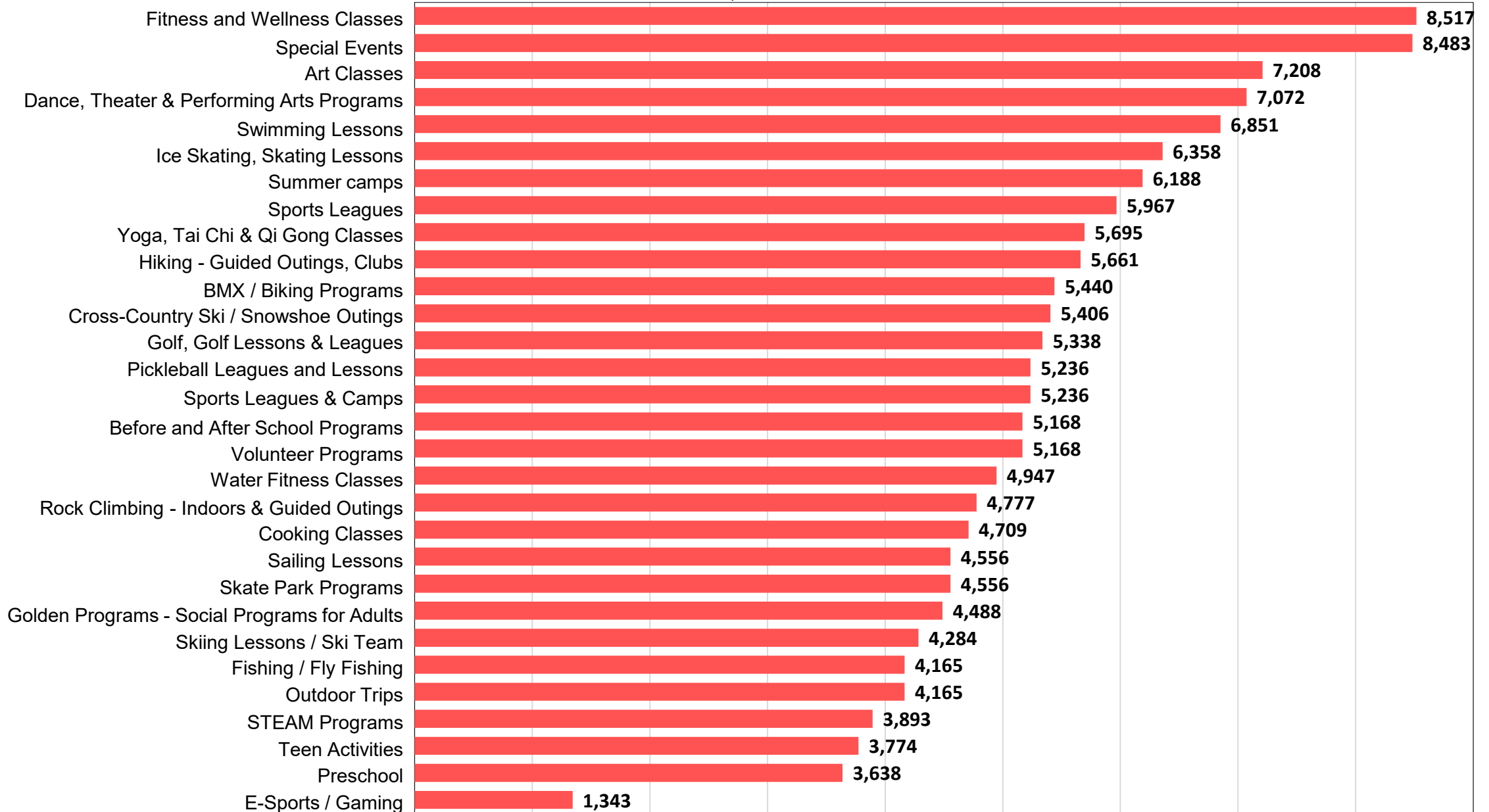
Need For Programs And Activities In The District

by percentage of respondents who indicated a need



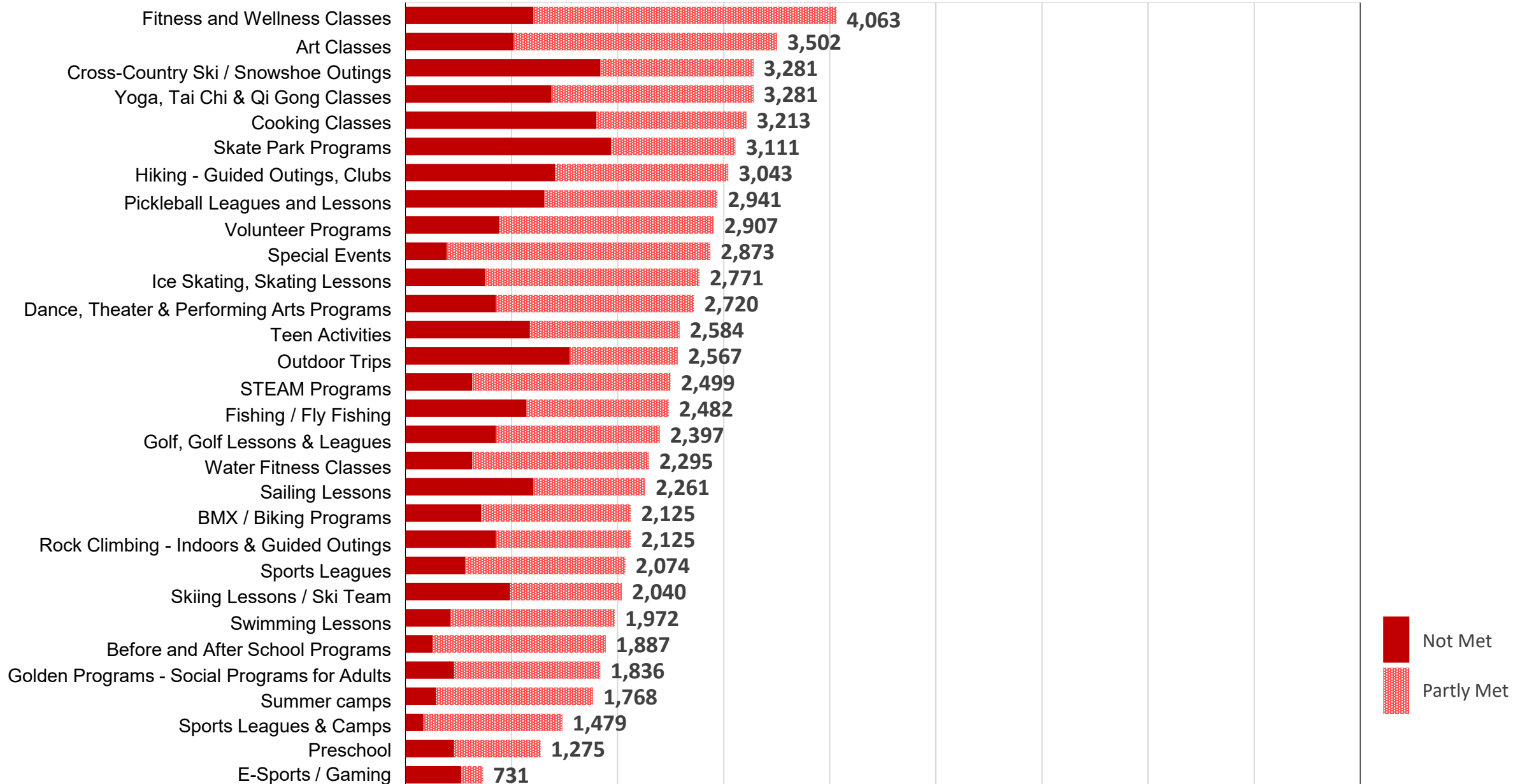
Estimated Number Of Households That Have Needs For Programs And Activities In The District

Estimated Number Of Households That's Needs For Programs And Activities Is Partly Met Or Not Met

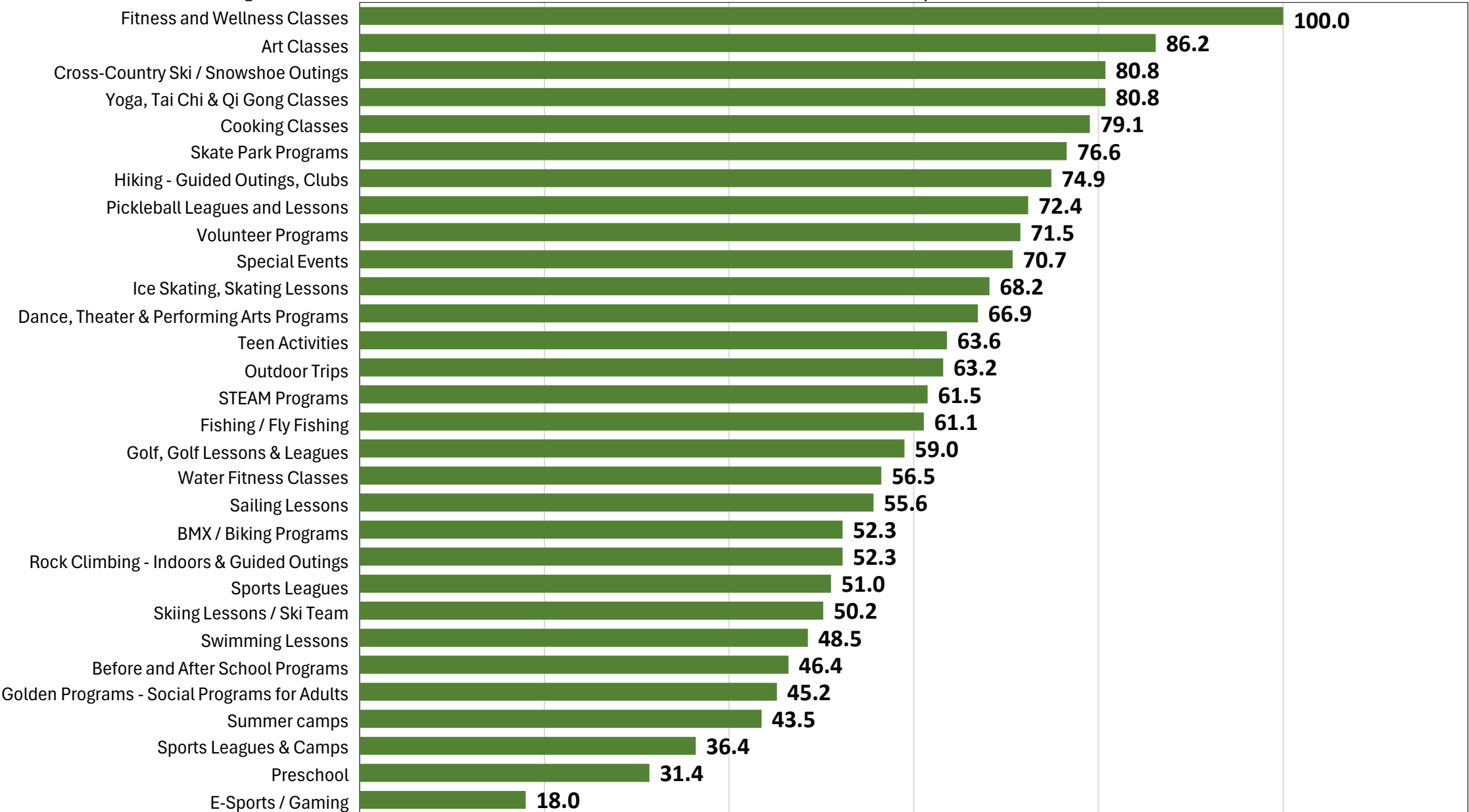

The rating for the item with the most unmet need=100

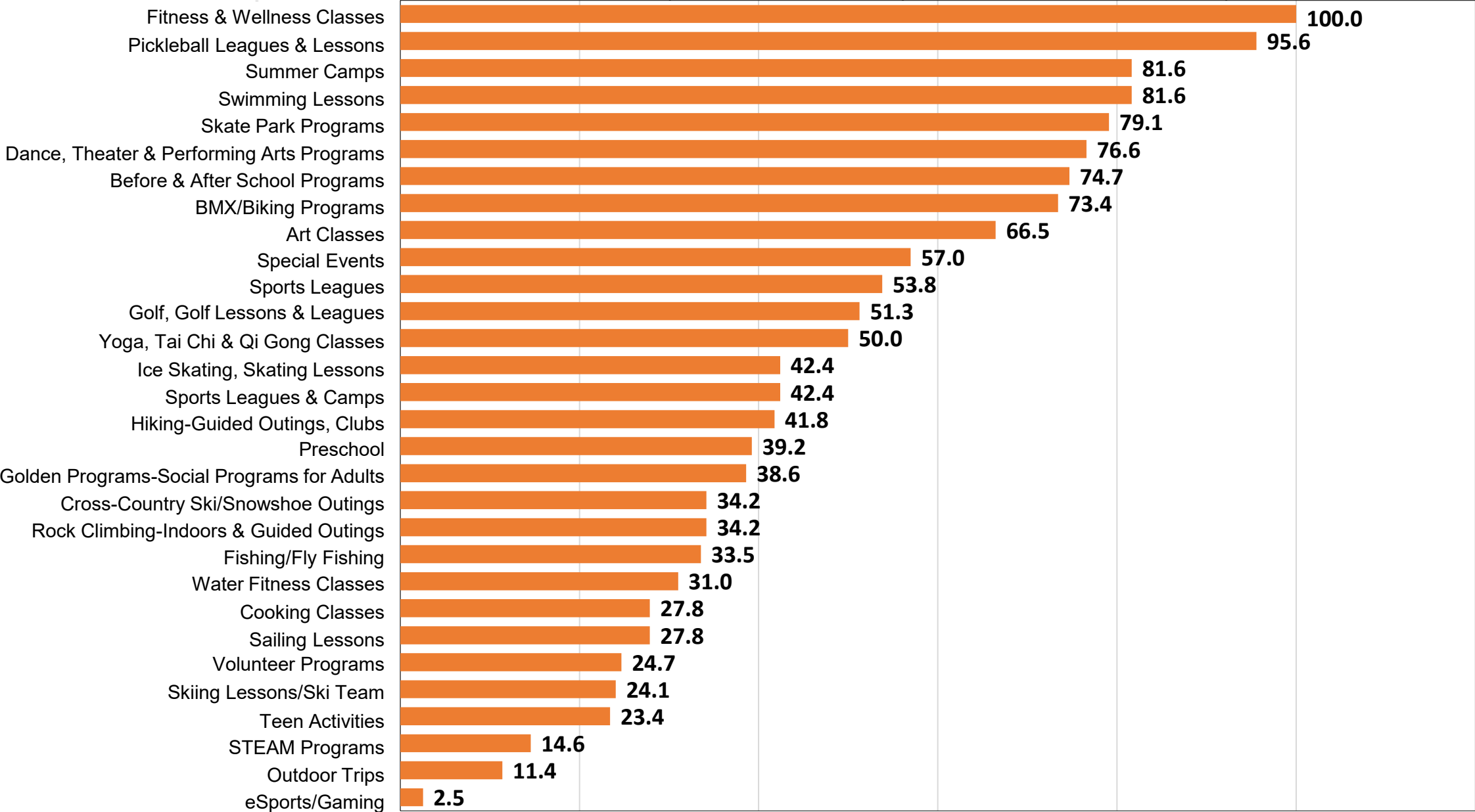

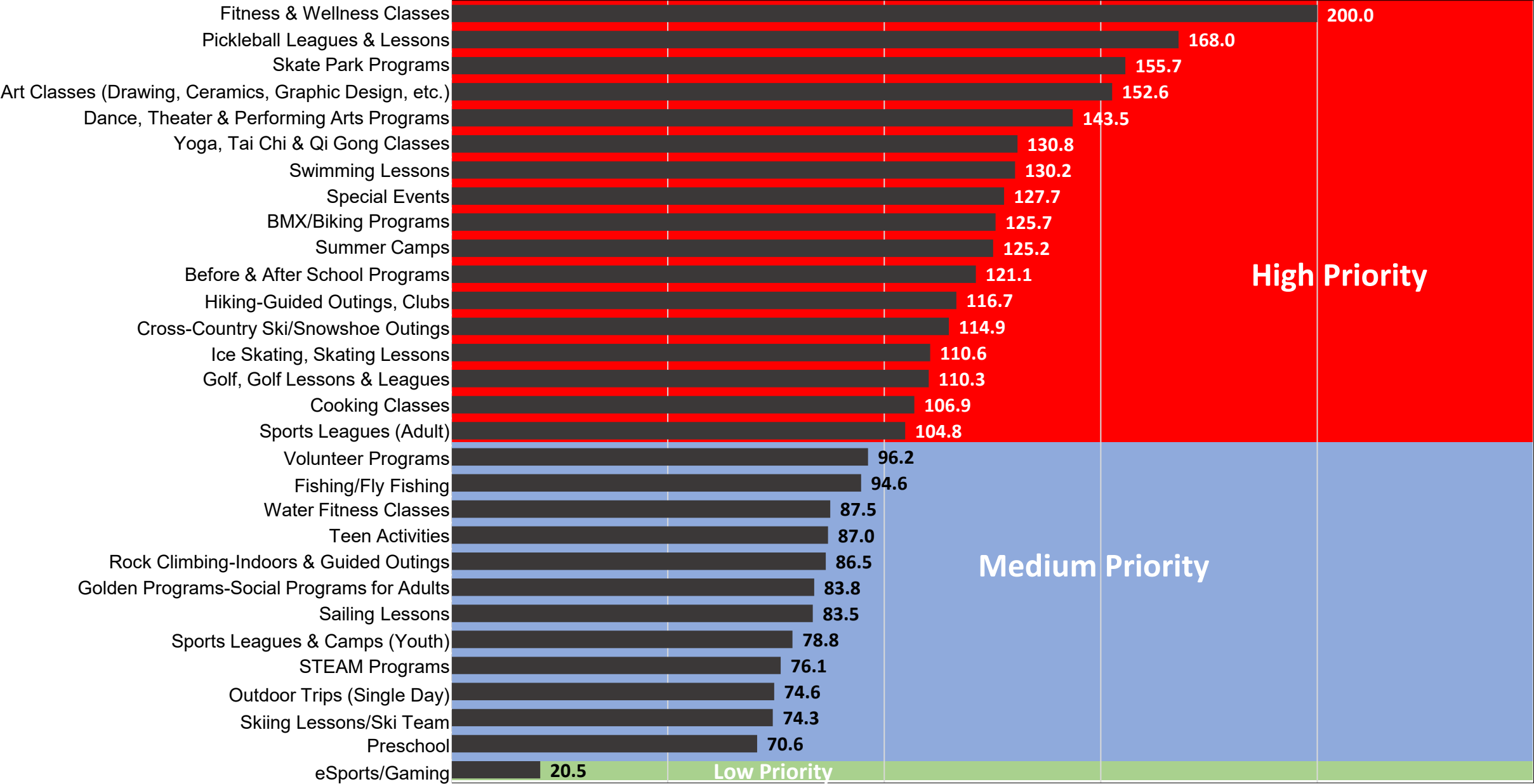
Importance Rating for Programs And Activities In The District

- I pay enough in taxes. My family cannot afford to pay more taxes, there is plenty of money in Truckee for facilities to be built.
- I really want a better ice facility, preferably an indoor ice rink that is comparable to Reno Ice. If this facility was part of the discussion then I would be much more inclined to support a tax.
- I think TDRPD is well-run at existing funding levels and that major investments are not currently necessary. There's a good mix of recreation amenities available in Truckee, including TDRPD managed amenities. If there was a specific project that required additional funding, I'd be open to supporting it but in general I think Truckee has great recreation facilities and isn't missing much.
- I think the local gov't should stop wasting money on consultants and initiatives people don't generally care about and utilize existing monies towards improvement/expansion in local quality of life like the parks and recreation dept.
- I would like to transparently see the current budget and expenses.
- I would only want tax assessments for services that I would use.
- Let seniors opt out of paying additional taxes.
- Library first then we can talk.
- live within your means.
- Maintain your existing facilities better.
- Our taxes are already extremely high for a small town. The city council has increased sales tax 2x over the past 5 years. We need to retire or repurpose some of our current taxes to support new development. i.e., funds from the airport district, the trails tax, and the tourist tax could all be repurposed to support parks and recreation activities.
- Some of these facilities should be fundraised for by those that are trying to get them built. At least a larger portion of them, that way the cost is not spread back to tax payers.
- Such a difficult question! I feel homeowners already pay a tremendous amount of property tax. I would prefer a general sales tax, however, I think we might be at our limit with the Town's introduction of measure E.

- Tourist tax, they use the space and don't give back to the community
- We are seniors with no children, little use of amenities.
- We currently rent, so I need more information on current and proposed taxes.
- We don't need more STUFF, we need to better manage what we have. OR get rid of what isn't being used as much(aka less popular) THEN replace it with a new facility or play ground, etc.
- we pay too many taxes as it is
- what impact have our taxes to date have made?

16. Please share any additional comments that could assist us in improving recreational facilities and programs/services.

- Truckee Community Theater is a wonderful program that enriches our community. They need a dedicated space to rehearse and perform. Building a whitewater park in Truckee would attract visitors and enhance opportunities for local youth (and the forever young among us).
- 1) The legacy trail parking at the end of West River is amazing, but it needs a restroom and more parking.
2) Love the Rec Center pool but it is very unfriendly for those with injuries and disabilities. Once inside it's great with the therapy pool and PT classes in the water. Its a wonderful place once you get inside. However, have you ever tried to walk/hobble on crutches from the closest 'handicap' parking spot? No idea if there is a way, but those with injuries should be granted different access that gets them in a side door and less walking. Even with a drop off shuttle driver (which is tough because all of the parents that are blocking the drop off area and 'parking their cars to want to walk their kids.....which is not allowed but they do it) it is over a 100 yards of walking. When you are in pain and using crutches, this is very tough. The therapy pool should be encouraging, not an obstacle course to get there. Again, the building was built the way it was.....zero consideration for injured folks. Please take a look and see if there is a back / side door access available to injured members. In the meantime, please have those parents stop blocking the drop off zone. Maybe there can be temp wheel chair / scooter available to borrow to get from the sidewalk to the pool. Just thinking out loud.
- A new skate park would be very beneficial for all ages and genders. I think it is very important to create a space for people to try new things. The existing skate park does not allow space for this. As a woman who wants to break into this sport, there is not enough physical room or variety of features when at capacity for me to learn.
- Add infant swim resource classes. Connect Legacy trail from Truckee to Olympic Valley.
- Add lighting to existing outdoor pickleball courts and add evening sessions for pickleball in the Rec Center
- Add more turf fields: indoor and outdoor
- Adding more all weather fields will have a massive impact.
- Admin staff are excellent and very helpful
- ALL ACCESS the A in IDEA. It is always surprising to me when residents tell me they are unaware of TDRPD facilities and programs. Truckee Town and the TDRPD should invest in a few BIG LED Marquees that can be programmed remotely for easy read while driving (or biking, or walking) in strategic locations where

traffic is calm or stopped. (Train Station, Front of Rec center, Round about at Raley's, Regional Park, 89 and Donner Pass Road). that publicize weekly and daily events, programs, and safety alerts for residents and travelers who are not on an email list, are unfamiliar with local websites, or radio stations.

<https://goldenrulesigns.com/gallery/> I don't know how this works, but there are often localized radio channels for Cal Trans alerts, and audio driving guides through some historic-scenic drives. Perhaps a localized demand radio channel could be developed, and publicized on the Marquee, or a large QR code for events.

- All of the bleachers at all the fields are unstable and unsafe. Those need to be replaced, expanded and improved with a overhead covering for sun protection. Dugouts need overhead protection.
- Along Donner Lake- When the trash bins and bathrooms are locked for half of the year, but people keep recreating during this time, what do you think happens to waste? That's right, they leave it there anyway... and it goes into the lake... and then you spend tax money on fish sculptures made out of trash from the lake... and put it on display next to the locked trash receptacle. ?????? Pay someone to take out the trash and clean/stock the bathrooms in the winter, or pay to winterize the bathrooms if that is what it would take to keep them open. Don't lock trash cans!
- Although my answers reflected what facilities and activities were important to my household, they do not necessarily reflect what I feel is needed for the community. I no longer have children at home, but I support all new facilities and programs that provide for the children of Truckee. These are the most important goals for TDRPD.
- Always support more trails. Kids programs are super important to us although we have not been signing up because is crazy to get classes when they open , stressful.
- An indoor (all-season) Pickleball facility is desperately needed in Truckee. TDRPD is the perfect organization to support such a project. Your most popular sport will only continue to grow; but to flourish, it needs a dedicated space.
- Anything that will serve the Youth of our community
- Aquatics: I know it's mostly a labor shortage needed for twice a week swim lesson, but I think this would be a great improvement for the kids. Also the locker rooms need some type of additional draining/and heating/cooling systems. Legacy Trail: parking and restrooms.
- Area doesn't need more development. Excellent facilities and programming as it is, nothing needs to be expanded
- As a mountain town, we should have an indoor ice rink. Hockey is the perfect sport for a town like ours. When I visit Breckenridge, CO they have an indoor rink plus and outdoor one, even though the town population is only 5k people. An indoor rink would allow for the year-round development of a local hockey team. A rink could also allow for additional sports like curling.
- As stated above, the Truckee- North Lake Tahoe could really use a proper indoor ice facility. For a region that was home to the Olympics, it's unfortunate that we do not have a real indoor ice rink. The area needs a place for kids and adults to participate and train, year round, in activities such as ice hockey, figure skating, broom ball, curling, and general skating. I would love to volunteer should a facility like this ever be proposed. I know it was included in the Park/Library Plan as a possible option for the Park but I never heard anything else about it. Please greatly consider building an Ice Rink for our community. There's already so much interest and ice sports would only stand to grow.
- As taxpayers we should have access to the West end beach at a more reasonable rate.
- Believe that TDRPD has very strong offering of facilities and believe first operating dollars need to go to maintaining these facilities. Believe that a bond offering could help support building of new facilities, but am concerned about the funds needed to support and maintain those future facilities.

- Having a full-time park host at the west end beach would be advantageous for maintenance and to control activities. District had a full time person in all years except 2024
- Having a sauna and jacuzzi will be great!
- I am a huge supporter of the bike park. I hear rumors that the further maintenance of the park may be in question. The bike park is such a huge draw for people of all ages. Truckee is a premier mountain bike summer destination and the bike park is part of that. I support Biking for a Better World's (Brooks and Courtney) continued development and maintenance of the bike park!
- I AM NEWLY RETIRED AND JUST NOW FINDING MORE TIME TO ENJOY OUR REC AND PARK AMENITIES. PERHAPS LOOKING AT ADDING TO OLDER ADULT OFFERINGS WOULD BE APPEALING. SO FAR AS IMPROVING FACILITIES, I AM HAPPY WITH THEIR CURRENT STATE
- I am strongly in support of continuing Biking for A Better World's role in developing and maintaining the bike park. They have created a remarkable resource for families and visitors to Truckee and have a passion for it that is hard to find.
- I cannot truthfully answer Q15 since I have not reviewed the financials for the District and my annual property tax assessment increases every year anyway.
- I do not know where the existing Dog park is located. Publicity is needed.
- I have a great time in the facilities that I use that are managed by the Truckee Donner Recreating & Park District. I think just keeping what's there up to date or maybe making some minor improvements would be great.
- I have used the aqua classes since it opened. The changing rooms are too small for the amount of women using them. Need more showers, maybe expand to the meeting room? Need hooks and electrical plugs. Definitely need to be cleaned better. Showers temp varies a lot, not consistent. shower room is sad as far as clean.
- I only use with my grandchildren. I do not get info readily on programs that would enrich me. The last time I used, they were too expensive for what we got. Are rate payers subsidizing others who participate.
- I support continuing the Chucky bike park and its state - not reductions to size or reduced maintenance. I would also support improving the playground at West End Beach, specifically the big slide that was recently repaired as it is dangerous and it's current state.
- I think it's important to have youth programs for all families regardless of income. Scholarships for youth should be available and I'd be in favor of donating to that fund.
- I think our rec department is fine the way it is. The first thing you will repurpose is McIver Arena. I cannot be supportive of new expansions. I cannot pay my property taxes as it is. Cannot afford an increase.

We as a community need to solve for that and direct our resources there.

Lacrosse is getting very popular and this would allow for participation in winter. Indoor racquet facilities (tennis, squash, pickleball) so it can't be played year round

- It'd be nice to have a playground for kids in the Prosser neighborhood. There were a lot of activities listed that I haven't done but find value in them being offered since I'd like to use them at some point.
- Its about the kids.

- My number one, and pretty much only concern, is getting the rocker memorial skatepark funded and built. The current Truckee skatepark is nice but is certainly not representative of the region as far as so-called action sports are concerned. Tahoe is legendary for both skateboarding and snowboarding and the skatepark should reflect that.

- Please clean up the goose poop on west end beach at the start of each day. Please consider plans for a bigger indoor gymnasium and an indoor field house for baseball and soccer!
- Please develop complete walking path from Tahoe Donner to downtown, using the river.
- please do NOT cancel the contract with the bike park nonprofit! they care so much about the community and the park.
- Please do not remove existing bike park for pickle ball courts. Find a new location for pickleball courts.
- Please do not spend taxpayer dollars on any new pickle ball courts. There is already more than enough of them in the Truckee/ North Tahoe area. Please consider giving considerable financial aid to The Rocker Memorial Skatepark expansion. There is overwhelming demand for a upgraded skatepark facility from the youth and adults of Truckee alike.
- Please do not terminate the partnership with BBW and TDRPD at Truckee Bike Park. Truckee Bike Park is the crown jewel of the park system and amenities and programs for us and our family spends hundreds of hours per season/year there. We have many friends that visit from hundreds of miles away just to bike there. The maintenance of the trails and features at Truckee Bike Park is crucial to its appeal and use and I believe BBW and Brooks are integral to directing and guiding the maintenance of the park. I would happily pay an admission fee or parcel tax or season pass or donation for use of the bike park to ensure its upkeep and development continues at its current level. In the hundreds of hours we have spent there in recent years I have seen maintenance guided/done by specialists and BBW, much less so by TDRPD staff. Truckee bike park needs the vision and continued oversight of BBW to keep it thriving as it has the past 10+ years. The shop/concession is a nice amenity, the bike mechanic service is wonderful, but mostly we need BBW's presence and guidance continuing in the future of the bike park - do not terminate the partnership with BBW!

- Please finish the skatepark with more of a street skating section. Its much needed for other types of skating and for more entry level for kids and is so reflective of culture and community. Regional Amphitheater seems vastly underutilized and could use a few upgrades. The spot and setting are spectacular though and it is a great asset as is.
- Please help get the Rocker Memorial skatepark across the building finish line. An increase in skatepark size is an obvious need. It's the most frequently used year round facility (maintained by the public through winter unlike anything else). A beautiful new skatepark with landscaping would beautify the entire town by using the eyesore of a useless dirt parking lot that cannot be used for anything else. Help the Rocker Memorial Skatepark committee finish what they started! Stop starting other projects and finish this one you have been helping from the sidelines.
- Please invest in the bike park and camps/coaching for kids!! And the skate park, same thing!

- The group that runs the bike park currently is doing a remarkable job. It is the model for this type of facility and how to run it
- The HOA at TD is where I have my recreation needs met. If I lived elsewhere in another part of Truckee I would be happy and pleased with the facilities it offers.
- The kids really want this new skate park
- The new skatepark is a necessary upgrade that would have substantial impact on the community and would increase the usage as well as accessibility for wider age range to use the facility. It stands out how far behind we are as a community with respect to the size and quality of our outdoor recreation loving community. There is also no compelling alternative anywhere in the North Tahoe/Truckee area.
- The Rec & Park district is a fantastic asset to the community. Having more indoor spaces to recreate in the winter will enhance the community and give more options for people to be active.
- The regional park and legacy trail near the park have become an issue. My dog was digging in the snow and had a wire run completely through his main pad down to his wrist joint, and 2 months later, broken glass slashed up his pads requiring stitches. 2 emergency vet visits and over \$1000 in 3 months. There is a lot of junk and garbage as soon as you leave the trail. The park itself is nice and clean, but the grounds along the disc golf course are a junkyard. Maybe a no glass policy and enforcement would help. Also, the repaving of the legacy trail last summer was really nice. Except the gravel used along the sides was the wrong material. It's a mess. A single step into it and you have gravel in your boot the rest of the day. Please replace it with proper material with sufficient fines so that it packs.
- The sand at the outdoor volleyball courts is so bad nobody can play on them without getting hurt. All of the rec facilities are dominated by organized groups leaving zero time for everyone else: ice skating, pickleball, volleyball, etc. We need indoor pickleball.
- The Seniors Meet and Greet program is fantastic and is very important to seniors in Truckee.
- The sponsorship model for the bike park seems like something that could also work for a whitewater park. In regards to a tax increase, I support it because I want Truckee keep being an amazing place to raise a family. However, it seems like we are being asked to fund special projects all the time with new taxes. Increasing property taxes makes the dream of owning a home in this area even further out of reach.
- The town has enough money to pay.

- The Town of Truckee needs to utilize their revenue to support the maintenance and upgrade of turf fields. They have enough money and are not utilizing it wisely. No need to raise taxes again. Taxes are already squeezing middle income folks out of the area.
- The truckee community needs a new skatepark with more space. The current park is not enough.
- The Truckee skatepark is used by a wide range of members of the community from young children, to teens to adults. It offers great recreation opportunities, builds a sense of community, and maybe most importantly, provides teens of the community a safe space where they can benefit from time spent outdoors in the parks, being active, and building friendships and relationships with other members of the community. The Truckee skatepark is great, but it is showing its age, and it is hard for more than one person to skate the bowl at a time. Expanding the skatepark would offer more features catering to a wider range of skaters, and would allow more space for people to participate. After work on a busy warm evening the skate park can be busy, and it can be intimidating for new skaters to jump in and feel confident. The new design would offer a lot more skateable real estate, so more people could participate at a time, and create a more inviting environment.
- The veterans center is an eyesore and not worth putting money into. The architecture just doesn't fit Truckee. Likewise the Art Center is old and needs replacing. I would love to see Truckee have a performing arts facility that is modern with bigger space for dance classes and arts classes as well as performances.

- "There are limited programs outside of sports for residents older than children but younger than 60.
- I've tried using the pool after work but it's impossible if more than half of it is being used for swim team training several nights a week."
- There are no fenced in areas in town where people can safely take their dogs off leash, and in the summer, all athletic fields are booked with youth sports. A dedicated space for dogs would benefit this very dog centered community.
- There is a huge shortage of playing fields for sports!
- There is already a plan for a big pickle ball complex. No need to add more than what is in progress.
- There needs to be more social opportunities for teenagers AND young adults(18-25). Clubs, classes, etc. To help with the mental health of everyone.
- There should be more recreational activities for younger kids 3-5 years old
- this is a mountain town. mountain sports should be the priority. mountain biking, skiing, climbing etc. the youth sports leagues are there to keep kids out of trouble in the offseason and whatnot but should not be the focus for the youth.
- Town is in desperate need of a place where kids can practice sports year around i.e.. baseball batting cages and soccer. The rec center is never available for our community.
- Truckee Bike Park is an amazing community center for our kids to adults. So much good energy and a supportive environment that the town benefits deeply from. Biking activities across Truckee are a huge economic opportunity to bring recreationalists during the summer. Please support access to the Bike Park and support development of local trails. I know so many families who have moved here to be closer to NorthStar MTB, the Truckee Bike Park, the Coldstream trail system maintained by the TDU, amongst other biking opportunities.

YOUR PROGRAMS/SERVICES YOU PROVIDE ARE QUALITY AND GREATLY APPRECIATED BUT WE CANNOT AND DO NOT WANT TO PAY MORE FOR ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS. LETS KEEP IT AS IS FOR NOW AND LET US ENJOY YOUR MORE THAN ADEQUATE PROGRAMS. THANKS FOR ASKING

Truckee bike park benefits immensely from the vision the endless dedication and guidance of Biking for a Better World (BBW - Brooks McMullin and Cortney) who we see at the park literally every day of the summer season, working on the riding trails as well as providing bike maintenance, amenities, rentals, and counsel. Without the continued partnership with BBW we fear significant deterioration in the quality of the park. If TDRPD manages the maintenance of the park exclusively we do not believe it has the specialized staff to maintain the trails and features in their current condition, much less to prepare the bike park for opening in May. We strongly advocate for a continued partnership with BBW for continued maintenance of the bike park by specialized staff with the skills to do so. Happy to pay for this privilege in some form.

- For every non motorized trail that is provided, there needs to be a motorized trail as well that can be used by dirt bikes and snowmobiles. Along the line of reasoning that the Legacy Trail connects different parts of the community and provides opportunity for exercise, connecting motorized trails are needed as well. For example, a parking lot with a motorized trail that connects Downtown/Truckee River, to the Tahoe National Forest to the south (between 267 and 89). And, another parking lot with motorized trail that connects Truckee to the Tahoe National Forest to the north. And, a motorized trail that connects east Truckee to West Truckee, that encourages dirt bikers and snowmobilers to utilize this trail to access shops and essentially services (grocery store, hospital, etc...), reducing traffic congestion on the streets while also provide opportunity for local residents to be able to access what they need when tourist traffic has locked up all of our streets. This could be done between the Trout Creek trailheads (possibly to the south of the creek, not next to the existing trail), or from Donner State Park, paralleling Deerfield Dr, then connect down by the river and even go as far as the Legacy Trail.

- I am very interested in the new Memorial skatepark. The current one is inadequate for the number of skaters in town. We do not need turf fields. People spend their lives skating, not playing football.

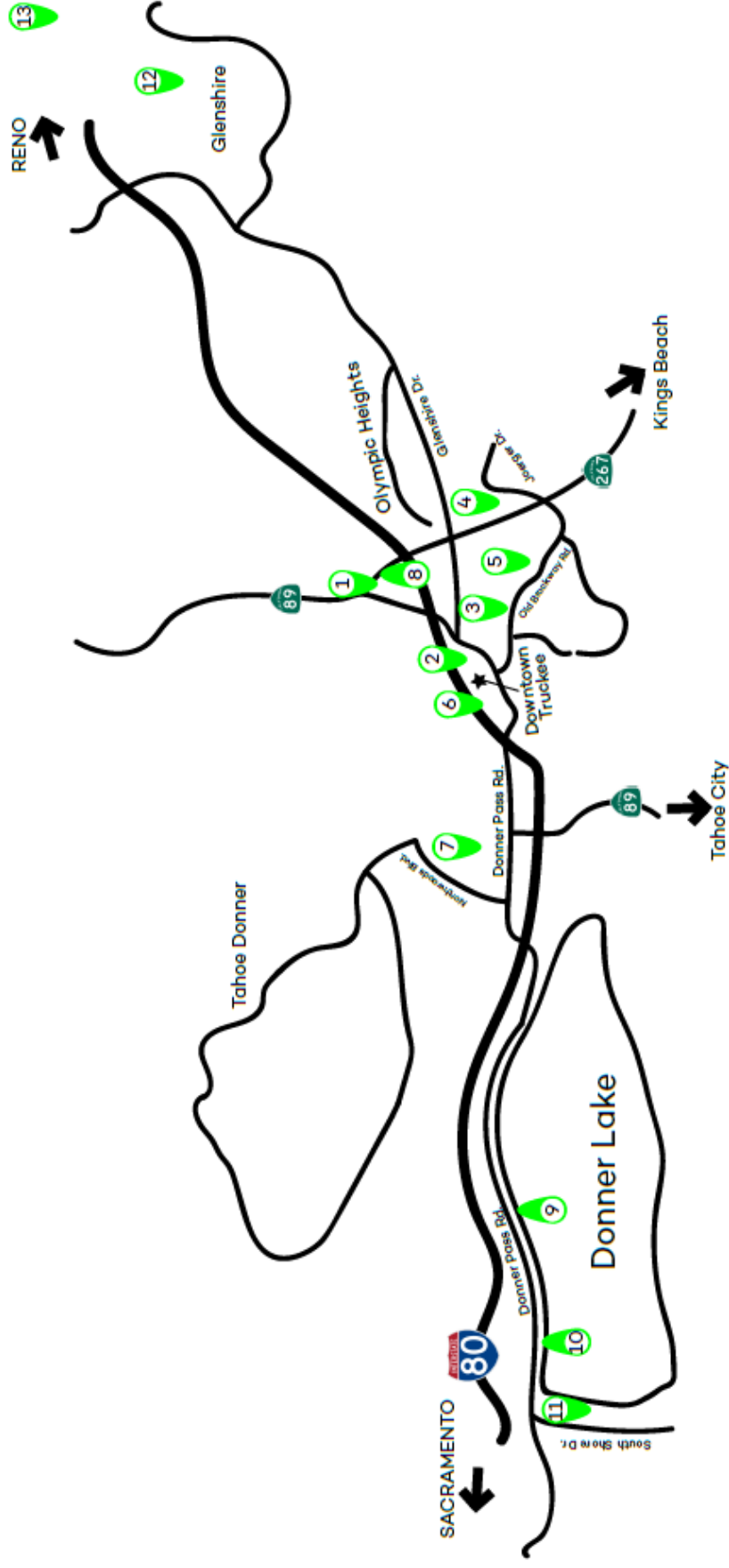
