Window 2 Engagement

Overview

Survey (Open Participation)

300+ TOTAL SURVEY RESPONSES

The second engagement window was completed during the month of September. While the second survey was live, the Comprehensive Plan team led and attended various community events in Truckee to encourage more survey responses and collect verbal community feedback.

OPEN HOUSE

Truckee residents were invited to come to an open house at the Rec Center to share their input for the strategies developed from the window 1 community engagement survey.

About half of the attendees were TDRPD board members while the other half were Truckee residents who either were at the rec center for this event, or stopped by while they were there for a different reason.

GOLDENS MEET AND GREET

At the start of their weekly event, hard copy surveys were given to the seniors. After a presentation of the project and five draft strategies, conversations about a stand-alone

senior center became a popular comment by this group. General unfamiliarity with the status of parks and the need for more raised questions on how they should respond to some questions. Some seniors decided to take home the strategy fliers to fill the survey out at home with more time to think.

ROTARY CLUB LUNCH

Hand out surveys and strategy flyers were distributed to each table during lunch, and a general announcement encouraged members to take a look at the boards with more information outside of the room before or after their meeting.

TRUCKEE BLOCK PARTY

At the TDRPD booth, Truckee residents were able to learn more about the status of the Comprehensive plan. The strategies overview board with a mini-golf activity welcomed conversations about what people wanted to see in their community.

Conversations with residents at this event were focused on improving the existing parks, adding indoor facilities, and wanting separated trails from roadways to get to and from parks in Truckee.

FAMILY FARM FESTIVAL

At the TDRPD booth, a kid-friendly activity got the whole family involved in the window 2 survey. Participants were invited to vote on each strategy using marbles. The color of the marble indicated whether the voter felt the strategy was important (green) or not as important (red).

Residents of all ages were especially enthusiastic about improving existing parks, adding indoor recreation spaces and improving and adding more trails to and within parks.

ADVERTISEMENTS AT THE REC CENTER

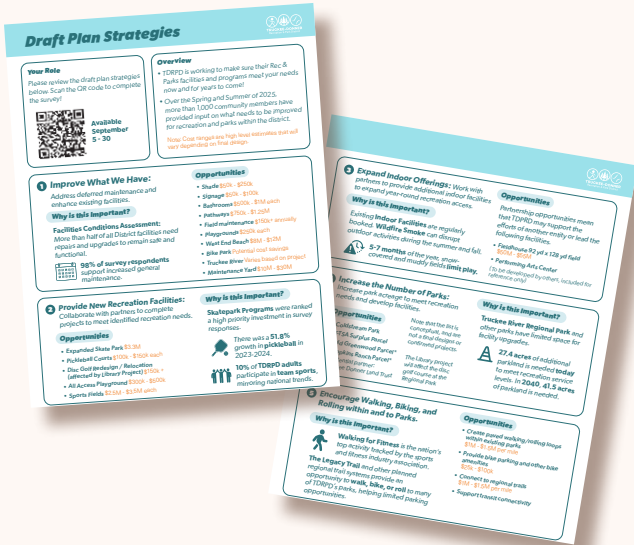
Between the window 2 engagement community workshops and events, one of the project boards was left up at the rec center entrance with QR codes to the online survey as well as hand written surveys available.

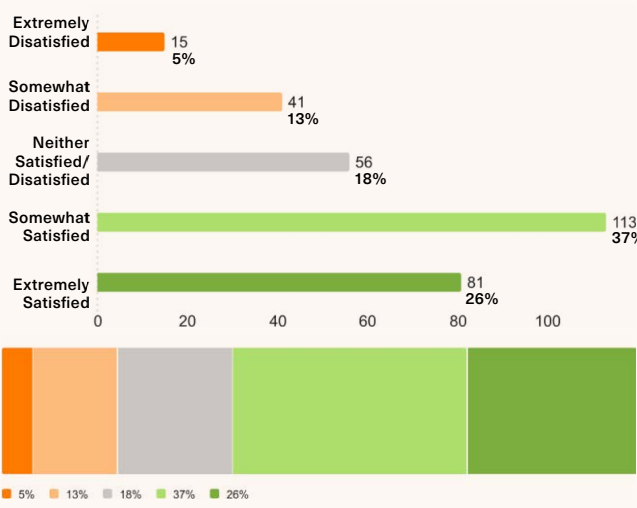

Satisfaction with the Draft Strategies

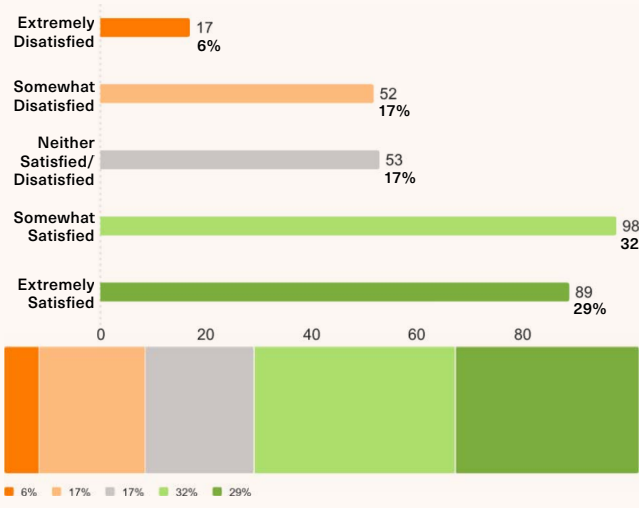
Q1-Satisfaction with Draft Strategy #1:

Improve What We Have: Address deferred maintenance and enhance existing facilities.



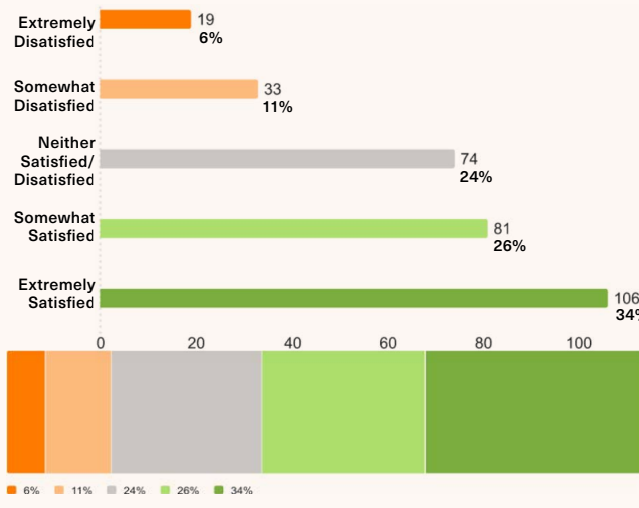
Q2-Satisfaction with Draft Strategy #2:

Provide New Recreation Facilities: Collaborate with partners to complete projects to meet identified recreation needs.



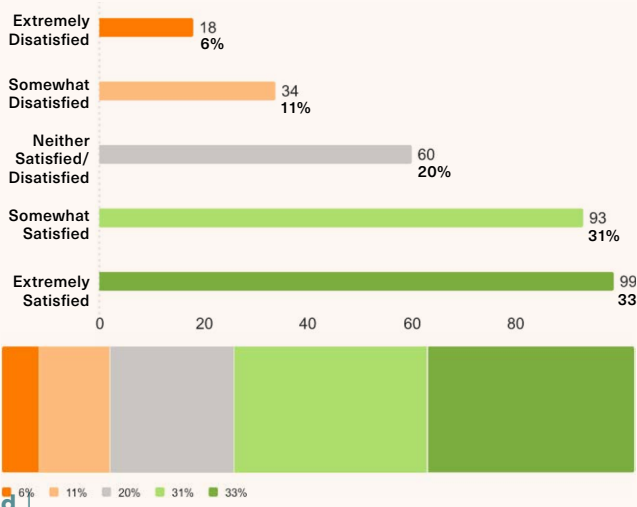
Q3-Satisfaction with Draft Strategy #3:

Expand Indoor Offerings: Work with partners to provide additional indoor facilities to expand year-round recreation access.



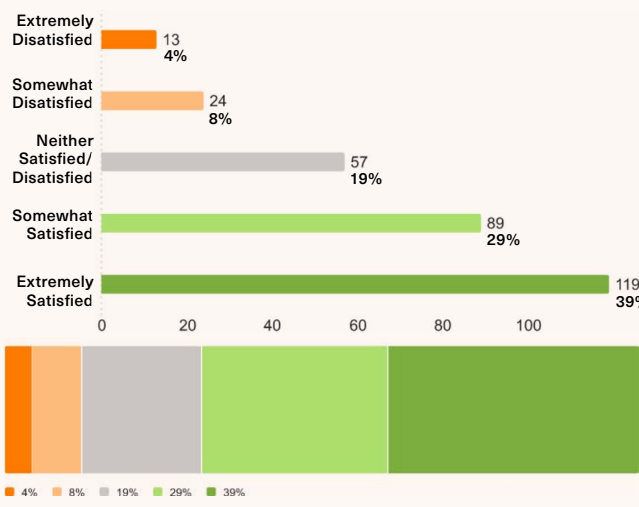

Key Takeaway - Satisfaction:

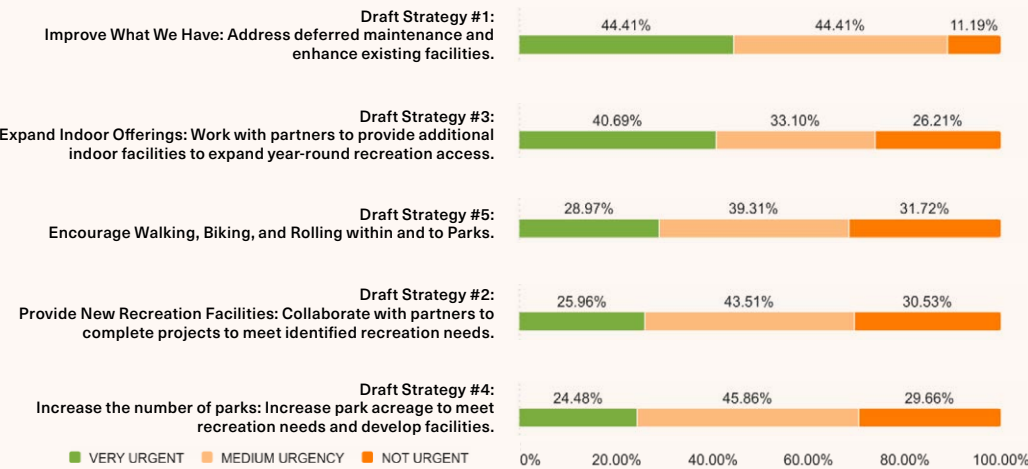
Overall, all strategies received a combined satisfaction rate between 62%-69%.

The community expressed the highest satisfaction with ***Draft Strategy #5: Encourage Walking, Biking, and Rolling Within and To Parks***, which received the most extremely and somewhat satisfied selections.

Key Takeaway - Urgency:

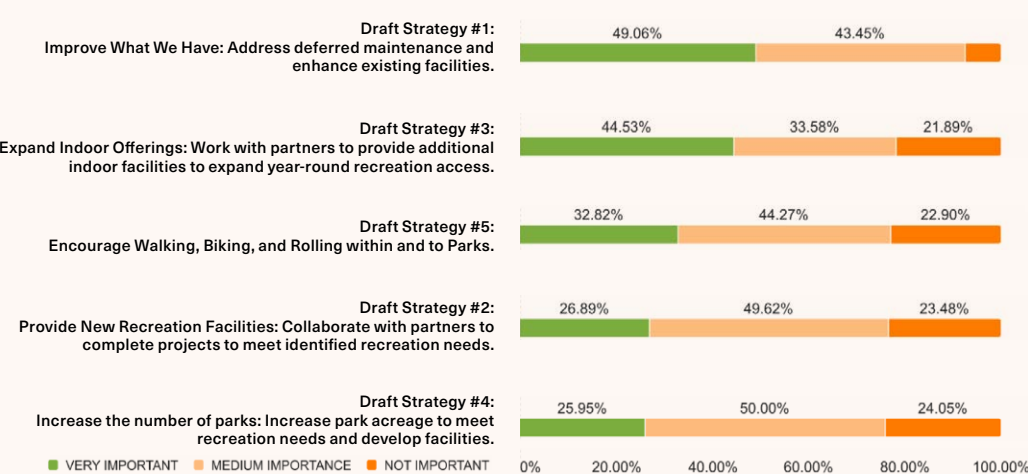
Survey respondents were asked to rate the urgency of five draft plan strategies. The results show that two strategies stood out significantly:

Draft Strategy #1 ranked the highest, with 44% of respondents rating it as very urgent and another 44% as medium urgent. ***Draft Strategy #3 followed***, with 42% rating it as very urgent and 31% as medium urgent.

Which would you feel are most important?



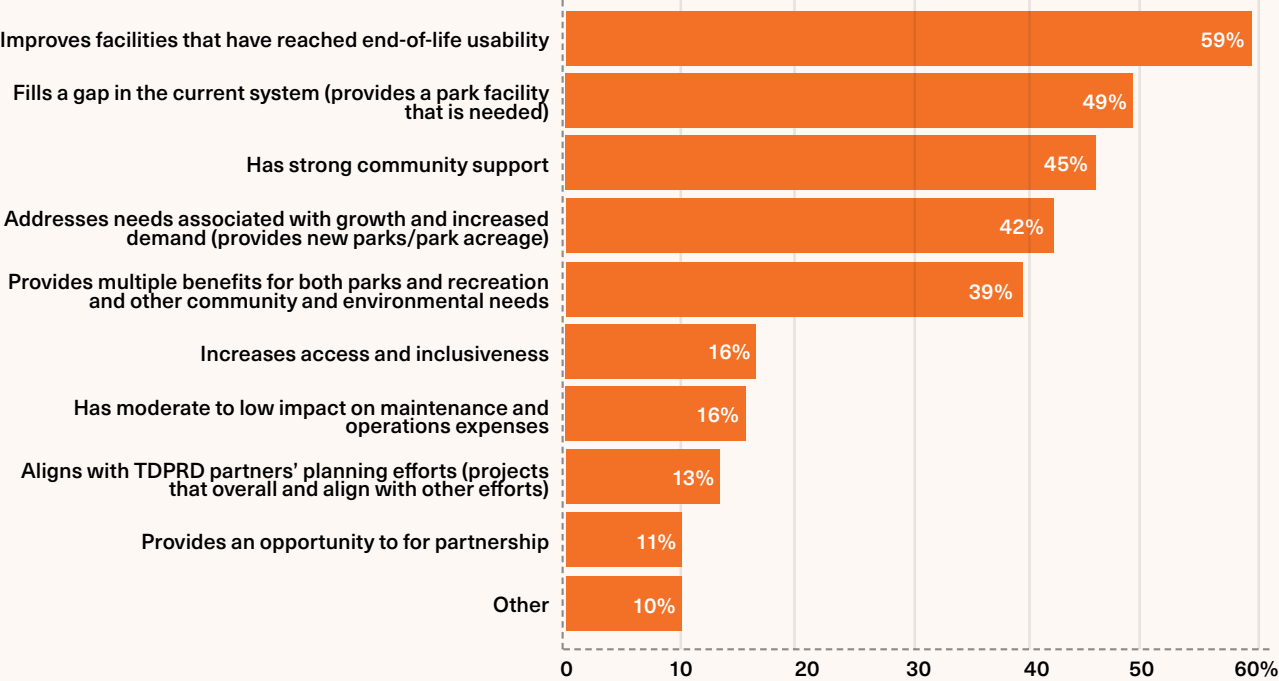
Key Takeaway - Importance:

Survey respondents also rated the importance of the five draft strategies. Similar to the urgency results, Draft Strategies #5 and #3 stood out:

Draft Strategy #1 ranked the highest, with 50% rating it very important and 42% medium important. ***Draft Strategy #3 followed***, with 45% rating it very important and 32% medium important.

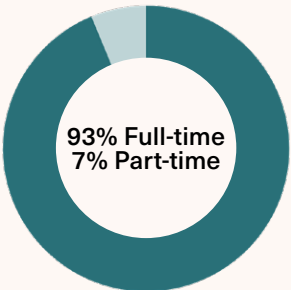

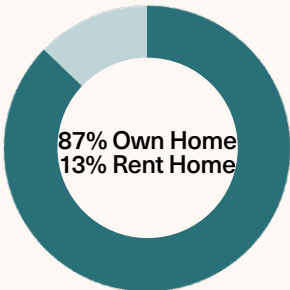

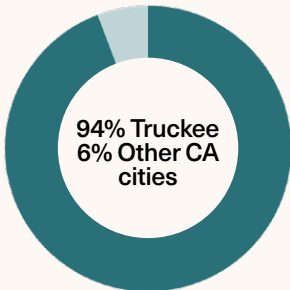
Survey Respondent Demographics



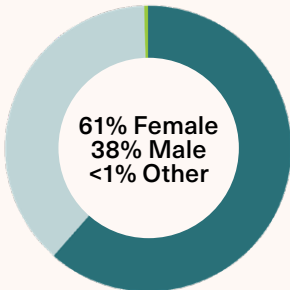
Full/Part Time Resident



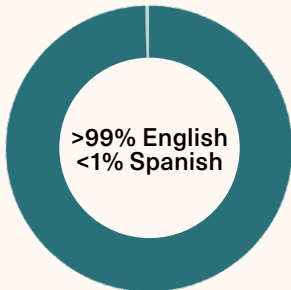

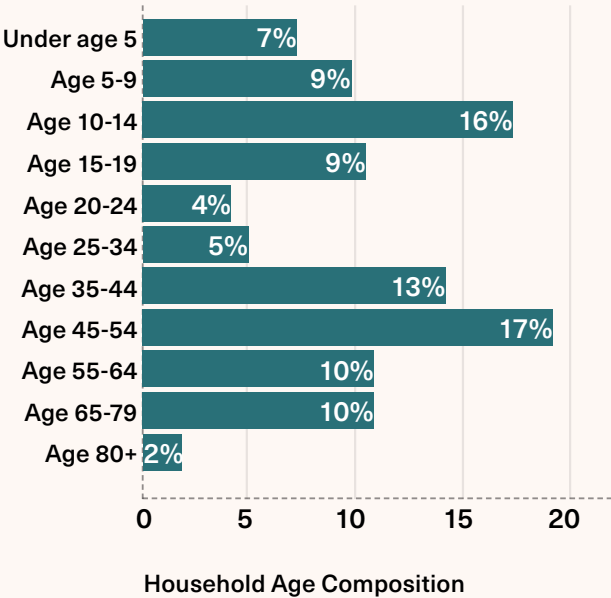
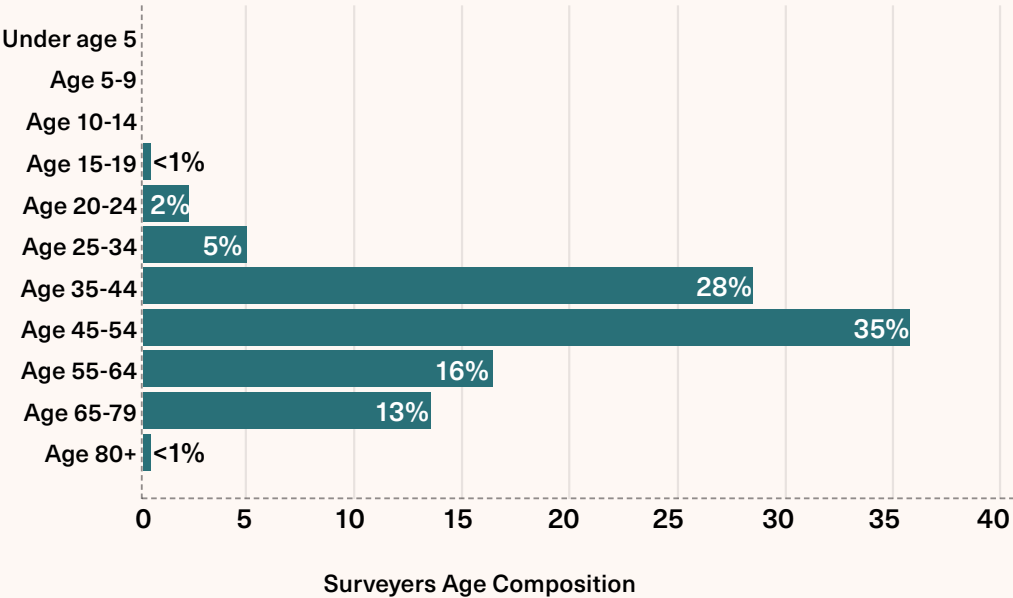

Q10:
Is there anything else we should consider or include in the Master Plan?
(open-ended response)

126 open-ended survey respondents with 150 ideas shared.

- Residents were invited to share thoughts regarding anything else they felt the planning team should consider or include in the Comprehensive Master Plan.
- Out of the 306 respondents who took the survey, 126 respondents (41 percent) provided written comments.
- Of the 150 ideas shared by the 126 respondents, common themes included:
- Support a fieldhouse or indoor facility, in particular to address recreation access needs in the winter (22 comments / 15%)
- Preserve or improve the McIver Arena for equestrian use and/or as a multi-use arena (21 comments / 14%)
- Connection of pathways for walking and biking to neighborhoods and parks and a desire to have snow removal from paths and safe crossings (14 comments / 9%)
- Affordable programming, and spaces for children and teens (7 comments / 5%)
- Build the new skate park (6 comments / 4%)
- Add new sports fields (5 comments / 3%)
- Convert a sports field to synthetic turf (5 comments / 3%)

Is there anything else we should consider or include in the Master Plan?

Truckee desperately needs more indoor facilities for children's play and community use. It should be a top priority to accomplish this.

Sunday food truck day

The parks in Reno are amazing. It such a privilege to live in a city that privileges open, accessible, and non-commercial spaces (i.e., spaces where you don't have to pay to exist in public). Keep up the great work!

“Accessibility and inclusivity” also includes financial access and inclusivity. The costs of renting TDRPD facilities is forcing the organizations who rent facilities to raise costs of participating in particularly the youth centric organizations that need the fields and facilities to provide valuable youth programs and opportunities. The increased costs impact families who may not qualify for scholarships but cannot afford multi kid or multi activity participation. TDRPD needs to put creative energy and thought into how to not pass their operating costs down to facility/field renters who then have to pass it down to the parents of kids. 10,000 foot view to consider with Master Planning. If parents cannot afford the costs of the programs then, kids will miss out on valuable childhood development opportunities and the TDRPD fields/facilities won't be effectively used and then the money raised/ allocated to design/construct/maintain will have been wasted.

Enhanced programming - more adult fitness options at pre/post work times. Explore if there is interest in mid day lap pool hours - maybe if there's not enough interest to justify M-F everyday, try a pilot program with 2-3 days per week. I'd love to be able to swim laps on my lunch break. Work with town/county to connect to paved bike loops in your parks with bike paths alongside roads. Something more than just the bike lanes we have - at least adding a concrete curb between car and bike lanes

Making sure there's a location for emergencies (fires, floods, freezing temps w/ power outages) could be used also as an indoor sports facility.

More indoor during winter

Property downtown for theater - can get for almost nothing.

Mini golf course at ponderosa. Performing arts center downtown with railyard

Youth sports has grown tremendously. We need more fields. We need better indoor facilities to meet everyone's needs, especially student athletes. They need these indoor facilities to be competitive; they need to train year-round without leaving the area to find a team.

McIver Arena is a huge part of keeping the horse community thriving and growing in Truckee! As a local equestrian, we use it a ton and I want to continue our access to it. It does need some upgrades and attention!!

New parks in different parts of Truckee would be incredible

There is no discussion of McIver arena / equestrian facilities. We appreciate the availability and upkeep of this facility! We are very in favor of development of the Old Greenwood parcel into a park.

See previous comment, noting the lack of mention of MacGyver Arena and the importance of its continued use as an equestrian facility in need of renovation. Thank you.

Outdoor turf sports fields would be usable much longer than current outdoor grass sports fields, but would cost a fraction of building an indoor field house. Both would be great though.

We need to address the McIver Arena as a facility that lends itself to the greater identity of Truckee. If lost we fade into being a suburb - Jackson Hole has done this well and the community is booming. Adding this to the plan is an easy way to keep a diverse identity for Truckee.

Equestrian Community

There is no mention, at all, of McGiver Arena. This should continue as a full time equestrian venue. The Truckee Rodeo is a huge plus for the town. The arena infrastructure needs to include permanent rest room facilities. The arena should be considered for expanded incoming venues when not utilized by the equestrian community. Example: Outdoor concerts; Stihl Timbersports competition (which would be televised by ESPN), winter competition events.

McGiver Arena has a very important Truckee History component and should not be ignored.

Horseback riding has had a long legacy in the Tahoe-Truckee area. However, other recreational pursuits, particularly mountain biking, seem to garner the most attention. Mountain bikers have nearly displaced equestrians due to their numbers and lack of trail courtesy. If you improve recreational access and safety for equestrians, they will come back. Horseback riding is a terrific family-friendly pastime that is being pushed out of our town. Please consider the needs of the equestrian community in your master plan.

Continue to maintain the horse arena and facilities. The rodeo is a huge attraction in summer. The equestrian community needs a place to use in summer for all horse events.

Please consider upgrading McIver Arena to become a multiuse facility. Along with the rodeo association and the Truckee Donner Horseman's, there are funding opportunities available to create a viable venue for concerts, ice-skating and equestrian sports.

Equestrian access to trails

The reason I couldn't be more positive about these questions is you never gave information on where all this improvement might take place. The new proposed disc golf course borders a residential neighborhood where people ride bikes and horses. random flying frisbees could cause injury. And it seems the park dept is wanting to develop McIver arena, which I would be against. That arena and surrounding area was donated to the parks dept with the contingency that it remain for equestrian use. That should be respected and honored in the name of the Joseph family. Please do not take that away. Rodeo donates thousands of dollars to the community every year. We are a growing group in this community and we deserve a place to recreate just like everyone else. You mention a skate park, but you never mention equestrian activities. Just where would all this new growth take place? If that were included in the questionnaire we could make more positive suggestions.

Equestrian facilities & access. Horses are an important part of Truckee history. Rodeo sells out every year. Would love to see more horse trails, facilities and access.

Equestrian families and use. We are a mountain town in the West. Horses were a key part of our history and we can't push them out.

Parking is not adequate for many park activities/events.

Key recreation partners have not been overtly engaged in the conversation about existing facilities and community needs. For example, there is no mention of equestrians / horses or any aspect of McIver Arena in the Regional Park - yet the skate park and other small-demographic rec user facilities are specifically called-out. Also, Strategy #1 and Strategy #2 are way too generic to clearly know whether they satisfy existing needs or not.

Truckee is in desperate need of field space outdoor and indoor!

Yes. There should be specific rules and guidelines about how new facilities are named. We, the taxpayers, paid for/ will be paying for these places and the Steve Randall naming was a disappointing surprise to many and NO information was sent to us about that. Felt like an inside job by the TDRPD board.

These improvements can't happen fast enough. The community has grown and this is much needed. This is a solid plan and I look forward to seeing it come to life.

Part of the beauty of the area we call home is natural wilderness. Be really thoughtful about ideas to take down the surroundings in the name of paving or more of the same kind of parks we already have -- that just makes us look and feel like other areas, whether cities like the Bay, or suburbs like in Sac area. We aren't those places and it's important to balance needs with what makes this place unique and who we are.

Desperate need for Indoor space, in particular for volleyball to accommodate a huge demand the community

Truckee has grown significantly over the last 10-15 years and indoor facilities have not kept up with the growth which limits sports opportunities for our youth. Currently, many sports compete for the extremely limited gym time that is available and it makes growing and sustaining youth sport programs difficult or even impossible. Because of this, many local youth travel to Reno to play for volleyball, basketball, and soccer. This limits access for kids whose parents cannot drive them several times a week, forces kids to sit in the car for several hours per week, and takes away from the sense of pride and community one gains from competing for a local team with others from the same town. Please, please, please consider expanding indoor gym space and allowing local sports clubs to rent the space.

Indoor facilities similar to new Reno SportsDome... volleyball, basketball, soccer, etc is all accomodated

While pickle ball courts may be 1/2400 residents, nearly all communities have courts as well, so I do not think this is an unmet need.

I think it is bonkers that we have this huge number of athletes and no indoor sports complex to support them in the winter months. A complex that supports public use as well as team activities.

I think that within your survey and planning you need to separate out the indoor sports facility from the performing arts project since they are very different in scope and we already have a performing arts, we don't have an indoor sports facility for kids. Can the additional flex use space with the planned new library be used for performing arts as well. Seems like you are duplicating efforts and funding?

The need for additional youth sports fields. Truckee is growing and demand will only increase

Indoor basketball and soccer for kids!!

I very much applaud efforts to make the existing facilities top notch and the next biggest gap is absolutely, without a doubt, the need for top tier indoor facilities.

An indoor winter sports complex - ice rink, soccer, basketball, pickleball/tennis - would be huge for the community

Giraffes are not specific. Each draft contained multiple items that should be separated out. For example, an indoor sports facility is a separate endeavor than a performing art center. The demand and impact for these is very different and prioritized differently.

Look at where money is wasted in "improvements" each year. How much did it cost in staff, supplies, contractors, equipment, etc., to redo RVSP 1, 2, and Joan Kelly? That investment is already gone because the fields have already been destroyed, and they should have been converted to turf. The grass is costing us so much money. Turf allows those fields to be year-round (almost) and allows for all sports to use the space without extreme damage.

Community arts location!!

Need new fields and a indoor facility

The new proposed library taking up valuable park space is a travesty. it should have been a multi use pavilion/ice rink going there. We have limited park space for outdoor activities, no field house, no ice rink. A library can be built anywhere, like the railyard.

Of course the library supporters want to be in a park (how quaint!) but no park supporters want a library in their limited space.

I assume TDRPD does not receive adequate tax revenue to do all the things outlined on this survey. Why doesn't TDRPD join the Town of Truckee? It seems the Town receives a lot of our tax dollars (and visitor tax dollars) from various taxation paths, and some of these funds could be prioritized for the identified needs in this survey.

The truckee bike park looks terrible. The terrain wasn't open this summer. No signs anywhere. It needs to be taken care of by the professionals who know what they are doing and not be ruined. Please consider using Courtney and Brooks again!

This looks like a great summary!

Please spend some time visiting or researching other towns that have grown smartly. Small towns that have welcoming facilities but also the infrastructure (i.e. wider roads, parking, staffing) to support the growth. We are in a critical time in Truckee where we can either continue to add amenities and find that no one can get to them (i.e. traffic and parking is impossible) or we can build literally for our future and also expand our crumbling infrastructure to support it. Kids are not going to go play pickleball. We have NOWHERE for our school-aged (2-18) to go hang out during school breaks, afterschool, early release days, etc. Indoor facilities that aren't overpriced or hard to reach (Woodward) are imperative for their development and the community's mental health. A large number of community members don't ski, so what is for them to do during winter?

More bike park staff!

Your survey is not very clear. Expanding fields and indoor options should be a priority. A long term plan for the bike park is a priority. What has happened there this summer is a disappointment and dangerous.

Would love to see the Regional Park ice rink get an update. Also a safer pedestrian/cyclist connection between Olympic Heights and the Legacy Trail.

If the library will eventually replace the maintenance shed at the regional park, where will people park? Already parking is tight for the farmers market and for soccer/baseball games. Could more parking be available on the street? Could we work with the city or the county on that?

Redo your web page to make it more user friendly. It is extremely difficult to navigate

grooming of golf courses in winter for cross country ski use

A rad bike park and skatepark is necessary for the community we live in. I'm really excited for a new library as well, hopefully that will allow for expanded book/media access both hard copy-wise and digitally. I also hope a big part of the shade plan is leaving large trees and growing some more as that's the best kind of shade.

Consider demand for existing facilities and have that direct expansion and additions - field space especially seems to be at a premium. All weather options (they don't necessarily need to be inside) would be heavily used by field sport athletes year-round. Beyond pickleball, also consider the significant growth of soccer, football, and lacrosse.

I do not like the general urbanization that is planned for the regional park. Between the library and the kids zone and other improvements, it's going to increase traffic and make the area much less park like than it currently is. The effect on the disc golf course is not acceptable in my mind. These projects should find other locations.

I only voiced reservations about these plans because you did not indicate where these new facilities are going to go. If they are going to take the place of McIver Arena, then I would not be in support of that

I was disappointed not to see the Railroad Museum with the model train in the Truckee river Regional Park as a priority

We really need a dog park to provide especially little dog a safe place to exercise and socialize. A dog park is also a tremendous community building tool.

Connect bike paths so that all neighborhoods can bike roll walk to anywhere in town. For example, residents in Prosser lakeview have to bike or walk on dangerous streets to get Downtown or to riverview or any other park...there is no multi-use path for that neighborhood and other neighborhoods, which forces more car use and creates more traffic and parking congestion.

Why would you build more if you can't afford to maintain what we already have?

Look to towns like Boulder CO that have fantastic recreation options to model after.

Protect cyclists and pedestrians, especially in neighborhoods. Sierra Meadows is scary to bike in/out of on Martis Valley Road without a bike lane and cars going too fast.

Pickleball has rapidly become America's fastest-growing sport, with participation exploding by over 158% in just three years. This incredible growth, which has brought millions of new players of all ages into the game, highlights the urgent need for dedicated, indoor facilities in our community. An indoor venue would eliminate weather-related cancellations, allowing for year-round play and consistent access regardless of rain, wind, or sun. Beyond providing a weather-proof environment, an indoor pickleball facility would foster a robust social hub, offering leagues, tournaments, and a reliable space for residents to meet, connect, and stay active. The controlled conditions of an indoor facility, from consistent court surfaces to climate control, would not only enhance the playing experience but also help reduce the risk of injuries. This investment would provide a crucial social and recreational asset, promoting healthier lifestyles and strengthening community bonds for years to come.

I did not see the Donner lake docks and shoreline erosion addressed specifically. Two issues I see are the docks need to be replaced and erosion along the shoreline dealt with. I hope these issues are being or can be addressed with these strategies.

Full size ice rink

CONNECTIVE NETWORK OF TRAILS THAT LINKS ALL PARKS AND NATURAL FEATURES OF TRUCKEE

Everyone in Truckee seems to own a dog, like I do, and most like them to be off leash even in leash-only signed areas. I visit the regional park daily and every single day I see people with off leash dogs including on the Legacy trail. My dog, even while leashed, has been attacked countless times in the park and throughout other city run areas. There needs to either a small enclosed dog park where this is allowed or more monitoring by the town.

The new library location does not impact the regional park facilities as mentioned in this survey.

Rocker Memorial Skatepark has obtained the necessary CEQA and ToT Permit Approvals to build. Over 12+ years of fundraising and community events have gone into getting RMSP to this point. RMSP has spent over \$250K getting through the permitting process and has a dedicated account with TDRPD for construction funds, currently with over \$350K invested. This project can begin construction immediately (with funding), and be completed in 2026. RSMP was approved as part of the Regional Area Master Plan from TDRPD in 2020 and volunteers have been working tirelessly to advocate for funding and grants, recently receiving \$125,000 from TTAD.

I believe there is a strong need for indoor field space, especially for soccer, lacrosse, and track/athletics. One thing not addressed in the Master Plan is the ice rink. Understanding that these facilities are very expensive, I still would like to see an indoor facility or expansion of outdoor facilities to allow for a regulation-sized ice rink.

The Community Arts Center needs an Arts focus, not child care, we need that too, but child care should not impede the Arts, which is in the name of the building.

It seems like park facilities are the realm of the Parks and Recreation department and it seems weird that y'all are foisting these off on "partners".

Need to consider the already overcrowded access to West End Beach. Money invested in West End Beach considerably contributes to the problem. Invest in solutions that spread out the community rather than causing the problems with traffic, overcrowdedness, etc...
